Disaster Class Podcast: The Power of Community Engagment



In this episode of DisasterClass, Jason Perez and Wesley Long dive into the challenge of stakeholder buy-in when implementing safety and preparedness measures. 

It's important to address concerns directly rather than engaging in gossip, as this can create a toxic atmosphere. Experience has shown that most issues can be resolved through open and honest communication.

25-hours Policy Takes Effect in 2025

We want to again provide some clarity for one of the notable updates to the <u>NYC CERT SOPs</u>, specifically: *To remain Active, volunteers must complete and report a minimum of 25 approved volunteer service hours annually.*

25 hours in **2025**

Because this policy was just added to the latest edition of the <u>NYC CERT SOPs</u>, we are not putting into effect until we tally up your total hours for 2025. With that said, you should continue to do your best to submit your volunteer hours for 2024 as soon as possible, as it will better help you understand what it will take to fulfill this new requirement going forward. <u>Submit your NYC CERT Volunteer Service Hours</u> no later than Friday, January 17, 2024. If you have any issues or concerns, please connect with your leadership for support.

Why 25 hours?

This new standard was introduced in response to numerous volunteer requests for clearer guidelines on activity status. We understand that volunteer commitments vary across boroughs, divisions, and individuals. The 25-hour annual minimum is a reasonable benchmark, aligning with common volunteer practices and providing a clear framework for maintaining active status.

You can meet the 25-hour minimum by making sure to submit your volunteer hours for: Time spent on training, drills, deployments, community outreach, and other CERT-related activities. By meeting this simple requirement, you'll ensure your continued participation in the program and help maintain the readiness of NYC CERT membership.

Brooklyn Division 1





How To Request NYC CERT

If approached to support an event in your community, the following steps must be taken:

- Event organizer submits an official request using the <u>NYC CERT External</u> <u>Request Form</u>.
- NYC CERT Leadership should not submit form on behalf of the event organizer.
- For events lead by a NYC CERT
 Division, volunteer leadership (Ready
 New York Liaison, if a preparedness
 event) should submit this <u>Event</u>
 Request form.

NYC CERT program staff will review all requests. If approved, program staff will add the volunteer opportunity to the NYC CERT
Event Calendar with a registration link. If more details are required for approval, program staff will use the contact information provided in the request form to connect with the organizer.

What is the NYC CERT Uniform?

We are a Team! To ensure we all represent NYC Emergency Management with professionalism, this message serves as a friendly reminder about our uniform policy. Whether it's a preparedness event or an emergency response, being in proper uniform allows us to be easily identified by the public and first responders. It signifies our commitment to safety and fosters a sense of unity.

Here's a quick rundown of the NYC CERT uniform:

- Green NYC CERT polo shirt (mandatory)
- Khaki pants (mandatory)
- NYC CERT reflective vest (always most visible outer layer)
- NYC CERT credential on lanyard, visible at all times (mandatory)
- Optional items: NYC CERT baseball hat, windbreaker, green helmet (for emergency responses), green CERT response bag (for emergency responses), NYC CERT branded sweaters/jackets (produced with NYCEM approval)


