Brooklyn Bridge.

A thorough inspection of the cables, suspenders, truss members, floor system, etc., has been completed, and the points requiring attention have been taken up and the work done in addition to the routine repairs.

The speed of trains has been carefully observed and the attention of the operating company was especially called to the violations of the Commissioner's orders not to exceed a speed of fifteen miles per hour, and in only a few instances has the speed been over the prescribed limits.

Routine work of inspecting repairs to roadways, sweeping and cleaning was continued without interruption during the quarter.

On June 24, 1912, night work was begun on the roadway planking in order to avoid delays to traffic, and about thirty per cent. more work has been accomplished at night on the laying of some of the roadway planking than would have been done during the day.

Plans and specifications for the Manhattan Terminal Subway Connection were approved by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment, and after the bids were received, the contract was awarded to the North Eastern Construction Company.

Studies were made of the proposed reconstruction of the Manhattan Terminal Building and special attention given to the layout of trolley loops and roadway traffic and clearances. Studies of the layout of repair shops and stores under the Brooklyn Approach were being rapidly pushed to completion by the Architect.

Williamsburg Bridge.

During the quarter the detailed account of progress on contracts at the Williamsburg Bridge is as follows:

Strengthening End Spans.

Manhattan—Surface cleaned off and pneumatic chambers sealed and the foundation completed of the northerly pneumatic caisson for panel point No. 20, on May 4, 1912. Working chamber sealed and southerly pneumatic caisson completed May 24, 1912. This completes the pneumatic caisson work on this contract.

Placing concrete for foundations and setting of granite for both piers under panel point No. 10 completed, and additional granite for piers under panel point 15 completed during the quarter. Masonry work on the Manhattan side is practically complete.

Brooklyn—Setting granite for northerly pier under panel point No. 20 completed and the masonry work on the Brooklyn side of the structure completed May 9, 1912, and the contractor removed the entire plant to the Manhattan side.

Steelwork—Contractor started erecting additional steel for strengthening of the trusses at the end span of the Brooklyn side of the structure and approximately 155 tons of steel work was added to the trusses on the Brooklyn side.

Manhattan Steelwork—Erection of steel work on the new tower under panel point 10 started on June 13 and continued with good progress until at present about eighty-five per cent. of the steel work on the towers is now completed in place. Approximately 1,610 tons of steel for the new towers have been delivered to the site, and about 670 tons erected in place on both sides of the structure.

Final arrangements were made with the operating companies to improve the bridge local service, and congestion on the plaza relieved owing to a new schedule.

Observations of electrical conditions on the structure, and especially in the subway station were made, and conditions, such as defective cross bonds, contact of running rail with structure, bare copper jumpers, etc., have been remedied.

The contract drawing for furnishing the steel required for strengthening the main span were completed and checked, and studies were made of the plan required for the erection of this steel.

All other maintenance requirements were met.

Queensboro Bridge.

Inspection platforms and ladders are being constructed at the top of each tower, to provide access to the tower shoes for inspection, cleaning and painting.

The work of painting the bridge is rapidly progressing.

Studies were made and estimate prepared for the construction of vehicular and passenger elevators connecting the roadway of the bridge with Blackwells Island.

Contract plans and specifications were prepared for the completion of the masonry attics on the main piers of the bridge.

Plans were prepared and parking of the layout under the bridge approaches completed.

Studies were made of the track layout at the Manhattan entrance of the bridge and on the Queensboro Plaza.

Manhattan Bridge.

Traffic over this bridge has been maintained without interruption. Final arrangements were completed with Engineers of the Fire Department for the installation of the armored telephone cable for that department, and cable was also purchased for a fire alarm signal for use by this Department on the Bridge. The same will be installed within a short time.

The roadway of the temporary approaches was widened.

The contract for installing the feeder cables on the westerly tracks of the upper arch was completed.

The progress of construction work on this bridge is as follows:

Westerly Subway and Bayard St. Retaining Wall—Retaining Wall: Completed setting granite and depositing concrete for backing; also waterproofing along the rear of the wall and laying of brick protection for same. Completed sidewalk along Bayard st., adjacent to the wall and the sidewalk on top of wall from stairway to the abutment. Westerly Subway: Completed both concrete retaining walls and the granite coping from existing subway walls to the abutment. Completed the track work from the Bowery, at Canal st., to abutment, and also ladders, cable racks, etc., in the splicing chamber. This entire contract was completed on June 10, 1912, and in accordance with the plans and specifications.

Electrical Feeder Cables—Completed the splicing, anchoring, straining and adjusting all cables on the westerly tracks of the structure. Completed the replacing of angles with anchor strain insulators, in accordance with extra order dated April 16, 1912.

The Department of Water Supply, Gas and Electricity made insulation test and inspected installation of cables, and pronounced them satisfactory. This contract was completed May 14, 1912.

Observations for movement, settlement, etc., on the towers and anchorages have been taken during the past quarter, but no perceptible change has been noted.

Contract drawings for the improvement of the Manhattan Plaza were completed and maps were prepared showing the necessary changes in the sewers, water pipes and pavements, and submitted to the several Bureaus having jurisdiction over the streets affected. Specifications for this work were completed and the checking of the contract drawings is progressing.

Municipal Building.

The superstructure of the building was advanced eight per cent. toward completion, to 91 per cent. complete.

The contract for the installation of the elevators was awarded by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment on May 24 to Robert Wetherill & Co., Inc., of Chester, Pa. The contract for the interior finish of the building was awarded to the lowest bidder, Thompson-Starrett Company.

On June 12 and 26, 1912, the Commissioner of the Sinking Fund allotted the space for the various Departments and offices to be located in this building.


