Reportable* Snow Events

The reportable winter storm weather season from November 15, 2023, through November 14, 2024 had one reportable* snow event on the following date:

• 02/17/2024: 9.9" of recorded snow at the highest point

* As defined in Local Law 26 of 2011, "reportable" is any snowfall equal to or in excess of six inches within a period of 24 hours in any of the five boroughs based on the Department of Sanitation's measurements.

Agency Coordination

The following agencies were involved in the snow response during the snow event: DOE, NYCEM, DEP, FDNY, OCME, Parks, DSNY, NYPD, DOT, NYS DHSES, NYCHA, MTA, PANYNJ.

After each activation, New York City Emergency Management coordinates with internal and external partners to identify best practices, lessons learned, and areas of improvement for future responses.
