Commissioner's Column

Last week, our Bureau of Recycling and Sustainability's education and outreach efforts for 2014-2015 school year culminated in our annual [Golden Apple Awards](#). Schools across the five boroughs competed – conceiving of and completing hands-on projects to promote recycling, waste prevention, composting and neighborhood beautification. I joined Manhattan Borough President Gale Brewer to present PS 130 Hernando de Soto the award for *2015 Super Recyclers Citywide Winner in the Elementary Division*, along with a \$10,000 prize. Through our programs in schools, we are making waste reduction and recycling part of students' everyday lives.



As we strive to improve our own practices and to protect our environment, it's invaluable to share best practices with other cities and private sector partners. We all face the same challenges. Earlier this month, nearly 20 experts from all parts of the Department participated in a daylong series of

seminars for the Solid Waste Association of North America's New York State Chapter, giving an inside view of our expansive operations. By sharing our experiences with SWANA's broad membership, we can celebrate our agency's many accomplishments and help our public and private partners better understand our priorities and work together. And last week, I attended the Circular Economy 100 Annual Summit, where I met with public servants and corporate citizens from across the globe who are committed to changing the way we think about waste.

This week, the City takes another step toward being cleaner and greener, as the City's [ban on polystyrene foam products](#) goes into effect. Removing this troublesome product from the waste stream will reduce the amount of litter in our streets and waterways and help contribute to our goal of sending zero waste to landfills by 2030. Businesses have a six-month grace period to comply with the law, and we have partnered with other city agencies and industry groups to spread the word about the ban.

Thank you for all that you do to serve New York City.
