## COMMISSIONERS OF THE SINKING FUND.

Abstract of the proceedings of the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund, at the meeting held December 30th, 1873.

Present—Hon. William F. Havemeyer, Mayor, (Chairman); Hon. John K. Hackett, Recorder; Hon. Andrew H. Green, Comptroller; George W. Lane, Esq., Chamberlain.

The Comptroller stated that on the 27th inst. there was a balance of \$507,700.47 to the credit of "The Sinking Fund for the Payment of Interest on the City Debt;" whereupon, the Recorder submitted the following resolution, which, on motion, was unanimously adopted, viz.:

Resolved, That a warrant be executed in favor of George W. Lane, Chamberlain, for the sum of three hundred thousand (300,000) dollars, to be charged to the "Sinking Fund for the Payment of Interest on the City Debt," on account of the "Surplus Revenues" of said Fund, for the year 1873, and credited to the "General Fund" of the city, in pursuance of chapter 163, laws of 1862.

Saturday, January 17, 1874:

### THEATRES.

Twelve Theatres, Lecture halls and places of public amusements, have been officially visited and examined as follows, to wit.:

Booths, Daly's 5th ave., Bowery, Olympic, Wallack's, Theatre Comique, Pastors Opera House, Colosseum, Academy of Music, Irving Hall, Robinson's Hall and the Grand Opera House and no infractions of the "Law" therein noted.

### HOTELS.

Twelve Hotels, Boarding and Lodging houses have been carefully inspected as to their condition, means and appliances for egress and escape in case of fire, viz.: St. Germain, 5th ave. and 22d street, Central Hotel, 272 West street, Lodging house, 159 Bleecker street, Lodging house, 170 Bleecker street, Grove house, 172 to 178 Bleecker street, Germania, 137 Grand street, Frankenstein Hotel, 413 Broome street, Libby House, 54 Warren street, Zahn's Hotel, 199 Chatham street, Crook's Hotel, 90 Chatham street, Barmores, 5th ave. and 36th street, and the Madison ave. Hotel, 63 Madison ave.

### CHURCHES.

Eight churches have been carefully and thoroughly inspected as to their condition, means and appliances for protection against fire all of which are reported as amply provided with proper means of egress in the event of fire or accident.

### FACTORIES.

Fifty-two factories have been specially inspected as to the means and appliances therein provided for egress and escape, in the event of fire, and where such means and appliances were found to be insufficient, the parties in interest have been notified to provide such additional fire safeguards, as were deemed requisite and recommended by the Department Inspectors.
