Where the word "final" is shown after the name of the payee, payment will not be made until thirty days after the completion and acceptance of the work, but all of the other warrants mentioned will be forwarded through the mail unless some reason exists why payment is to be made in person, in which event written notice will be promptly given to the claimant.

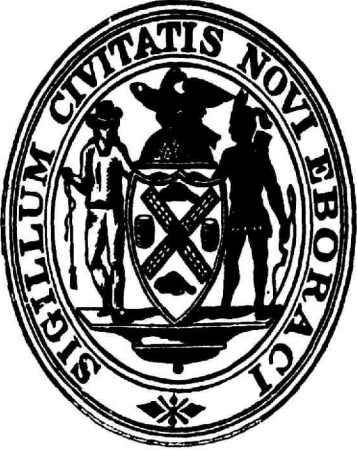

**AT A MEETING OF THE BOARD OF Health of the Department of Health held August 25, 1914, the following resolution was adopted:**

Resolved, That Section 66 of the Sanitary Code be and the same is hereby amended, to take effect immediately, so as to read as follows:

Section 66. No person shall sell at retail or give away any poison without affixing or causing to be affixed to the bottle, box, package, parcel or receptacle, containing such poison, a label upon which shall be printed in red ink, in plain legible characters, the name of the article, the word "Poison," the name and place of business of the seller, or donor, if the poison be given away, a skull and crossbones, the word "Caution," the maximum dose of the poison and the antidote therefor.

The provisions of this section shall not apply to medicinal compounds containing poisonous drugs in therapeutic doses when the maximum dose of such preparation is marked upon the container.

Where the amount of the purchase price does not equal or exceed the sum of \$50, the sum of \$50 shall be the amount of the security to be deposited. Each bid or estimate shall contain the name and place of residence of the person making the same, and names of all persons interested with him, thereon, and, if no other person be so interested, it shall distinctly state that fact; also, that it is made without any connection with any other person making an estimate for the same purpose, and is in all respects fair and without collusion or fraud, and that no member of the Board of Aldermen, head of a department, chief of a bureau, deputy thereof, or clerk therein, or other officer of The City of New York, is, shall be or become interested, directly or indirectly, as contracting party, partner, stockholder, surety or otherwise in or in the performance of the contract, or in the supplies, work or business to which it relates, or in any portion of the profits thereof. The bid or estimate must be verified by the oath, in writing, of the party or parties making the estimate that the several matters stated herein are in all respects true.
