

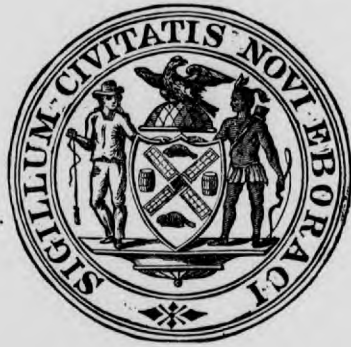

AQUEDUCT COMMISSION.

Minutes of Stated Meeting of the Aqueduct Commissioners, held at their office, No. 209 Stewart Building, on Wednesday, July 10, 1889, at 2 o'clock P. M.

Present—The Comptroller and Commissioners Duane, Tucker, Scott and Howe.
The minutes of the stated meeting of June 26, 1889, were read and approved.
The Committee of Finance and Audit reported their examination and audit of Vouchers Nos. 4880 and 4881, being estimates for work done by contractors, and amounting to \$8,590.
On motion of Commissioner Scott, the same were approved and ordered certified to the Comptroller for payment.
The Committee also reported their examination and audit of Vouchers Nos. 4883 to 4899, inclusive, being estimates for work done by contractors during the month of June, 1889, amounting to \$116,039.18.
On motion of Commissioner Howe, the same were approved and ordered certified to the Comptroller for payment.
The Committee also reported their examination and audit of bills contained in Vouchers Nos. 4900 to 4927, inclusive, amounting to \$1,945.17.
On motion of Commissioner Howe, the same were approved and ordered certified to the Comptroller for payment.
The Construction or Executive Committee presented the following report, received from the Secretary, showing in detail the expenditures of the Aqueduct Commission since its inception up to July 1 of the present year.

On motion of Commissioner Scott, the report was ordered spread on the minutes and filed.

The Committee also presented the following:

The Construction or Executive Committee report:

That at a meeting of the Aqueduct Commissioners, held on June 26, 1889, the contract for constructing highways or roads, and their appurtenances, etc., at East Branch and Bog Brook Reservoirs, in the Town of South East, Putnam County, New York, was awarded to the lowest bidder, Rider & Dougherty, at their bid of \$53,190.50, and that said parties were duly notified of said award, as provided by section 29, chapter 490, Laws of 1883, and that more than ten days have elapsed since the awarding of said contract to said parties, and that they have refused to execute the contract for doing said work and furnish the proper security in the manner required by law; we therefore recommend the adoption of the following resolution:

Resolved, That inasmuch as Rider & Dougherty, to whom has been awarded the contract for constructing highways or roads, and their appurtenances, at East Branch and Bog Brook Reservoirs, in the Town of South East, Putnam County, New York, have neglected or refused to execute a contract for doing said work in the manner provided by law, that the deposit check made by said parties and accompanying the bid submitted for doing said work be and the same is hereby forfeited and retained by the City of New York as liquidated damages for such neglect or refusal, and the Secretary is directed to notify the Comptroller of said action.

On motion of Commissioner Howe, the report was adopted.

The Committee also reported in favor of the adoption of the following resolution:

Resolved, That the President and Secretary be and they are hereby directed to advertise in the CITY RECORD, "New York World" and the "Mail and Express" the notice and advertisement inviting sealed bids or proposals for constructing highways or roads, and their appurtenances, etc., at East Branch and Bog Brook Reservoirs, in the Town of South East, Putnam County, New York, as provided for in the approved forms of contract and specifications on file in the office of the Aqueduct Commissioners.

On motion of Commissioner Scott, the same was adopted.

The Committee also reported in favor of the adoption of the following resolution:

Resolved, That, upon the recommendation of the Chief Engineer, William Horton, Axeman, is hereby certified to the Civil Service Commission for examination for promotion to the position of Rodman.

On motion of Commissioner Scott, the same was adopted.

The Committee also reported in favor of the adoption of the following resolution:

Resolved, That authority is hereby given to the Chief Engineer to purchase one brass arm attachment to planimetre for use in his office.

On motion of the Comptroller, the same was adopted.

The Committee also presented the resignation of Inspector of Masonry James Brady, and recommended that the same be accepted, to take effect as of the 1st instant.

On motion of the Comptroller, the resignation was accepted.

The Committee also presented the resignation of Inspector of Masonry Thomas J. Reilly, and recommended that the same be accepted, to take effect as of the 29th of June last.

On motion of the Comptroller, the resignation was accepted.

The Committee also presented the following :

The Construction or Executive Committee report :

That in the construction of the New Aqueduct and its appurtenances at Sodom, in Putnam County, New York, the water supply of a Mr. Howe, residing at said place, was cut off and destroyed, and it appearing to your Committee that said water supply should be restored, we recommend the adoption of the following resolution :

Resolved, That the Chief Engineer be and he is hereby authorized to take the necessary steps to restore said water supply to Mr. Howe by the construction of a pipe-line laid along the edge of the reservoir lands, and an appropriation of four hundred dollars is hereby made to cover the expense of constructing said pipe-line.

The report was adopted by the following vote :

Affirmative—The Comptroller and Commissioners Duane, Tucker, Scott and Howe—5.

The Committee also reported in favor of the adoption of the following resolution :

Resolved, That, upon the recommendation of the Chief Engineer, a leave of absence, without pay, for a period of two months, to date from July 15, 1889, is hereby granted to Rodman D. McKee Livingstone.

On motion of the Comptroller, the same was adopted.

The Committee also reported in favor of the adoption of the following resolution :

Resolved, That, upon the recommendation of the Chief Engineer, David O'Shea, Leveler, be and he is hereby recommended to the Civil Service Commission for examination for promotion to the position of Transman.

On motion of Commissioner Scott, the same was adopted.

The Committee also reported in favor of the adoption of the following resolution :

Resolved, That the Chief Engineer be and he is hereby authorized to provide such conveyance as, in his opinion, may be necessary for the proper supervision by the Assistant Engineer in charge of the investigation of the work of dam sites and reservoirs in the Croton Basin.

On motion of Commissioner Howe, the same was adopted.

The Committee also presented the following :

The Construction or Executive Committee report :

That they have been notified by O'Brien & Clark of the assignment by them to the Mount Morris Bank of the City of New York of all the moneys earned or to be earned by them under two certain contracts made with the Mayor, Aldermen and Commonalty of the City of New York, one bearing date May 17, 1888, for furnishing, delivering and laying cast-iron pipes, and the other bearing date 17th day of August, 1888, for deepening and finishing Shaft No. 24, to secure the payment of \$50,000 advanced to them by the said Mount Morris Bank to enable them to complete the work referred to in said contracts, and that said O'Brien & Clark have requested the Aqueduct Commissioners to assent to said assignment ; and inasmuch as the contract for doing said work provides that the contractors shall not assign, by power of attorney or otherwise, any of the moneys payable under said contract, unless by and with the consent of the Aqueduct Commissioners ; and your Committee being satisfied that it will be to the interest of the work and beneficial to the City of New York that such consent be given, we recommend the adoption of the following resolution :

Resolved, That the Aqueduct Commissioners hereby assent and consent to the assigning of the moneys due or that may become due to O'Brien & Clark under and in pursuance of a certain contract, bearing date May 17, 1888, for furnishing, delivering and laying cast-iron pipes, and a certain other contract, bearing date the 17th day of August, 1888, for deepening Shaft No. 24 and constructing a head-house therewith, to the Mount Morris Bank of the City of New York, to secure a loan heretofore made to the said firm of O'Brien & Clark by said bank.

The report was adopted by the following vote :

Affirmative—The Comptroller and Commissioners Duane, Tucker, Scott and Howe—5.

The Committee also reported in favor of the adoption of the following resolution :

Resolved, That, upon the recommendation of the Chief Engineer, the following-named Inspectors of Masonry are hereby suspended, without pay, owing to the lack of work ; such suspensions to take effect as of the dates hereinafter named :

On motion of Commissioner Scott, the same was adopted.

The Committee also presented the following communication :

LAW DEPARTMENT,
OFFICE OF THE COUNSEL TO THE CORPORATION,
NEW YORK, July 3, 1889.

To the Aqueduct Commissioners :

GENTLEMEN—I learn from the daily newspapers that it is the judgment of at least some of the members of your Board that the validity of certain claims made by O'Brien & Clark, Brown, Howard & Co., and Rodgers, Shanly & Co., for work performed on the New Aqueduct, should be contested by the City.

As my former partner is now and for nearly a year past has been attorney for some of these contractors, I deem it proper that the defense of the City to their claims should be conducted by special counsel.

I have, therefore, the honor to request that your Board submit to me the names of not less than six leading members of the bar, and from the number so submitted, I will designate one to whom I shall commit the exclusive charge of these litigations.

On motion of Commissioner Scott, the communication was referred back to the Construction Committee.

The Comptroller, under date of June 29, 1889, gave notice of the issue of a warrant for the payment of a voucher not certified to by the Aqueduct Commissioners, for Westchester County Section, \$1,657.69, leaving a balance to the credit of the "Additional Water Fund" of \$130,773.90. Which was ordered entered upon the books of the Commission and filed.

The Secretary presented a copy of an order of discontinuance which was served on him in the action brought by Neil McLaughlin and Garrett Reilly against O'Brien & Clark, The Mayor, Aldermen and Commonalty of the City of New York, John C. Rodgers and Edward J. Farrell to foreclose a lien filed on work done at Shaft No. 24 of the New Aqueduct ; also a copy of the discharge of said lien filed by McLaughlin, Reilly & Co.

On motion of Commissioner Scott, the same were ordered filed.

Commissioner Scott gave notice that it was his intention at the next meeting of the Commissioners to call from the table the report of the Construction Committee recommending the abolition of the office of Consulting Engineer.

Commissioner Scott then moved that when the Commissioners adjourn, they adjourn to meet on Wednesday, July 24, 1889, at 3 o'clock P. M. Carried.

The Commissioners then adjourned.

COMMISSIONERS OF THE SINKING FUND OF THE CITY OF NEW YORK.

Proceedings of the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund at a Meeting held at the Comptroller's Office at 2 o'clock P. M., on Friday, July 26, 1889, pursuant to adjournment.

Present—Hugh J. Grant, Mayor ; Frederick Smyth, Recorder ; Theodore W. Myers, Comptroller ; Richard Croker, Chamberlain, and Walton Storm, Chairman of the Committee on Finance, Board of Aldermen.

The minutes of the meeting held Tuesday, July 23, 1889, were read and approved.

The Recorder, on behalf of the Sub-Committee of the Board, made the following verbal report :

First—That, pursuant to the requirements of the resolution of this Board adopted on the 23d of July, 1889, the Sub-Committee met at the office of the Comptroller on the 26th day of July instant.

Second—That Mr. Wilson of the firm of Messrs. Thom, Wilson & Schaarschmidt, and Mr. LeBrun of the firm of N. LeBrun & Sons, the authors of the plans designated respectively "An Angel with Trumpet and Scales" and "Examine Me Well," appeared before the Committee, and that the author of the plans designated "Droit et Avant" did not appear.

Third—That the author of the plans designated "Examine Me Well," estimated the cost of the building, in accordance with the plans submitted by him, at \$1,340,000, and the time for the completion of the work at two years, and that he would be willing to accept, in full for his compensation as Architect, should his plans be approved and accepted, three per cent. upon the cost of erecting the building.

Fourth—That the author of the plans designated "An Angel with Trumpet and Scales" estimated the cost of the building, in accordance with the plans submitted by him, at \$1,400,000, and the time for the completion of the work at two years, and that he would be willing to accept, in

full for his compensation as Architect, should his plans be approved and accepted, two per cent. upon the cost of erecting the building.

The Recorder further reported that the Sub-Committee were of the opinion that the plans designated "An Angel with Trumpet and Scales," presented certain features which were, in the judgment of the Committee, more meritorious than those presented by the two other plans, respectively designated "Examine Me Well" and "Droit et Avant."

On motion, the report was accepted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

The Chairman of the Committee on Finance of the Board of Aldermen offered the following resolution :

Resolved, That the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund do hereby approve of and accept the plans and specifications for a building to be erected in the City of New York for Criminal Courts and other purposes, as provided by chapter 371, Laws of 1887, marked with the device "An Angel with Trumpet and Scales," submitted by Messrs. Thom, Wilson & Schaarschmidt, architects, No. 1267 Broadway.

Which was unanimously adopted.

The Recorder then offered the following resolution :

Resolved, That the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund do hereby determine and fix the compensation which shall be paid to Messrs. Thom, Wilson & Schaarschmidt, architects, whose plans and specifications of a building to be erected for Criminal Courts and other purposes, and which have been approved and accepted by this Board, at the rate of two per cent. upon the cost of said building.

Which was unanimously adopted.

The Recorder also offered the following resolution :

Resolved, That the Mayor and Comptroller be and are hereby authorized and directed to open the envelopes containing the names of the authors of the plans submitted to the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund for a building for Criminal Courts and other purposes, in response to a notice to architects published in the "CITY RECORD" and other papers, and to return to the respective authors all such plans, specifications and estimates which have not been approved and accepted.

Which was unanimously adopted.

The Comptroller presented the following report and resolution, on the petition of John S. Scott, for a release of the City's interest in certain lands in the Twelfth Ward, with an appraisal thereof by the Comptroller and the Commissioner of Public Works, together with an opinion of the Counsel to the Corporation on said petition :

To the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund :

GENTLEMEN—Herewith I present a petition of John S. Scott for a release of the City's interest in a strip of land on the northeast corner of Lexington avenue and One Hundred and Fourth street, originally below the high-water mark of a stream flowing into the East or Harlem river, but now filled in and made solid ground.

This petition was submitted by me to the Counsel to the Corporation on June 17, for his opinion upon the rights and interest of the City in the premises, and his advice as to the proper course to be taken with said petition by the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund.

I have received a communication from the Counsel to the Corporation, dated July 24, 1889, containing a very full discussion of the question of the rights and interest of the City in the marsh or meadow lands and streams in Harlem, referring to the opinions of his predecessors in office and decisions of the courts, declaring that the City had no interest in such lands and that it acquired no title thereto under their charters.

But the Counsel to the Corporation states that "while I am satisfied that the City has no claim or title to the petitioner's property, I think a release of any supposed right, title or interest which the City may have, may properly be given. I understand that the petitioner is prepared to pay a substantial sum, \$700, for such release, for the purpose of removing all cloud from his title."

"The Counsel to the Corporation further advises that, 'The petitioner, as owner of the upland adjoining the strip in question, formerly supposed to have been under water at high tide, seems to come fairly within the equitable rule adopted in the Hart case, just referred to. If, therefore, the City has any interest in the premises it may release it under section 79 (chapter 3, article VI.) of the Revised Ordinances of 1880.'"

In accordance with the advice of the Counsel to the Corporation, the Comptroller and the Commissioner of Public Works have made an appraisal of the City's interest in said land, which is herewith submitted, together with a resolution to authorize a release thereof upon the prayer of the petitioner.

Resolved, That the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund do hereby approve of and agree to the valuation of the interest of the City of New York, reported by the Comptroller and the Commissioner of Public Works, appraising and fixing the amount thereof at seven hundred dollars (\$700), which should be charged for a release of the City's interest in a certain parcel or strip of land originally subject to the flow of the tide, but which is now filled in and made solid ground, being a portion of the plot of land bounded and described as follows : Beginning at the northeasterly corner of Lexington avenue and One Hundred and Fourth street ; running thence easterly along the northerly side of One Hundred and Fourth street ninety-five feet ; thence northerly, parallel with Lexington avenue, one hundred feet eleven inches ; thence westerly, parallel with One Hundred and Fourth street, twenty-five feet ; thence southerly, parallel with Lexington avenue, twenty-five feet eleven inches ; thence westerly, parallel with One Hundred and Fourth street, seventy feet to the easterly side of Lexington avenue ; thence southerly along the easterly side of Lexington avenue seventy-five feet to the point or place of beginning ; and do fix the sum of seven hundred dollars (\$700) as the amount to be paid for said release ; and the Comptroller is hereby authorized and directed to cause a release to be made of the City's interest in said land, to John S. Scott, and to deliver the same to him, when executed by the Mayor and Clerk of the Common Council, when prepared and approved by the Counsel to the Corporation, upon the payment of said sum ; provided that all taxes, assessments and Croton water rents which may remain unpaid shall also be paid before the delivery thereof.

The report was accepted and the resolution unanimously adopted.

Scott, dated June 10, 1889, for a release of the interest of the City of New York in a portion of a plot of land situated on the northeasterly corner of Lexington avenue and One Hundred and Fourth street, as described in the petition of said Scott to the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund, and shown on a diagram of the premises annexed thereto, the said land having been, as alleged, originally subject to the flow of the tide of the Harlem or East river, but is now filled in and made solid ground, and they respectfully report that the sum of \$700 is the sum which should be paid for a release of the interest of the Corporation

of the City of New York in said land, and which the petitioner agrees to pay for the purpose of removing all cloud from his title; the petitioner to pay all taxes, assessments and Croton water rents which may remain unpaid on said premises, if any, before the delivery of the release.

OPINION OF THE COUNSEL TO THE CORPORATION.

LAW DEPARTMENT,
OFFICE OF THE COUNSEL TO THE CORPORATION,
NEW YORK, July 24, 1889.

Hon. THEODORE W. MYERS, Comptroller:

SIR—I have received your letter under date of June 17, 1889, transmitting the petition of John S. Scott to the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund for a release of the City's interest in a plot of land on the northeast corner of Lexington avenue and One Hundred and Fourth street, "a portion of which, fronting on One Hundred and Fourth street, ninety-five feet, was originally subject to the flow of the tide in a creek or watercourse that emptied into the East river, but which is now filled in and made solid ground."

You request to be advised in regard to the City's interest in said land originally under water by the flow of the tide, and what course shall be taken by the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund to grant a release thereof to the petitioner.

The petition shows that in June, 1888, said John S. Scott purchased from Bernhard Mayer a parcel of land bounded as follows: Beginning at the northeasterly corner of Lexington avenue and One Hundred and Fourth street; running thence easterly along the northerly side of One Hundred and Fourth street ninety-five feet; thence northerly, parallel with Lexington avenue, one hundred feet eleven inches; thence westerly, parallel with One Hundred and Fourth street, twenty-five feet; thence southerly, parallel with Lexington avenue, twenty-five feet eleven inches; thence westerly, parallel with One Hundred and Fourth street, seventy feet to the easterly side of Lexington avenue; thence southerly along the easterly side of Lexington avenue seventy-five feet to the point or place of beginning.

Thereafter the petitioner erected five buildings on said land, four fronting on Lexington avenue and one on One Hundred and Fourth street.

He recently contracted to sell the house and lot fronting on One Hundred and Fourth street, and the intending purchaser has objected to completing the purchase unless a release should be given by the City of any interest which it may have in said premises.

The ground of objection, as set forth in the petition, is that about seventy years ago there were adjacent to said premises, on the south thereof, "certain land which is said to have been marsh or meadow land, having in parts, it is said, streams running over it, and over which marsh or meadow, it is said, tide water sometimes overflowed; and said purchaser is of the impression that the front of your petitioner's premises (though only a small part thereof) on One Hundred and Fourth street formed and was the northern extremity of said marsh or meadow."

The petitioner thinks it doubtful whether any part of said premises was included in said marsh or meadow, but states that the map from which the purchaser deduces the conclusion as to the meadows touching said premises does not show more than about two feet at Lexington avenue and about ten feet of said street lot as included therein.

In support of his belief that the land in question was not part of the original marsh or meadow, the petitioner alleges that in constructing his buildings he found his land to be solid, dry and dry sand producing "in all respects like other ordinary building lots; no piles or pile-driving was necessary; when building he removed trees which had long stood on said land and he is informed and believes that a garden formerly was upon the said premises."

It is further alleged that taxes have always been imposed by the City upon said premises and received by it and that the premises have always been in the actual and undisputed possession of the petitioner's grantors under ancient and well recognized title.

While the petitioner regards the objection aforesaid fanciful and unfounded, he states that it damages and injures his property and therefore requests a release from the City, which he thinks may in fairness and in accordance with ancient usage be given to him as owner of the abutting upland.

Assuming that the strip of land as to which release is now desired was formerly part of the marsh or meadow land of Harlem, the first question that arises is, what interest, if any, has the City of New York in the land originally subject to the flow of the tide?

This question as to the Harlem marshes has been twice directly passed upon by my predecessors, after full and careful consideration, and in both cases it was declared that the City had no interest whatever in such lands.

Under date of August 1, 1870, the Hon. Richard O'Gorman, then Counsel to the Corporation, in a letter to the Hon. Richard B. Connolly, then Comptroller, considered the grounds of the City's claim as to certain lands in the Harlem river, between Ninety-first and One Hundred and Fourth streets, and One Hundred and Seventh and One Hundred and Eighth streets, extending to the Third avenue; and after referring to the Dongan Charter of April, 1686, and the prior grants of Governor Nicolls, to the freeholders and inhabitants of Harlem, and other documents and statutes, concluded that he was "unable to discover in the various charters of the City or in any of the grants of lands under water to the Corporation, any provisions which vest in the Mayor, etc., of the City of New York any title to the land in question."

On November 10, 1880, the Hon. William C. Whitney, then Counsel to the Corporation, addressed a letter to the Hon. John Kelly, Comptroller, respecting an application made to the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund by William F. Russell, Receiver of the Sixpenny Savings Bank, for a release of whatever claim, if any, the City might possess to certain lands formerly under water, in certain streams, subject to the flow of tide water, running through the block bounded by One Hundred and First and One Hundred and Second streets and Second and Third avenues, which streams had been filled up by the improvements made on said premises, leaving no vestige thereof. After reviewing the several grants and charters affecting property in Harlem, and the statutes relating to such property, Mr. Whitney gave it as his opinion that the premises in question were "included within the grant to the freeholders and inhabitants of Harlem, and that the Mayor, Aldermen and Commonalty of the City of New York have acquired no title thereto under their charters."

If the views expressed by my predecessors in the letters above referred to require judicial confirmation, it may be found in the unanimous opinion of the Supreme Court, General Term, First Department, rendered in October, 1887, in the case of Breen vs. Locke, reported in 46 Hun, 291.

The premises with respect to which the question of title arose were situated on the west side of Eighth avenue, between One Hundred and Fifty-first and One Hundred and Fifty-second streets, in the City of New York. It was conceded that the premises were wholly included between high-water mark and the middle line of a creek formerly leading to the Harlem river, but now filled up. The creek was created partly by several fresh water streams and partly by the waters of the Harlem river which, at high tide, set back through the mouth of the creek at One Hundred and Fifty-fifth street, distant eight hundred and ninety-eight feet, and overspread the entire lot in question.

The plaintiff claimed title under the Harlem patents of May and October, 1686, from Governor Nicolls, and the confirmatory patent in March, 1686, from Governor Dongan. The defendant claimed that the creek in question was a portion of the Harlem river itself, so that the land lay between high and low water mark on that river, and that it was conveyed to the City of New York by the Dongan charter, which gave the tideway of the river to the municipality.

It appeared in the case that the set-back of the tide from the river broadened the creek, at the place where the premises were, from six feet in width at low tide to two hundred feet at high tide. The Court held that this set-back, producing these effects, did not make the creek an integral part of the river, and "that the land in question was conveyed to the freeholders and inhabitants of Harlem by the patents already mentioned, and that the title thereto did not pass to the City of New York under the Dongan Charter."

Under the law established by the Court, in Breen vs. Locke, it is apparent that the premises now owned by the petitioner on One Hundred and Fourth street were never granted to the City of New York, but passed to the freeholders and inhabitants of Harlem. The land in question, according to the Randell map, was about two thousand feet from the main body of the Harlem river at high tide; it does not appear to have been of any value or importance to the City of New York in a commercial sense; it has been cut off from the river by avenues for many years, and the neighborhood has long been solid ground.

It is difficult at this day to state with much assurance of certainty whether the small strip of the petitioner's land on One Hundred and Fourth street, concerning which the question has arisen, was formerly "meadow," "marsh," "creek," "waters," or "soils"; but whether one or the other of these terms applied, as all such property passed by the Nicolls grant to the people of Harlem, down to high-water mark of the Harlem river, I am clearly of opinion that the City of New York has no title or interest in or to the petitioner's premises, under the Dongan Charter.

Without further dwelling upon the question of the City's interest, I may add that the views expressed by my predecessors in the letters of August, 1870, and November, 1880, approved by the Court in Breen vs. Locke, and in which I concur, find ample confirmation in the work of John W. Pirsson, Esq., of the New York Bar, recently published, entitled "The Dutch Grants, Harlem Patents and Tidal Creeks," in which the various deeds and documents pertaining to the subject are collated, and the law critically examined and stated.

But while I am satisfied that the City has no claim or title to the petitioner's property, I think a release of any supposed right, title, or interest which the City may have may properly be given. I understand that the petitioner is prepared to pay a substantial sum, to wit, \$700, for such release, for the purpose of removing all cloud from his title.

Questions have frequently arisen heretofore as to the proper mode of effecting the release desired in cases like the present, whether under section 79 of the Revised Ordinances of 1880, or under section 85 thereof. The former section authorizes grants "of land under water on the shores of the

Island of New York," etc., "to be issued to the parties who may be legally entitled to the same," and does not require a public auction. Section 85 relates to public sales, upon at least thirty days' notice.

In accordance with the views above expressed as to the City's interest (or rather want of interest), in the premises of the petitioner, I think no public sale or notice is necessary. If the City did, in fact and law, acquire any interest in the premises under the Dongan Charter, because the property lay between high and low water, then the proper mode of sale is laid down in section 79 of the Ordinances of 1880. This ordinance was before the Court of Appeals in the case of the Mayor vs. Hart and Remsen, 95 N. Y., 443, where a deed given pursuant thereto, to the owner of the abutting upland, was recognized as valid.

See also the letter from this Department to Hon. S. Hastings Grant, Comptroller, under date of July 8, 1884, respecting a release to Messrs. Ryerson and Yeungling of two lots of land at the corner of One Hundred and Thirty-fifth street and Fifth avenue.

The petitioner, as owner of the upland adjoining the strip in question, formerly supposed to have been under water at high tide, seems to come fairly within the equitable rule adopted in the Hart case just referred to. If, therefore, the City has any interest in the premises, it may release it under said section 79, and under the circumstances set forth in the petition, and in view of the further statement made orally on the behalf of the petitioner to the effect that a refusal by the purchaser to accept title of the premises in question will result in serious pecuniary embarrassment to the petitioner, I advise that a release be given as prayed for.

In view, however, of the many similar applications which have been made and which are likely to be made, I would respectfully renew the suggestion made by the Hon. George P. Andrews, then Counsel to the Corporation, in a letter to the Hon. S. Hastings Grant, Comptroller, dated February 13, 1884. The letter related to a petition to the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund made by Messrs. N. J. and T. W. Haines, for the release of the City's interest in certain lands on the northerly side of Ninety-seventh street, between Second and Third avenues, and concluded as follows:

"My predecessors, the Hon. Richard O'Gorman and the Hon. William C. Whitney, as above stated, have given opinions that the City has not, and never had, any title to these low lands situated in Harlem; that the grant to the freeholders and inhabitants of Harlem covered them out to the mouths of all creeks, carrying with them the beds of the creeks and all these marshes.

"If parties choose to accept the opinions of other counsel, or their surmises as to what the possibilities may be as to the former ownership of these lands against the opinions, given after careful investigation by the City's law officers, they should not call upon the City to act, notwithstanding the opinion of its officers.

"I think parties should be left to their own remedy if a purchaser refuses to take title because the City may have some interest. An action for specific performance will lie, and that will settle the question. I can even conceive ways wherein there might be a proceeding directly against the City which would settle such questions, but it is not my province to suggest modes of action against the City; and I think it advisable that the Commissioners should now take some public action, which shall notify all parties interested that they will not henceforth entertain any such application.

"While, therefore, I would respectfully recommend that in this case the prayer of the petitioners be granted, I would also recommend that the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund adopt a resolution that henceforth such an application will not be taken into consideration."

I return herewith the papers transmitted with your letter.

The Comptroller reported that his Honor the Mayor and himself had opened the envelopes containing the names of the authors of the plans submitted for a building for Criminal Courts and other purposes, and that he had notified the respective authors of all such plans which had not been approved and accepted, that they would be returned to them, as authorized and directed by a resolution adopted by the Board at its last meeting.

The Comptroller submitted the following resolutions:

Resolved, That the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund, acting under chapter 371, Laws of 1887, having selected and approved the plans and specifications for the building for Criminal Courts and other purposes, submitted by Messrs. Thom, Wilson & Schaarschmidt, architects, hereby decide to proceed with the work of erection of the said building without delay.

Which was unanimously adopted.

Resolved, That the Architects, Messrs. Thom, Wilson & Schaarschmidt, be directed to proceed immediately with the preparation of the detailed working drawings and specifications necessary for the making of contracts for the erection of the said building, and that they be directed to prepare, first, the detailed working drawings and specifications for the foundation, in order that that portion of the work may be executed at the earliest time practicable.

Which was unanimously adopted.

The Comptroller presented the following letter from Messrs. Thom, Wilson & Schaarschmidt, the architects whose plans for a Criminal Court building have been approved and accepted:

NEW YORK, July 30, 1889.

Hon. THEODORE W. MYERS, Comptroller, City of New York:

DEAR SIR—In reply to your communication of July 27, informing us that our plans have been selected for the Criminal Court building, and that we have been appointed Architects of the work, we desire, through you, to express our sincere thanks to the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund for the confidence which they have placed in us, and hereby promise that nothing shall be left undone, on our part, to produce a building which will reflect credit on the Honorable Commissioners, and be an architectural ornament to the City of New York. And presuming that it is the desire of the Commissioners to proceed with all possible haste, we would respectfully suggest that the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund would appropriate a sum of money (say \$250) sufficient for the purpose of having at least ten test piles driven on the site of the building, in order that we may more intelligently specify the construction of the foundations. Also that a competent City Surveyor be detailed or appointed for the purpose of giving accurate lines, levels and measurements, which will, from time to time, be required during the progress of the building.

Thom, Wilson & Schaarschmidt, and that the sum of one hundred and twenty-five dollars (\$125), or so much thereof as may be necessary for the purpose, is hereby appropriated to pay for the same, to be charged to the appropriation for the building for Criminal Courts and other purposes.

Which was unanimously adopted.

Resolved, That the Commissioner of Public Works be requested to appoint a City Surveyor to make such surveys and give such lines and levels for the building for Criminal Courts and other purposes, as may be considered necessary by said Architects, Messrs. Thom, Wilson & Schaarschmidt, the said Surveyor to be paid for his services from the appropriation for the building for Criminal Courts and other purposes.

Which was unanimously adopted.

The minutes of the meeting held April 22, 1889, were read and approved.

The Comptroller presented the following communication to the Board, from Hon. Hugh J. Grant, Mayor of the City of New York :

MAYOR'S OFFICE, NEW YORK, July 27, 1889.

GENTLEMEN—Before the final selection of a site for the New Municipal Building, I feel that it would be eminently proper to take into serious consideration the opposition which has been manifested to the erection of any additional structures in the City Hall Park.

In my annual message to the Common Council, I brought this matter to the attention of the Aldermen in the hope that it would provoke a discussion which would enlighten the Legislature and the local authorities upon the state of public opinion with reference to this subject. While the measure was pending before the Legislature, there appeared to be no opposition to its enactment, but, since it became a law, it has provoked severe and extensive hostility.

I am firmly convinced that a conclusion on this subject should be reached with the most careful deliberation and after a patient effort to obtain the fullest light that can be shed upon it. For my part, I do not feel that the question is merely one of expense. Important as the cost of a site may be in an economic sense, the difficulty of obtaining a suitable one outside the park presents a still more difficult and embarrassing question. It appears to me that a public building, worthy of the importance and greatness of this City, should not be erected in any place where its architectural beauty would be obscured or impaired by mean or inappropriate surroundings. It may be, however, that those who oppose the enforcement of the present law would be able to afford suggestions upon this aspect of the matter, which will greatly simplify the problem with which we are confronted.

I, therefore, suggest that a public hearing be ordered by the Commissioners appointed by chapter 81 of the Laws of 1889, and that all citizens be invited to give expressions to such views as they may have formed upon the subject, so that, by the possession of the fullest information, a disposition may be made of the matter consistent with the highest interests of the municipality.

The Comptroller offered the following resolution :

Resolved, That the time for the reception of plans, specifications and estimates for the erection of a New Municipal Building in the City Hall Park, fixed for the first day of August, 1889, under a resolution adopted by this Board on April 22, 1889, be and hereby is postponed until Tuesday, October 1, 1889.

Which was unanimously adopted and ordered to be advertised in the CITY RECORD.

The Committee appointed at the meeting of the Board, held April 22, 1889, to consider the matter of the erection of a New Municipal Building upon the site selected and located by the Board under a resolution adopted on that day, and to advertise for plans and specifications for said building, reported that, as prescribed by the act authorizing its erection, the Committee had published a "Notice to Architects" daily in the CITY RECORD (until August 1, 1889), and once a week for three consecutive weeks in the following papers printed in the City of New York, to wit :

"The World," "New York Tribune," "The Sun," "The Star," "The New York Herald," "The New York Times," "New Yorker Staats Zeitung," "New York Daily News," "The Real Estate Record and Builders' Guide," "The Building," and "The American Contractor," as follows :

PLANS FOR A MUNICIPAL BUILDING IN THE CITY OF NEW YORK—NOTICE TO ARCHITECTS.

In accordance with the provisions of chapter 81 of the Laws of 1889, entitled "An act to provide for the erection of a building for certain purposes relating to the public interests in the City of New York," passed March 27, 1889, the Board of Commissioners thereby constituted will, until the first day of August, 1889, receive plans and specifications for a New Municipal Building, provided for in said statute, to be erected in the City Hall Park, upon the plot of ground east of the City Hall and the New County Court-house.

A diagram, showing the ground plan of the proposed building, and instructions to architects, enumerating the requirements in the submission of plans, can be obtained, on application, at the Comptroller's office.

Four premiums will be awarded, as follows :

For the plans adjudged to be the best, a premium of \$1,500 will be paid; and in the event of their adoption by the Board of Commissioners, the author will be appointed to the superintendence of the construction of the building, with the fees prescribed by the American Institute of Architects, provided his standing is such as to guarantee a faithful discharge of his duties.

For the plans adjudged to be the second best, a premium of \$1,500 will be paid, and for the plans adjudged to be the third and fourth best, premiums of \$500 each will be paid.

In the examination and judgment of plans, the Board will be assisted by a committee, to be appointed by the Mayor, consisting of not more than three competent architects, and a civil engineer.

All plans submitted for competition, for which premiums are awarded, shall become the property of the City; and all plans must be filed with the Comptroller on or before the date mentioned. Each plan submitted shall be marked with such assumed designation as the architect may select, provided there shall be filed with the Mayor, a sealed envelope giving the real name of the author of the plans so designated, which shall be opened by the Mayor in the presence of the Board, after the premiums shall have been awarded.

"Instructions to Architects" were also published, together with the "Notice to Architects" in pamphlet form, as follows :

INSTRUCTIONS FOR ARCHITECTS IN PREPARING PLANS FOR A BUILDING IN CITY HALL PARK, AUTHORIZED BY CHAPTER 81, LAWS OF 1889. APPROVED MARCH 27, 1889.

The building is to be erected within the lines shown on the approved survey, or plan, accompanying these instructions, except such projections as may be necessary for architectural effects.

The main building (A, B, C, D,) is to be as near fire-proof, throughout, as can be practically secured.

The part of the building appropriated to the Register (C, E, F, G, H,) to be completely cut off by a double wall, or otherwise, from the rest of the building, and to be absolutely fire-proof, in all the materials of construction.

The building is to be heated by steam.

The plans will include elevators in sufficient number to perform the service required, in addition to the stairways.

Two grand entrances will be provided for the main building, one on Centre street, the other on Chambers street. Minor entrances will be placed at convenient points.

There will be but one entrance to the part of the building appropriated to the Register, to be at such point as shall be fixed in the accepted plans.

The outside faces of the walls of the building to be of granite, of such finish and variety of tint as may be recommended in the accepted plans and specifications.

The walls of the courtyards to be faced with light colored brick.

There will be a cellar under the whole of the building, thirteen feet in depth, properly lighted and ventilated.

The main building will be six stories in height, including the basement. The portion appropriated to the Register to be three stories in height, but the foundation and other walls to be of such strength as to allow the addition of two stories. The style of this part of the building to be made to conform, as far as possible, with that of the City Hall.

The first, or basement story, to be fifteen feet in height between floor and ceiling. The floor to be one foot above the highest point of the plot.

The second story to be fifteen feet in height between floor and ceiling.

The third story to be fourteen feet in height between floor and ceiling.

The fourth story to be the same.

The fifth story to be thirteen feet six inches between floor and ceiling.

The sixth story to be thirteen feet six inches between floor and ceiling.

The height above the top story to be such as shall be recommended in the plans.

The following drawings will be required :

1. Plans of each story, the basement included. Where two or more stories are identical, one plan only will be necessary.

2. Two vertical sections, one on a line north and south, the other on a line east and west, through the centre of the main building. The north and south section to be broken so as to show the part appropriated to the Register.

3. Elevations of the four outside fronts.

4. Three perspectives. The first, showing the Centre street and Chambers street fronts; the second, from the southeast, showing the southerly and easterly fronts of the part of the building appropriated to the Register, and about fifty feet of the Centre street front of the main building; the third, from the southwest, showing the westerly and southerly fronts.

In the first, the plane of the picture shall be at an angle of thirty degrees with the Centre street front, the point of observation to be three hundred feet distant from the nearest corner; in the second, the vertical line of heights to be taken on the point xx, which is the point of intersection of the prolongation of the lines of the Centre street and south fronts. The plane of the picture to be drawn through the vertical line of heights, xx, at an angle of thirty degrees with the south front, and the point of observation to be three hundred feet distant from the vertical line of heights; in the third, the plane of the picture shall be at an angle of thirty degrees with the westerly front, and the point of observation to be three hundred feet distant from the nearest corner.

The horizontal line, in all, to be six feet above the top of the first floor.

The plans, elevations and sections are to be drawn to the uniform scale of one-sixteenth of an inch to the foot, and the perspectives to the scale of one-eighth of an inch to the foot, on the nearest corner, for the first and third, and on the said vertical line of heights for the second.

The drawings are to be finished in line, with the drawing pen, with India ink. They are to be back-lined, and no shadows are to be cast. There is to be no brush work, except in the blacking of the windows, and in the sections of the walls and floors.

In the perspectives there is to be no background or foreground, and nothing will be shown, except what strictly belongs to the building, in any of the drawings.

The lettering and figuring are to be perfectly plain, like ordinary printing type, and are to be confined to the names and dimensions of the rooms, placed in the middle of the rooms, without explanatory remarks, which are to be given by themselves in a separate memorandum.

The drawings are to be made on plain white paper of the uniform size of 30 in. x 16 in., except the third perspective, which will be 32 in. x 16 in.

The drawings are to be surrounded by a single black line for border, and they are not to be framed, glazed or mounted on cardboard, but are to be sent in a portfolio.

A brief memorandum may be submitted with the drawings, explanatory of any points not made clear by them.

There will be submitted with the drawings an estimate of cost of the building, and descriptive general specifications.

The papers submitted will be typewritten. They, as well as the drawings, will be distinguished by a cypher or motto. No handwriting of any kind is to appear on or in connection with the drawings.

A separate sealed envelope, directed in typewriting, is to be sent to the Mayor, containing the cypher or motto, and the name and address of the architect. This envelope is to be endorsed also with the cypher or motto.

The building is to be occupied as shown on the annexed schedule.

There will be a space provided through the basement story of forty feet, for foot passengers.

The plans and the accompanying documents will be sent to the Comptroller's office, No. 280 Broadway.

Each plan submitted shall be marked with such assumed designation as the architect may select, provided there shall be filed with the Mayor a sealed envelope, giving the real name of the author of the plans so designated, which shall be opened by the Mayor in the presence of the Board, after the premiums shall have been awarded.

PUBLIC NOTICE AS TO WATER RATES.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT in compliance with the provisions of chapter 559, Laws of 1887, amending sections 350 and 351 of the New York City Consolidation Act of 1882, passed June 9, 1887, the following changes are made in charging and collecting water rents:

1st. All extra charges for water incurred from and after June 9, 1887, shall be treated, collected and returned in arrears in the same manner as regular rents have heretofore been treated.

2d. In every building where a water meter or meters are now, or shall hereafter be in use, the charge for water by meter measurement shall be the only charge against such building, or such part thereof as is supplied through meter.

3d. The returns of arrears of water rents, including the year 1887, shall be made as heretofore on the confirmation of the tax levy by the Board of Aldermen, and shall include all charges and penalties of every nature.

4th. A penalty of five dollars (\$5) is hereby established, and will be imposed in each and every case where the rules and regulations of the Department prohibiting the use of water through hose, or in any other wasteful manner, are violated, and such penalties will be entered on the books of the Bureau against the respective buildings or property, and, if not collected, be returned in arrears in like manner as other charges for water.

5th. Charges for so-called extra water rents of every nature, imposed or incurred prior to June 9, 1887, will be canceled of record on the books of the Department.

REGULATIONS ESTABLISHING A SCALE OF WATER RENTS AND RULES GOVERNING THE USE OF WATER, FOR THE CITY OF NEW YORK, BY ORDER OF THOMAS F. GILROY, COMMISSIONER OF PUBLIC WORKS.

UNDER CHAPTER 410, LAWS 1882, SECTIONS 350, 351, 352 and 353, and as amended by chapter 559, Laws 1887, as follows:

"The commissioner of public works shall, from time to time, establish scales of rents for the supplying of water, which rents shall be collected in the manner now provided by law, and which shall be apportioned to different classes of buildings in said city in reference to their dimensions, values, exposure to fires, ordinary uses for dwellings, stores, shops, private stables and other common purposes, number of families or occupants, or consumption of water, as near as may be practicable, and modify, alter, amend and increase such scale from time to time, and extend it to other descriptions of buildings and establishments. All extra charges for water shall be deemed to be included in the regular rents, and shall

become a charge and lien upon the buildings upon which they are respectively imposed, and, if not paid, shall be returned as arrears to the clerk of arrears. Such regular rents, including the extra charges above mentioned, shall be collected from the owners or occupants of all such buildings respectively, which shall be situated upon lots adjoining any street or avenue in said city in which the distributing water-pipes are or may be laid, and from which they can be supplied with water. Said rents, including the extra charges aforesaid, shall become a charge and lien upon such houses and lots, respectively, as herein provided, but no charge whatever shall be made against any building in which a water-meter may have been, or shall be placed as provided in this act. In all such cases the charge for water shall be determined only by the quantity of water actually used as shown by said meters. * * * * *

The said commissioner of public works is hereby authorized to prescribe a penalty not exceeding the sum of five dollars for each offense, for permitting water to be wasted, and for any violation of such reasonable rules as he may, from time to time, prescribe for the prevention of the waste of water; such fines shall be added to the regular water rents."

The regular annual rents to be collected by the Department of Public Works shall be as follows, to wit:

The rent of all tenements which shall exceed in width fifty feet shall be the subject of special contract with the Commissioner of Public Works.

The apportionment of the regular rents upon dwelling-houses are on the basis that but one family is to occupy the same, and for each additional family, one dollar per year shall be charged.

METERS will be placed on all houses where waste of water is found, and they will be charged at rates fixed by the Department for all the water passing through them.

The extra and miscellaneous rates shall be as follows, to wit:

BAKESIES.—For the average daily use of flour, for each barrel, three dollars per annum.

BARBER SHOPS shall be charged from five to twenty dollars per annum each in the discretion of the Commissioner of Public Works; an additional charge of five dollars per annum shall be made for each bathtub therein.

BATHING TUBS in private houses, beyond one, shall be charged at three dollars per annum each, and five dollars per annum each in public houses, boarding-houses, and bathing establishments. Combination stationary wash-tubs, having a movable division in the centre and capable of use for bathing, shall be charged the same as bathing tubs.

BUILDING PURPOSES.—For each one thousand bricks laid, or for stone-work—to be measured as brick—ten cents per thousand. For plastering, forty cents per hundred yards.

COWS.—For each and every cow, one dollar per annum.

DINING SALOONS shall be charged an annual rate of from five to twenty dollars, in the discretion of the Commissioner of Public Works.

FISH STANDS (retail) shall be charged five dollars per annum each.

For all stables not metered, the rates shall be as follows: HORSES, PRIVATE.—For two horses there shall be charged six dollars per annum; and for each additional horse, two dollars.

HORSES, LIVERY.—For each horse up to and not exceeding thirty in number, one dollar and fifty cents each per annum; and for each additional horse, one dollar.

HORSES, GROOMING AND CART.—For each horse, one dollar per annum.

HORSE TROUGHS.—For each trough, and for each half barrel or tub on sidewalk or street, twenty dollars per annum; each trough is to be fitted with a proper ball-cock to prevent waste.

HOTELS AND BOARDING HOUSES shall, in addition to the regular rate for private families, be charged for each lodging room, at the discretion of the Commissioner of Public Works.

LAUNDRIES shall be charged from eight to twenty dollars per annum, in the discretion of the Commissioner of Public Works.

LIQUOR AND LAGER BEER SALOONS shall be charged an annual rate of ten dollars each. An additional charge of five dollars per annum shall be made for each tap or wash-box.

PHOTOGRAPH GALLERIES shall be charged an annual rate of from five to twenty dollars, in the discretion of the Commissioner of Public Works.

PRINTING OFFICES, when not metered, shall be charged at such rates as may be determined by the Commissioner of Public Works.

SODA, MINERAL WATER AND ROOT BEER FOUNTAINS shall be charged five dollars per annum each.

STEAM ENGINES, where not metered, shall be charged by the horse-power, as follows: For each horse-power up to and not exceeding ten, the sum of ten dollars per annum; for each exceeding ten, and not over fifteen, the sum of seven dollars and fifty cents each and for each horse-power over fifteen, the sum of five dollars.

WATER-CLOSETS AND URINALS.—To each building on a lot one water-closet having sewer connection is allowed without charge; each additional water-closet or urinal will be charged as hereinafter stated. All closets connected in any manner with sewer shall be charged two dollars for each seat per annum, whether in a building or on any other portion of the premises. Urinals shall be charged two dollars per annum each.

WATER-CLOSET RATES.—For hoppers of any form, when water is supplied direct from the Croton supply, through any form of the so-called single or double valves, hopper-cocks, stop-cocks, self-closing cocks, or any valve or cock of any description attached to the closet, each, per year, twenty dollars.

For any pan closet, or any of the forms of valve, plunger, or other water-closet not before mentioned, supplied with water as above described, per year, ten dollars.

For any form of hopper or water-closet, supplied from the ordinary style of cistern filled with ball-cock, and overflow pipe that communicates with the pipe to the water-closet, so that overflow will run into the hopper or water-closet, when ball-cock is defective, or from which an unlimited amount of water can be drawn by holding up the handle, per year, each, five dollars.

For any form of hopper or water-closet, supplied from any of the forms of waste-preventing cisterns, that are approved by the Engineer of the Croton Aqueduct, which are so constructed that not more than three gallons of water can be drawn at each lift of the handle, or depression of the seat, if such cisterns are provided with an overflow pipe, such overflow pipe must not connect with the water-closet, but be carried like a safe-waste, as provided by the Board of Health regulations, per year, two dollars.

Cistern answering this description can be seen at this Department.

METERS.

Under the provisions of section 352, Consolidated Act 1882, water-meters, of approved pattern, shall be hereafter placed on the pipes supplying all stores, workshops,

hotels, manufactories, public edifices, at wharves, ferry-houses, stables, and in all places where water is furnished for business consumption, except private dwellings.

It is provided by section 352, Laws of 1882, that "all expenses of meters, their connections and setting, water rates, and other lawful charges for the supply of Croton water, shall be a lien upon the premises where such water is supplied, as now provided by law." * * *

All manufacturing and other business requiring a large supply of water will be fitted with a meter.

Water measured by meter, ten cents per one hundred cubic feet.

The rate charged for steam-vessels taking water daily or belonging to daily lines, is one-half cent per ton (Custom House measurement) for each time they take water. Steamers taking water other than daily, one cent per ton (Custom House measurement).

Water supplied to sailing vessels and put on board, twenty-five cents per hundred gallons.

All matters not hereinbefore embraced are reserved for special contract by and with the Commissioner of Public Works.

HYDRANTS, HOSE, TROUGHS, FOUNTAINS, ETC., ETC.

No owner or tenant will be allowed to supply water to another person or persons.

All persons taking water from the City must keep their own service-pipes, street tap, and all fixtures connected therewith, in good repair, protected from frost, at their own risk and expense, and shall prevent all waste of water.

The use of hose to wash coaches, omnibuses, wagons, railway cars or other vehicles or horses, cannot be permitted.

No horse-troughs or horse-watering fixtures will be permitted in the street or on the sidewalk, except upon a license or permit taken out for that purpose. All licenses or permits must be annually renewed on the first of May. Such fixtures must be kept in good order and the water not allowed to drip or waste by overrunning the sidewalk or street, or to become dangerous in winter by freezing in and about such troughs or fixtures.

No hydrant will be permitted on the sidewalk or in the front area, and any hydrant standing in a yard or alley, attached to any dwelling or building, must not be left running when not in actual use, and if the drip or waste from such hydrant freezes and becomes dangerous in winter, the supply will be shut off in addition to the penalty of five dollars imposed.

Taps at wash-basins, water-closets, baths and urinals must not be left running, under the penalty of five dollars for each offense, which will be strictly enforced.

Fountains or jets in hotels, porter-houses, eating-saloons, confectioneries or other buildings are strictly prohibited.

The use of hose for washing sidewalks, stoops, areas, house-fronts, yards, court-yards, gardens, and about stables, is prohibited. Where premises are provided with wells, special permits will be issued for the use of hose, in order that the police or inspectors of this department may understand that the permission is not for the use of Croton water.

Opening fire-hydrants to fill hand sprinklers or other vessels will not be allowed.

The penalty for a violation of any of the preceding rules and regulations will be five dollars for each offense, and if not paid when imposed will become a lien on the premises in like manner as all other charges for unpaid water rates.

NOTICE TO CROTON WATER CONSUMERS.

NUMEROUS APPLICATIONS HAVE BEEN made to this Department by citizens claiming reductions or rebates on bills for water supplied through meters, on the alleged ground of leakage caused by defective plumbing and worn-out service pipes, or by willful waste of water by tenants allowing the faucets to be turned on in full force in water-closets, sinks, etc., without the knowledge or consent of the owners of the premises.

The main object of the use of water-meters is to enable this Department to detect and check the useless and unwarrantable waste of an element so valuable and essential to the health and comfort of all the citizens, and this object can only be accomplished by enforcing payment for the water wasted.

Under the law all charges for water supplied through meters are a lien against the respective premises, and the law therefore holds the owner of the premises responsible for the amount of water used or wasted.

Notice is therefore given to all householders that, in all further applications for reduction of water rents, no allowance will be made on account of waste of water occurring through leaks from defective service pipes or plumbing, or wasteful use of water by tenants or occupants of buildings, though such leakage or waste may have occurred without the knowledge or consent of the owners of the buildings.

House-owners are further notified that whenever their premises become vacant, and are likely to remain vacant, they must notify this Department in writing, and that unless this requirement is complied with no deductions in extra water rents will be allowed for any portion of one year.
