COMMISSIONERS OF THE SINKING FUND.

Abstract of the proceedings of the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund, at the meeting held December 30th, 1873.

Present-Hon. William F. Havemeyer, Mayor, (Chairman); Hon. John K. Hackett, Recorder; Hon. Andrew H. Green, Comptroller; George W. Lane, Esq., Chamberlain.

The Comptroller stated that on the 27th inst. there was a balance of \$507,700.47 to the credit of "The Sinking Fund for the Payment of Interest on the City Debt;" whereupon, the Recorder submitted the following resolution, which, on motion, was unanimously adopted,

Resolved, That a warrant be executed in favor of George W. Lane, Chamberlain, for the sum of three hundred thousand (300,000) dollars, to be charged to the "Sinking Fund for the Pay ment of Interest on the City Debt," on account of the "Surplus Revenues" of said Fund, for the year 1873, and credited to the "General Fund" of the city, in pursuance of chapter 163, laws of 1862.
