

#### **Snowfall measuring tips:**

- The ruler must have one-tenth of an inch increment.
- Before your first measurement, identify the most undisturbed and representative area(s).
- Take multiple measurements. Discount outliers and AVERAGE the readings.
   The final result will be that average number to the nearest tenth of an inch, e.g., 3.2.
- Unless conditions change drastically, you will likely measure in approximately the same locations during an event. Watch your step and try to keep these areas as undisturbed as possible.
- When to measure: no more frequently than every three (3) hours.
- If snow changes to rain or sleet, take a measurement as soon as possible.
- · Remember, sleet is treated as snow.
- Although there may be no snowfall, indicate "0" readings through the website as well.



- Beware of scammers when applying for disaster assistance:
- Ask our reps to show you a photo ID badge.
- Keep your registration number & personal information safe
- Never agree to pay an application fee.

Registration | Wed | Jan 22 | 6:30 PM | Jumaane D. Williams is the Public Advocate of the City of New York. Previously, he served on the NYC Council representing the 45th District. Jumaane is a first-generation Brooklynite of Grenadian heritage. He graduated from the public school system, overcoming the difficulties of Tourette's and ADHD to earn a Master's Degree from Brooklyn College. He began his career as a community organizer at the Greater Flatbush Beacon School and later served as the Executive Director of NYS Tenants & Neighbors. There, he fought for truly affordable, incometargeted housing across New York City and State. In the NYC Council, Jumaane championed landmark legislation that fundamentally transformed policing in NYC. Jumaane sponsored the Community Safety Act, reforming the City's Police Department by ending the abuse of Stop, Question & Frisk in communities of color and creating the NYPD's Office of Inspector General to investigate unlawful & unethical behavior. As former Co-Chair of the Council's Task Force to Combat Gun Violence, he helped create New York's Crisis Management System, which funds Cure Violence Groups that work to reduce shootings through a multi-pronged approach. The program fundamentally transformed the city's approach to gun violence prevention, and as Public Advocate he continues to work for its expansion and improvement today. Jumaane has led the fight for better policing and safer streets, affordable housing, and transparency and accountability in City government. As Public Advocate, Jumaane will continue to be an activist-elected official who brings the voices of everyday New Yorkers to City government and makes New York a truly progressive beacon for all.

#### **Human Trafficking Awareness**

As noted above, January is Human Trafficking Month. Safe Horizon is hosting a virtual presentation on the severity and scope of human trafficking, identify red flags of trafficking, the intersections between intimate partner violence and human trafficking, and traumainformed lens, resources, and tools to increase efficacy in supporting survivors of trafficking.

Thank you again for your help in making previous HOPE nights a success! Your support helps gather valuable information for determining how to allocate resources to best serve and support New Yorkers in need.



All Volunteer leadership should be encouraging active members to serve in a mentor role in order to support both their growth as leaders and provide new opportunities for newer members to become more engaged.



#### **THINGS TO KNOW**



**How To Request NYC CERT** 



If approached to support an event in your community, the following steps must be taken:

- Event organizer submits an official request using the <u>NYC CERT External</u> Request Form.
- NYC CERT Leadership should not submit form on behalf of the event organizer.
- For events lead by a NYC CERT
  Division, volunteer leadership (Ready
  New York Liaison, if a preparedness
  event) should submit this <u>Event</u>
  Request form.

NYC CERT program staff will review all requests. If approved, program staff will add the volunteer opportunity to the <a href="NYC CERT">NYC CERT</a>
<a href="Event Calendar">Event Calendar</a> with a registration link. If more details are required for approval, program staff will use the contact information provided in the request form to connect with the organizer.

We are a Team! To ensure we all represent NYC Emergency Management with professionalism, this message serves as a friendly reminder about our uniform policy. Whether it's a preparedness event or an emergency response, being in proper uniform allows us to be easily identified by the public and first responders. It signifies our commitment to safety and fosters a sense of unity.

Here's a quick rundown of the NYC CERT uniform:

- Green NYC CERT polo shirt (mandatory)
- Khaki pants (mandatory)
- NYC CERT reflective vest (always most visible outer layer)
- NYC CERT credential on lanyard, visible at all times (mandatory)
- Optional items: NYC CERT baseball hat, windbreaker, green helmet (for emergency responses), green CERT response bag (for emergency responses), NYC CERT branded sweaters/jackets (produced with NYCEM approval)


