The vaccine mandate for NYC CERT membership is now in effect as of February 1, 2022.

If you are aware of any members having trouble sending in their vaccine information, please ask them to reach out to us by email. We will assist with any issues they are experiencing and work with the NYC Emergency Management Human Capital Bureau to resolve.

Starting next week, **only** members in compliance will continue receiving messaging from NYCEM CERT Program staff. Volunteers who did **not** submit appropriate documentation to meet the vaccine mandate, or request a reasonable accommodation through NYCEM, will be considered inactive until they submit the appropriate documentation.




After you participate, be sure to **Submit Your Volunteer Hours!**

Mayor Adams released a new color-coded system that tracks COVID-19 alerts and keeps New York City residents apprised of the risks they face in New York City. This new system will better help New Yorkers understand the current level

of COVID-19 risk and how they can best protect themselves and others. The system consists of four alert levels that outline precautions and recommended actions for individuals and government based on the Center for Disease Control and Prevention's (CDC) Community Burden Indicator.

NYC Emergency Management invites New York City high school students to participate in the inaugural HERricane NYC program, designed to encourage young women in grades 9 through 12 to pursue careers and leadership roles in emergency management. The program consists of a weeklong session from April 18, 2022 through April 22, 2022 that will be hosted at NYC Emergency Management's headquarters in Brooklyn. NYC Emergency Management intends to select up to 20 students to participate in the 2022 program.



As NYCEM's Human Capital Bureau continues to review submissions relating to the Vaccine Mandate, NYCEM will continue sharing updates including the NYC CERT Newsletter and requests with membership with the understanding there is approval needed prior to any in-person deployments and events.

As of Tuesday, February 1, 2022, volunteers who did not submit appropriate documentation to meet the vaccine mandate or request a reasonable accommodation through NYCEM are considered inactive until they are in compliance.


