

Ordinances and Resolutions passed by the Common Council during the week ending Oct. 4, 1884.

Resolved, That permission be and the same is hereby given to Hinds, Ketcham & Co. to connect their premises, Nos. 228 and 229 South street with the East river, by a six-inch iron pipe to convey salt water to be used for fire purposes, the work to be done at their own expense, under the direction of the Commissioner of Public Works; such permission to continue only during the pleasure of the Common Council.

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC PARKS.

Abstract of Proceedings for the Week ending September 27, 1884.

Tuesday, September 23, 1884.—Adjourned Meeting-1 p. m.

The following communication was received:
From the Comptroller, returning the voucher of James McLoughlin for \$735, for plumbing work, etc., in the basement of the cottage in Tompkins Square, stating his opinion that the work should have been charged to the appropriation "For Erecting and Improving Ladies' and Gentlemen's Cottages," instead of "Labor, Manntenance and Supplies," and suggesting that a transfer be asked for for the purpose of paying the claim of Mr. McLoughlin from the appropriation for erecting and improving cottages.

The President was designated and directed to file, as required by law, the three similar maps or plans entitled "Map or plan of Courtland avenue, from West side of North Third avenue to South side of East One Hundred and Sixty-first street, in the City of New York, as established and classified by the Commissioners of the Department of Public Parks, in pursuance of the provisions of chapters 320 and 604 of the Laws of 1874, and chapter 436 of the Laws of 1876," dated "New York, September 17, 1884," and signed "S. F. Chalfin, Topographical Engineer, Department of Public Parks,"

The plans for the bridge to be constructed over the Harlem river at not more than half a mile above High Bridge, were referred to General John Newton, Engineer-in-Chief, U. S. A., General Geo. B. McClellan and Hon. Wm. J. McAlpire, and they were requested to give this Department their opinion as to the merits of the several plans now in possession of this Department for a bridge at that point.

The President was requested to consult with the Counsel to the Corporation in relation to the legal status of the bridge over the Mott Haven Canal at One Hundred and Thirty-eighth street.

The Secretary was directed to insert a notice in the CITY RECORD inviting persons interested in the proposed change of the grades of Railroad avenue, East, and One Hundred and Fifty-ninth street, to call at the office of the Topographical Engineer and examine the plans showing the same.

The Superintendent of Parks was directed to proceed with the work of making the necessary repairs to McComb's Dam Bridge over Harlem river.

It was ordered that one of the most available gangs now employed on the Riverside Park be transferred for duty on drainage on the Central Park.

The employment of four stonemasons was authorized for work on the wall near Seventy-seventh street and Eighth avenue.

The subject of heating the new Refreshment Building in Central Park was referred to the President and Treasurer with power.

The subject of the Ladies' Maid at the Casino in Central Park was referred to the President with power.

An estimate of the amount of money required for the use of this Department for the year 1885, was prepared and adopted as the Departmental Estimate, and the Secretary was directed to transmit a copy of the same to each the Board of Estimate and Apportionment and the Board of Aldermen.

SIR—There were 647 deaths reported to have occurred in this city during the week ending Saturday, September 27, 1884, which is a decrease of 32, as compared with the number reported the preceding week, and 117 more than were reported during the corresponding week of the year 1883. The actual mortality for the week ending September 20, 1884, was 679, which is 105.4 above the average for the corresponding week for the past five years, and represents an annual death-rate of 25.84 per 1,000 persons living, the population estimated at 1,366,037.
