From Route 684: Exit 2 to Route 120 North. Approximately ½ mile down the entrance is on the left.

From Katonah: Route 120 South for 1.3 miles from the Route 22 intersection. Loudon Cove is on the right.

From Harrison: Route 120 North past the airport. Proceed another ½ mile and the Cove is on the left.
