Re: Agency-based Voter Registration Under LL29 of 2000, Mayoral Directive One of 2014, LL61 of 2014 and LL63 of 2014

January 1 through June 30, 2020 Report

Local Law 29 of 2000 requires that specified agencies offer voter registration in their encounters with the public. Mayoral Directive One of 2014 strengthened the requirements of LL29, putting a structure in place to monitor agency efforts to increase voter registration. Local Laws 61 and 63 of 2014 increased the number of agencies required to offer voter registration.

The City has forwarded a total of 4,669 applications to the Board of Elections during the reporting period of January 1 and June 30, 2020. This includes applications from DSS/HRA, where voter registration applications are offered, collected and sent to the Board of Elections under the requirements of the National Voter Registration Act (NVRA) and are not denoted as Code 9. DSS/HRA reported sending 1,972 applications to the Board of Elections during the reporting period.

During this reporting period, the majority of City walk-in centers were closed due to health and safety concerns over the COVID-19 pandemic.

Some highlights of agency activities during the reporting period include:

- In early 2020, the Civilian Complaint Review Board outreach unit partnered with the Mayor's Office Public Engagement Unit to conduct a student voter registration drive. The outreach units gave presentations at 13 high schools across all five boroughs. This voter registration drive registered 2,480 students to vote.
- 2. At the Department of Environmental Protection, the Bureau of Customer Service distributes a postage paid copy of the voter registration form with Customer Registration Form (CRF) mailings to one to three family homeowners who request a CRF.
- 3. The Department of Correction distributed voter packets to all people in custody. Each packet included voter registration paperwork and absentee ballot request paperwork in both English and Spanish. The packets also included NYCCFB instructions for

completing both forms, also in English and Spanish. The packets additionally included an instructional cover page, which listed the key election and registration deadlines, as well as voter eligibility criteria with specific information for incarcerated persons.

4. On January 9, DYCD held a very informative Civic Engagement Workgroup meeting and shared information about their respective initiatives. In June, DYCD partnered with Democracy NYC and NYC Vote to create the #VoteRemote Mask/Poster Challenge. In this virtual challenge, families learned about voter engagement and awareness and had the opportunity to express themselves creatively. This challenge was disseminated to providers and external stakeholders.

Describe how your agency distributes applications.

General Information: Voter registration forms were disseminated throughout ACS borough offices and Youth- Concentrated Programs. However, due to the impact of COVID-19, many ACS youth centered activities were postponed or limited to online access. To counter the impact of COVID-19, ACS chaired virtual voter registration workshops via WebEx and will continue to use this method to engage New Yorkers to vote.

Children's Center (CC) Voter Registration Workshop: ACS liaised with the Campaign Finance board to host our first virtual interactive voter registration meeting with a focus on the young demographics and how patterns in socio-economics plays a role in voter turnout in communities with higher incomes versus those living in low-income communities. Over 30 youth from 15- 21 participated on the workshop. During the presentation, the CC youth learned how they could make an impact in their communities by volunteering, organizing community events (such as beautification projects), using their social media platforms to share information, contacting their local elected officials to insight change and other civic engagement activities.

Family Permanency Services: The Housing Academy Collaborative (HAC) provides a series of weekly trainings to young adults to prepare them to meet the challenges of renting an apartment and maintaining it via financial literacy, education resources, tenant rights and more. At each of these trainings a voter registration table is set up. Time is set aside in each training to discuss few voter rights and voter registration and access to voter registration applications. 8 youth were registered.

Juvenile Justice Programs: Voter Registration forms are available in the waiting and visiting areas of ACS' two secure juvenile detention facilities. We are looking to expand virtual voter registration meetings to our Close to Home and group home facilities.

College Internship Program: Amid the pandemic, much of ACS staff in the Division of Administration were required to telework, which had an impact in terms of hiring college interns, as most of the assignments would decree interfacing with the public. As a result, admin hired X college intern to support COVID 19 projects and virtual events.

ACS Staff and Clients: Voter Registration forms are available in all ACS offices and accessible to staff. ACS currently makes forms available at all ACS office and client locations. Voter registration forms are also distributed to new clients when they are filling out paperwork for ACS services and in all borough office reception areas. Forms are also available to clients directly during follow-up appointments. All new hires and interns receive voter registration forms in their orientation packets.

Describe any special registration activities, if any.

National Voter Registration Day: ACS plans to participate in National Voter Registration Day 2020 in collaboration with the Campaign Finance Board.

2020 ACS Voter Registration Plan: This year ACS' plan includes emphasis on early voting, and vote by mail options due to the pandemic. ACS has and will continue to host virtual voter registration civic engagement drives. ACS will also have the traditional in-person voter registration table with adjustments to conform with social distancing requirements at our largest sites in each borough.

2020 ACS Youth Registration Plan: The youth voter registration portion of the ACS plan will focus on civic engagement responsibilities education. ACS is also planning some mock voting events at the Children's Center to get youth familiar with polls and the ballots. There is also a strong emphasis on pre-registration for 16 and 17 year olds.

2020 ACS Voter Registration Expansion Goals: We are also planning to expand our efforts at our two juvenile detention facilities, contracted Close to Home and group home facilities but still need time to flesh out the specifics in greater detail.

Voter Registration Facts Sheet: ACS is creating a voter registration fact sheet which will include information on absentee ballots, mail-in ballots, important early voter registration information; registering as an election day poll worker, among other related/important voter information.

Social Media, Internet & Intranet: ACS will continue to post important voter registration dates on its social media platforms, the ACS public facing website and ACS internal website. We will also use these platforms to continue to encourage staff, clients and social media followers to vote as well as share information regarding mail-in ballots and other related and important topics.

Describe challenges, both resolved and unresolved.

- With New York entering stage 4 of reopening, there are still many restrictions and limitations in place, affecting most civic engagement activities, forcing groups to operate online.
- Clients have the option to return the forms distributed by ACS to ACS staff or the Board of Elections via the USPS method, ACS is unable to accurately track forms.

- Families are distrustful of ACS and appear to believe that we have another motive other than to ensure that they are registered to vote.
- Many clients and visitors lack interest in Voter Registration information.
- Lack of available resources regarding voter registration for the public.

Describe challenges, both resolved and unresolved.

It is difficult for the Commission to track the number of distributed voter registration forms that are ultimately submitted because members of the public generally take the forms with them, and therefore do not fill them out at the Commission's point of contact.

In addition, the setting and type of event taking place determines the number of people served, and therefore, the number of voter registration forms distributed, and eventually filled out and submitted.

One reality influencing the number of Commission-distributed voter registration forms that are submitted to the Board of Elections is the receiving population's eligibility to vote. Commission events and offices are regularly frequented by individuals who are not eligible to vote for a variety of reasons, which may depress the number of voter registration forms that are distributed and ultimately submitted.

Furthermore, it is crucial to consider the impact of the current COVID-19 health crisis on the way City agencies, such as the Commission, are serving members of the public, and specifically, how individuals are gaining access to voter-registration forms and correlated information. Due to the change in work method and routine, to digital telecommunication, the Commission is serving members of the public utilizing diverse technological platforms, such as video conferencing. There has been a shift from distributing voter registration forms in-person, to virtually referencing the numerous resources available to individuals on the Commission's website. It is also important to note, that for various reasons, access to technology is not entirely widespread, and therefore, the number of online voter registration form submissions may be impacted.

Continuing to emphasize and elucidate the importance of political engagement to the members of the public may contribute to an increased number of distributions and submissions.

Application documents are completed electronically by staff, making it impossible for DHS to physically attach a voter registration form to an application document provided to the client. DHS's solution has been to provide access to voter registration

forms at intake by placing them in waiting areas for applicants and clients to pick up if they are interested in registering to vote.

Describe how your agency distributes applications.

Due to COVID-19, the Department suspended in-person and volunteer services program provision. As a result, in advance of the June election, the Department distributed voter packets to all people in custody. Each packet included voter registration paperwork and absentee ballot request paperwork in both English and Spanish. The packets also included NYCCFB instructions for completing both forms, also in English and Spanish. The packets additionally included an instructional cover page, which listed the key election and registration deadlines, as well as voter eligibility criteria with specific information for incarcerated persons.

Describe any special registration activities, if any.

Please see above response. In-person activities were suspended during the reporting period and therefore the Department was unable to conduct special civic engagement activities.

Describe challenges, both resolved and unresolved.

The major challenge during the reporting period was conducting civic engagement and registration activities amidst a global pandemic and contagious disease outbreak in City jail facilities. The creation and widespread distribution of non-partisan voter registration information and materials, while not an ideal solution, was successful in enabling all eligible individuals in custody to the opportunity and information to register and vote in the June election. In addition to the voter packets, the Department additionally provides individuals in custody three free stamps or pre-paid envelopes each week, which could be used for sending absentee ballot request paperwork. People in custody submitted registration and absentee ballot paperwork through the Department's correspondence system during this election. The Department, as a result, was unable to track the number of such paperwork that was submitted to the BOE. The Department additionally operates a social services request system using paper request slips. This system was utilized to provide voter documents in various other languages to individuals upon request.

Starting in July, PDFs of voter registration materials will be included with all literature requested by DOT customers. 2) DOT customers calling 311 will be sent voter registration materials, starting in July 2020. 3) The DOT website has a "Register to Vote" tile on its landing page. The hyperlink sends DOT customers directly to "nyc votes".

Describe any special registration activities, if any.

Pre-CoVID-19, DOT distributed voter registration materials at all DOT outreach events. DOT will resume outreach activities once it is safe to do so, thus resuming distribution of voter registration materials.

Describe challenges, both resolved and unresolved.

It is not possible to know which customers visiting DOT's PSCs are already registered to vote. DOT can readily disseminate the voter registration materials, but cannot compel customers to complete the forms and submit them to the PSC managers. If completed forms are not collected on-the-spot and sent to the Board of Elections by the PSC managers, it is difficult to monitor the number of forms being sent to the Board of Elections and effectively track the number of customers participating.

Tracking the number of forms distributed is not an accurate measure of the number of people ultimately registering to vote.

The biggest challenge is the lack of interest or eligibility from the people we serve. Our locations have reported that it is difficult for them to distribute the voter registration forms they have. Many patrons return the voter registration form to our staff without comment. Our recreation centers, which serve as a hub for voter registration and outreach, have remained closed since March 18,2020 due to the current public health crisis. This has greatly impacted our ability to conduct outreach.

We are currently considering virtual outreach so that we can participate in National Voter Registration Day.

On January 9, DYCD held a very informative Civic Engagement Workgroup meeting and shared information about their respective initiatives.

In March, Democracy NYC partnered with DYCD on their Student Voter Registration Drive (SVRD).

In June, DYCD partnered with Democracy NYC and NYC Vote to create the #VoteRemote Mask/Poster Challenge. In this virtual challenge, families learned about voter engagement and awareness and had the opportunity to express themselves creatively. This challenge was disseminated to providers and external stakeholders.

Describe challenges, both resolved and unresolved.

Since the PAUSE order was enacted in March, our community-based organizations have gone above and beyond in helping the City meet one of its top priorities during the COVID-19 emergency: keeping New Yorkers safe. Most our services, including but not limited to COMPASS, Beacon and Cornerstone programs, shifted to remote services to maintain connection and engagement with youth and families. Like the shift made by schools, afterschool programs created online and virtual activities to meet recreational, academic and social-emotional needs. Many programs are still not operating regularly this summer which poses challenges to collecting data from thousands of locations.

To take advantage of virtual opportunities to encourage voter participation, DYCD partnered with Democracy NYC and NYC Vote to create the #VoteRemote Mask/Poster Challenge, which is described in the previous box.

Describe how your agency distributes applications.

The TLC currently maintains a staff of approximately 600 employees, many of whom interface daily with TLC licensees. The agency also provides TLC employees with helpful resources from organizations and other city agencies.

We are targeting these two groups by distributing forms in four separate ways to various TLC divisions and departments:

- **Human Resources** (located in Lower Manhattan) includes registration forms in hiring packets for new employees.
- **Policy/External Affairs** (located in Lower Manhattan) distributes voter registration forms at outreach events and presentations to licensees and driver industry stakeholders across all 5 boroughs.
- Licensing Division (located in Long Island City, Queens) has forms available for visitors to take at its licensing transaction counters. We keep about 300 applications available for distribution at all times. Also, information on how to contact the Board of Elections is included on many TLC-issued forms for licensees.
- Safety + Emissions Division located in Woodside, Queens & Staten Island) has forms available for distribution at its counter operations that licensees must visit on a regular basis (ranging from three times a year to once every two years) for inspection on their vehicle.

By using these targeted strategies, TLC helps all TLC licensees, and incoming employees to receive voter registration information.

Describe any special registration activities, if any.

We are currently working on a voter outreach plan to engage TLC-licensed drivers for the upcoming November election.

Describe challenges, both resolved and unresolved.

Challenges we continue to face include encouraging drivers to take the time to fill out voter registration forms at tabling events. Another challenge is gaining access to voter events, where we can table and invite licensees to participate.

COVID-19 Challenges

- Licensing Division: We saw a 50% decrease in the amount of people passing through our licensing office in Long Island City. This is the primary location where registration forms are distributed to our drivers.
- **Policy/External Affairs**: Policy/External Affairs attends multiple public facing events where registration forms are made available to our drivers as well as the general public. In 2019 for the same 6 month period we attend roughly 25 events where registration forms would have been available. In 2020 the number of attended events dropped to about 10.
