### Happy Ramadan!



Ramadan, the ninth month of the Islamic lunar calendar and a holy month in which Muslims fast, reflect, and pray, begins on March 22nd. Ramadan is commended as the month during which Muhammad received the initial revelations of what became the Quran, the blessed book for Muslims, from God. From March 22nd at sunset to April 21st at sunset, Muslims around the world will observe Ramadan in 2023.

All Muslims adhere to the five pillars of Islam, which are Sawm (fasting), Shahadah (declaration of faith), Salat (prayer), Zakat (charity), and the Hajj pilgrimage. A light meal known as "suhoor" is allowed to be consumed just before dawn for those who participate in the fast. The end of the fast is symbolized by a prayer known as "Adhan" at sunset. During this time, worshipers typically consume dates with juice, milk, or water. Muslims do not consume food or drink, including water, during daylight hours. However, there are exceptions, such as when a person is pregnant, elderly, or ill. Those who are unable to fast may choose one of the aforementioned pillars or other forms of worship. During Ramadan, Muslims eat Iftar, a meal shared with family and friends, each day at sunset to break their fast. Eid al-Fitr is a three-day celebration that occurs at the conclusion of Ramadan. It includes special prayers, meals with friends and family, and the giving and receiving of gifts.

#### FloodNet NYC wants to hear from you!




<u>FloodNet</u> is a partnership between NYU, CUNY, and NYC to install flood sensors in flood-prone areas of NYC. So far, the project has installed 31 sensors throughout NYC, and currently has funding to install 500 sensors in total over the next five years; some are to be placed in the near-term in locations such as Edgemere, Bushwick, Hollis, and eastern Staten Island.

New York City government agencies, communities, researchers, and FloodNet are all working together to better comprehend the frequency, severity, and effects of flooding in the city. FloodNet unites imaginative wellsprings of data on road flooding influences in areas that are defenseless against elevated tides, storm flood, and stormwater spillover. The information acquired can be utilized by neighborhood inhabitants, scientists, city offices, and others to advocate around and attempt to lessen flood risk.

Community input is central to their location selection process, so if you know of locations that experience chronic street and sidewalk flooding, please submit a response using FloodNet's <u>Sensor Suggestion Form</u>.


