There is no ladies' cottage in this park, and I agree with the Commissioner that it is most argently needed. The estimate, \$8,250, for the improvement, I consider a little high, but not

I would report that the improvement consists of taking up the present granice-block pavement, excavating and relaying the block to a lower grade; upon the granice blocks forming a foundation, an asphalt pavement is to be laid.

I have had the location examined, and it is reported to me that the granite blocks are in fair condition, but the pavement has settled hadly in places.

Fith avenue, north and south of this Plaza, is paved with asphalt, and when Cathedral parkway (One Hundred and Touth street) is improved, it will naturally be asphalted; bence, I consider this improvement advantageous, and would advise that it be allowed.
