NYC EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AND THE HEALTH DEPARTMENT ADVISE NEW YORKERS TO BEAT THE HEAT

Heat Advisory in effect for New York City at 11 a.m. Thursday, August 4 through 8 p.m. Friday, August 5

Cooling centers will be open. To find the nearest location, including hours of operation, call 311 or visit the <u>City's Cooling Center Finder</u>

Cooling Center Finder will be activated at 9 p.m. on Wednesday, August 3

August 3, 2022 — The New York City Emergency Management Department and the Health Department today advised New Yorkers to take precautions to beat the heat. The National Weather Service issued a Heat Advisory for New York City starting Thursday, August 4 at 11 a.m. until Friday, August 5 at 8 p.m. High heat and humidity are in the forecast for Thursday with heat index values in the mid 90s to low 100s across the city. Heat indices in the mid to upper 90s are also expected on Friday.

"Dangerous heat and high humidity are returning to New York City this week and we encourage New Yorkers to take precautions to avoid exposure to the extreme conditions," said **New York City Emergency Management Commissioner Zach Iscol**. "Remember to stay hydrated and if you are venturing outdoors, avoid strenuous activity, and wear lightweight clothing."

Declares Monkeypox a Public Health Emergency

New York City Mayor Eric Adams and New York City Department of Health and Mental Hygiene (DOHMH) Commissioner Dr. Ashwin Vasan declared a public health emergency due to the monkeypox outbreak.

New York City is currently the epicenter of the outbreak, and we estimate that approximately 150,000 New Yorkers may currently be at risk for monkeypox exposure. We will continue to work with our federal partners to secure more doses as soon as they become available.

HURRICANE IDA SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING PROGRAM

NYC Mayor's Office of Housing Recovery Operations

Were you impacted by Post Tropical Storm Ida? We may be able to help!

- If you own a 1-4 family home that was uninhabitable because of damage from Ida; and
- You applied for FEMA or were not eligible for FEMA assistance because you are a landlord; and
- Have either been denied or received less than the amount needed to complete repairs that would make the home habitable, then
- You may be eligible for assistance up to \$72,000* to cover the cost of the repairs to make the home habitable** and for mitigation measures to protect against future damage.

APPLICATION DEADLINE SEPTEMBER 12, 2022

*Subject to program policy guidelines.


**Program habitability is defined as having functioning heat, hot water, electricity, and gas (where applicable) with at least one running tap with potable water and one functioning toilet.


