5. Judge's charge at 175 words per minute for 5 minutes.

Candidates for Grade 4 must complete the Elimination Test at 160 words a minute and the Testimony at 175 words a minute. Candidates for Grade 5 must complete the Elimination Test at 175 words a minute and the Testimony at 200 words a minute. Each candidate must state on his application for which grade or grades he wishes to be examined.

Each candidate will be required to transcribe in the Transcription Test and to read back to the examiner in the Facility Test such portions of his stenographic notes as may be designated by the Examiner in Charge on the morning of the examination.

The Elimination Test and the Transcription Test may be copied on the typewriter or in handwriting. In the Facility Test each candidate will be required to read a portion of his notes to the examiner.

Candidates must furnish their own note books, pen, ink and typewriting machine (if desired). The Commission will not at any time or in any way be responsible for machines, nor will any allowance be made where machines are missing, late in arriving, defective or out of order on the day of the examination.
