



## AQUEDUCT COMMISSION.

*Minutes of Stated Meeting of the Aqueduct Commissioners, held at their Office, No. 209 Stewart Building, on Wednesday, July 29, 1891, at 3 o'clock P. M.*

Present—Commissioners Duane, Tucker, Scott and Cannon.

In the absence of the Secretary, Auditor J. C. Lulley acted as Secretary pro tem.

The Construction or Executive Committee presented the following :

The Construction or Executive Committee report :

That at a meeting of said Committee, held on July 28, 1891, the following resolution was adopted, and they now ask your approval of their said action :

"Resolved, That the bid-box be closed, and the keys given to the President ; and that the Secretary pro tem., Auditor J. C. Lulley, be authorized by this Commission to receive the bids for constructing a highway, retaining-walls, appurtenances, etc., at Croton Dam, in the Town of Yorktown, Westchester County, New York, as called for in the approved forms of contract and specifications on file in the office of the Aqueduct Commissioners ; also to receive the checks of the bidders, and to make the necessary preparations for opening the bids received for doing said work under the law."

On motion of Commissioner Scott, said action was approved.

In pursuance to the following notice, published daily for fifteen consecutive days, commencing with July 11, 1891, in the CITY RECORD, New York "Tribune" and "Morning Advertiser," bids were received for constructing a highway, retaining-walls, appurtenances, etc., at Croton Dam, in the Town of Yorktown, Westchester County, New York :

Bids or proposals for constructing a highway, retaining-walls, appurtenances, etc., at Croton Dam, in the Town of Yorktown, Westchester County, New York, as called for in the approved forms of contract and specifications on file in the office of the Aqueduct Commissioners, will be received at this office until 3 o'clock P. M. on Wednesday, July 29, 1891, at which place and hour they will be publicly opened by the Aqueduct Commissioners, and the award for doing said work will be made by said Commissioners as soon thereafter as possible.

Blank forms of contract and specifications for doing said work, and bids or proposals, and proper envelopes for their inclosure, can be obtained at the above office of the Aqueduct Commissioners on application to the Secretary.

Whereupon, on motion of Commissioner Scott, the following preamble and resolution were adopted :

Whereas, Bids for constructing a highway, retaining-walls, appurtenances, etc., at Croton Dam, in the Town of Yorktown, Westchester County, New York, having been received and publicly opened and read ; therefore

Resolved, That the Chief Engineer is hereby directed to have said bids calculated and tabulated, and submit the same, together with his estimates of the work, at a meeting of the Construction or Executive Committee of the Aqueduct Commissioners, for consideration and canvassing by them at 3 o'clock P. M. on the 30th day of July, 1891, and the bids and checks of the bidders are hereby referred to the Committee of Finance and Audit for examination and report to the Commissioners as to their formality and the sufficiency of the sureties proposed by the bidders.

The Committee of Finance and Audit reported their examination and audit of bills contained in Vouchers Nos. 7168 to 7180, inclusive, amounting to \$329.62.

On motion of Commissioner Tucker, the same were approved and ordered certified to the Comptroller for payment.

The Construction or Executive Committee recommended the adoption of the following resolution :

Resolved, That the action of the Chief Engineer, in assigning Superintendent of Dam Construction George L. Tillotson to duty on this date, for work at Titicus Dam under Division Engineer Gowen, be and hereby is approved.

On motion of Commissioner Tucker, the same was adopted.

The Committee also presented the following :

The Construction or Executive Committee report :

That at a meeting of the Committee, held on July 28, 1891, the following preamble and resolution was adopted, and directed to be served upon the contractors therein named :

"Whereas, The contract for building Dams Nos. 1 and 2, on Bog brook, and adjacent tunnel in connection with the East Branch Reservoir, provides that 'if at any time the Engineer shall be of opinion, and shall so certify in writing to the said Aqueduct Commissioners, that the said work or any part thereof, is unnecessarily or unreasonably delayed, or that the said contractor is violating any of the conditions or covenants of this contract, or executing said contract in bad faith, or if the work to be done under this contract be not fully and entirely completed within the time herein stipulated for its completion, the said Aqueduct Commissioners shall have the power to notify the aforesaid contractor to discontinue all work, or any part thereof, under this contract ; and, thereupon the said contractor shall discontinue said work, or such part thereof as the said Aqueduct Commissioners may designate, and the said Aqueduct Commissioners shall thereupon have the power to place such and so many persons, and obtain by purchase or hire, such materials, animals, carts, wagons, implements and tools, by contract or otherwise, as said Aqueduct Commissioners deem necessary to complete the work herein described, or such part thereof, and to procure materials for the completion of the same, and to charge the expense of said labor and materials, animals, carts, wagons, implements and tools to the aforesaid contractor ; and the expense so charged shall be deducted and paid by the parties of the first part out of such moneys as either may be due or may at any time thereafter become due to the said contractor under and by virtue of this agreement, or any part thereof ;' and it appearing by a report submitted by the Chief Engineer to this Committee that the work of construction of said dams is being unnecessarily and unreasonably delayed, and this Committee being satisfied that such is the case ; therefore

"Resolved, That David R. Paige & Co., contractors for the construction of said dams, are hereby required to show cause, at a meeting of the Aqueduct Commissioners, to be held at the office of

said Commissioners on Thursday next, July 30, 1891, at 3 o'clock P. M., why the work of construction of said dams should not be discontinued and the further completion of said work done under the direction of the Aqueduct Commissioners, as provided in clause P of the contract for the construction of said dams."

The report was approved by the following vote :

Affirmative—Commissioners Duane, Tucker, Scott and Cannon—4.

The Committee also presented the following :

The Construction or Executive Committee report :

That at a meeting of the Committee, held on July 28, 1891, the following preamble and resolution was adopted, and directed to be served upon the contractor therein named :

"Whereas, The contract for the building of an earth and masonry dam for Reservoir 'D,' on the West Branch of Croton river, near Carmel, New York, provides that 'if at any time the Engineer shall be of opinion, and shall so certify in writing to the Aqueduct Commissioners, that the said work or any part thereof is unnecessarily or unreasonably delayed, or that the said contractor is violating any of the conditions or covenants of this contract, or executing said contract in bad faith, or if the work to be done under this contract be not fully and entirely completed within the time stipulated for its completion, the said Aqueduct Commissioners shall have the power to notify the aforesaid contractor to discontinue all work, or any part thereof, under this contract, by a written notice to be served on the contractor, either personally, or by leaving it at his residence, or with his agent in charge of the work ; and thereupon the said contractor shall discontinue said work, or such part thereof as said Aqueduct Commissioners may designate, and the said Aqueduct Commissioners shall thereupon have the power to place such and so many persons, and obtain by purchase or hire such materials, animals, carts, wagons, implements and tools, by contract or otherwise, as said Aqueduct Commissioners deem necessary to complete the work herein described, or such part thereof ; and to procure materials for the completion of the same, and to charge the expense of said labor and materials, animals, carts, wagons, implements and tools to the aforesaid contractor ; and the expense so charged shall be deducted and paid by the parties of the first part out of such moneys as either may be due or may at any time thereafter become due to the said contractor under and by virtue of this agreement, or any part thereof ;' and it appearing by a report submitted by the Chief Engineer to this Committee that the work of construction of said dam is being unnecessarily and unreasonably delayed, and this Committee being satisfied that such is the case ; therefore

"Whereas, The contract for building an auxiliary earth and masonry dam near Craft's Station, for Reservoir 'D,' Town of Carmel, Putnam County, New York, provides that 'if at any time the Engineer shall be of opinion, and shall so certify, in writing to the said Aqueduct Commissioners, that the said work or any part thereof is unnecessarily or unreasonably delayed, or that the said contractor is violating any of the conditions or covenants of this contract, or executing the same in bad faith, or if the work to be done under this contract be not fully and entirely completed within the time herein stipulated for its completion, the said Aqueduct Commissioners shall have the power to notify the aforesaid contractor to discontinue all work, or any part thereof, under this contract, by a written notice to be served on the contractor, either personally or by leaving it at his residence, or with his agent in charge of the work ; and thereupon the said contractor shall discontinue said work, or such part thereof as said Commissioners may designate, and the said Aqueduct Commissioners shall thereupon have the power to place such and so many persons, and obtain by purchase or hire such materials, animals, carts, wagons, implements and tools by contract or otherwise, as the said Aqueduct Commissioners deem necessary to complete the work herein described, or such part thereof, and to procure materials for the completion of the same, and to charge the expense of said labor and materials, animals, carts, wagons, implements and tools to the aforesaid contractor ; and the expense so charged shall be deducted and paid by the parties of the first part out of such moneys as either may be due or may at any time thereafter become due to the said contractor under and by virtue of this agreement or any part thereof ;' and it appearing by a report submitted by the Chief Engineer to this Committee that the work of construction of said dam is being unnecessarily and unreasonably delayed, and this Committee being satisfied that such is the case ; therefore

"Resolved, That Michael S. Coleman, contractor for the construction of said dam, is hereby required to show cause, at a meeting of the Aqueduct Commissioners, to be held at the office of said Commissioners on Thursday next, July 30, 1891, at 3 o'clock P. M., why the work of construction of said dam should not be discontinued and the further completion of said work done under the direction of the Aqueduct Commissioners, as provided in clause P of the contract for the construction of said dam."

The report was approved by the following vote :

Affirmative—Commissioners Duane, Tucker, Scott and Cannon—4.

The Committee also recommended the adoption of the following preambles and resolution :

Whereas, The contract for Section 16 of the New Aqueduct provides, among other things, as follows :

"The parties of the second part hereby agree that the said parties of the first part shall be and they hereby are authorized and empowered to retain out of the final installment of money which shall become due and payable to the said parties of the second part under this agreement, a sum equal to five per centum of the whole amount of money payable by the parties of the first part to the parties of the second part under and according to the terms of this contract, and to expend the same in the manner hereinafter provided for, in making such repairs to the gates, stop-cocks, pipes, branch pipes and special castings laid and set, and pavement and other work done under this contract, as the Aqueduct Commissioners may deem necessary.

"And it is further agreed, that if at any time during the performance of the work herein agreed to be performed, or during the period of one year from the date of the final completion and acceptance of the same, stop-cocks, pipes, branch pipes, or special castings or their connections, or the embankments, culverts, or mason work, or any of them, laid, set or constructed under this agreement, or the pavements and roadways, or other places which may have been disturbed in such laying, setting or construction, shall, in the opinion of said Aqueduct Commissioners, require to be recalked, reset, reconstructed, regraded or repaired, the said Aqueduct Commissioners shall notify the said parties of the second part, in writing, to make such repairs, and if the said parties of the second part shall neglect to commence the work of making such repairs and prosecute the same to the satisfaction of the Aqueduct Commissioners within twenty-four hours from the date of the service of such notice, then and in every such case the said Aqueduct Commissioners shall have the right to employ such other person or persons as they may deem proper to make the same, and to pay the expense thereof out of any money then due or which may thereafter become due to the said parties of the second part under this contract, or out of the said amount retained for that purpose by the said parties of the first part."

And Whereas, The Chief Engineer has reported that the following items of work still remain to be completed in and about said section :

1st. On Convent avenue—The retaining-walls require to be repointed in several places. The original pointing was done partly in cold weather. The contractors have still to remove some of their tools and wagons.

2d. On Manhattan avenue—At One Hundred and Twelfth street, about seventy feet of the west curbing has settled badly and should be reset.

3d. On Eighth avenue—A little north of One Hundred and Sixth street the contractors took up some curbing and paving to lay a track across the avenue. This place has never been restored to its original condition. It makes a bad hole in the street and should be repaired at once.

4th. On Eighth avenue—At One Hundredth street the repairs mentioned by the Commissioner of Public Works in his letter of June 15, 1891, should be made. The curbing and paving have settled in some places between One Hundredth and One Hundred and Sixth streets, and should be relaid.

At present there is about six inches of earth over the paving between One Hundredth and One Hundred and Sixth streets, which makes it difficult to inspect the paving. There are also some flags and stones between Ninety-seventh and One Hundred and Sixth streets, on Eighth avenue, which must be removed.

5th. In the Ninety-seventh Street Transverse Road there is still a lot of small stones which must be removed. The retaining-wall must be pointed where it has been shaken by blasting.

6th. On the west side of Eighth avenue, just north of Ninety-seventh street, there is a small piece of paving which must be relaid.

At One Hundred and Ninth street and Eighth avenue the contractors have also to replace some curbing and flagging, which they took up to lay their tracks across the avenue.

—which was concurred in by the Chief Engineer of the Croton Aqueduct; therefore

Resolved, That the said O'Brien & Clark, contractors for said Section 16 of the New Aqueduct, be and they are hereby notified to make such repairs forthwith, and that if the said repairs are not commenced within twenty-four hours after service upon them, or either of them, of this notice and diligently prosecuted thereafter, the Aqueduct Commissioners will proceed to cause said work to be done as provided for in said contract, and pay the expense thereof out of any moneys now due or which may hereafter become due to said contractors under said contract, or out of the moneys now retained for that purpose by the Mayor, Aldermen and Commonalty of the City of New York."

The same were adopted by the following vote:

Affirmative—Commissioners Duane, Tucker, Scott and Cannon—4.

On motion of Commissioner Scott, the Secretary was directed to notify Contractors O'Brien & Clark of the above action.

The Committee also presented the following communication, received from Edward Owen, Esq., Chief Clerk of the Commissioners of Accounts, inclosing two resolutions adopted by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment and a letter from the Mayor to the Commissioners of Accounts, and recommended that the same be spread in full on the minutes and filed:

Whereas, The Chief Engineer of the Aqueduct Commissioners having notified the Chief Engineer of the Croton Aqueduct, of the Department of Public Works, that the services of the employees of the Aqueduct Commissioners in charge of the maintenance would cease on June 30, 1891; and

Whereas, By section 41, chapter 490, Laws of 1883, the Aqueduct Commissioners are authorized to employ all necessary employees, subject to the approval of the Board of Estimate and Apportionment; therefore,

Resolved, That, with the view of this Board complying with the provision of the statute referred to, the said Aqueduct Commissioners are hereby requested to furnish forthwith to this Board a statement of all their employees, specifying the duties attended to or services performed by each such employee and the place where such duties are attended to or services are performed, and specifying the particular employees it is considered by the said Commissioners necessary to be continued in their employment after the care of the Aqueduct is transferred to the Department of Public Works.

The Committee also presented the following draft of a letter, together with a report of the Chief Engineer referred to therein, and recommended that the same be spread in full on the minutes, and that said letter be signed by the President and transmitted to the Commissioners of Accounts:

NEW YORK, July 29, 1891.

EDWARD OWEN, Esq., Chief Clerk, Commissioners of Accounts:

SIR—The Aqueduct Commission is in receipt of a communication from you, dated July 27, 1891, inclosing two resolutions of the Board of Estimate and Apportionment, and a letter from the Mayor to the Commissioners of Accounts, dated July 22, 1891; and I am instructed by the Aqueduct Commission to answer it as follows:

On the 8th day of July, 1891, the Aqueduct Commission transmitted to the Board of Estimate and Apportionment a report of the Secretary of the Commission containing a list of all the clerks, messengers and employees appointed pursuant to the provisions of section 41, chapter 490, Laws of 1883, that being the section referred to in the resolution of the Board of Estimate and Apportionment.

I now transmit to you a copy of a report of the Chief Engineer, made to the Committee on Construction, on July 7, 1891, containing a list of all the employees of the Commission outside of those included in the Secretary's report, above referred to, and containing also a statement of the duties attended to or services performed by each, and the place where such duties are attended to or services are performed, and the salary or compensation paid to each.

Since this report was made the following changes have been made in the Engineer Corps, which should be noted:

George S. Rice, Deputy Chief Engineer, has resigned, and the position held by him has been abolished.

R. A. Reinisch, Rodman, employed at Titicus Dam, under Division Engineer Gowen, has resigned.

The services of F. M. Bowers, Typewriter, attached to the Yonkers office, were dispensed with on July 15, 1891, her employment having been only temporary.

Gerald McMurray, Superintendent of Dam Construction, has been assigned to duty under Division Engineer Craven at the Carmel Dam, and George L. Tillotson, Superintendent of Dam Construction, has been assigned to duty at Titicus Dam.

With these corrections and alterations this report contains an accurate statement of all the persons employed in the engineer force, and together with the report of the Secretary, above referred to, and of which a copy is transmitted to you, contains a list of all the employees of the Aqueduct Commission.

I am further instructed by the Aqueduct Commission to say to the Commissioners of Accounts, through you, that all the books and records of the Commission are at all times open to the examination and inspection of the Commissioners of Accounts.

Prior to the appointment of your immediate predecessors it was the unvarying custom of the Commissioners of Accounts to make frequent and exhaustive examinations of all the books, accounts and records of the Aqueduct Commission, a practice which, to the regret of the Commission, has been discontinued since the date of the appointment of your predecessors in office.

While, so far as we are aware, no irregularities were ever discovered by the Commissioners of Accounts, yet it was a source of satisfaction to the Aqueduct Commissioners and to the employees at the head of the office to have the work of the Commission examined and checked by the expert accountants employed by the Commissioners of Accounts, and it has been with much regret that the Aqueduct Commission have seen the practice discontinued during the past two years.

I am further instructed by the Aqueduct Commission to say that there has never been at any time any difficulty in the way of any person who sought to know the exact number, rate of compensation and duties of the several employees of the Aqueduct Commission. Detailed statements have been frequently printed in the minutes of the Commission and in the CITY RECORD. Numerous reports have been made to the Board and to the Committee on Construction by the Chief Engineer and the Secretary, all of which have been accessible at any time to any person having the curiosity to inspect them, and the very reports of which copies are herewith transmitted to you have lain before the Committee on Construction since the 7th of July; and either of the two members of the Board of Estimate and Apportionment, who are also members of the Aqueduct Commission, could have obtained the information now transmitted to you for the mere asking.

I would also beg to call your attention to the fact that the monthly and weekly pay-rolls of the Aqueduct Commission are regularly filed in the office of the Comptroller, and must, of necessity,

come under the eyes of the Commissioners of Accounts when they make the stated examinations of the Comptroller's Office required by the act under which they were appointed.



The 866 deaths represent a death-rate of 26.81, against 29.34 for the previous week and 28.93 for the corresponding week of 1890.

Contagious diseases continue to decrease, with the exception of diphtheria, the number of cases reported of diphtheria, measles and scarlet fever being respectively 82, 133 and 104, against 58, 165 and 117 for the previous week. Diphtheria increased pretty generally, the only marked decrease being between Rivington and Fourteenth streets, Third avenue and Avenue B, and between Twenty-sixth and Fortieth streets, East and West. Scarlet fever increased below Rivington street, east of the Bowery, and above Fortieth street, West, and Eighty-sixth street, East, decreasing, as a rule, elsewhere. Measles generally decreased, but there was a slight increase between Rivington and Fourteenth streets, Third avenue and Avenue B, between Canal and Houston streets, the Bowery and Broadway, between Fourteenth and Twenty-sixth streets, West, Fortieth and Eighty-sixth streets, East, and in the annexed district. Typhoid fever decreased about 25 per cent., the localities of greatest prevalence being south of Division street and above Fortieth street, East and West.

## TO OWNERS OF LANDS ORIGINALLY ACQUIRED BY WATER GRANTS.

ATTENTION IS CALLED TO THE RESOLUTION of the Legislature (chapter 449, Laws of 1889), which provides that whenever any streets or avenues in the city, described in any grant of land under water, from the Mayor, Aldermen and Commonalty containing covenants requiring the grantees and their successors to pave, repave, keep in repair or maintain such streets, shall be in need of repairs, pavement or repavement, the Common Council may, by ordinance, require the same to be paved, repaved or repaired, and the expense thereof to be assessed on the property benefited; and whenever the owner of a lot so assessed shall have paid the assessment levied for such paving, repaving or repairing, such payment shall release and discharge such owner from any and every covenant and obligation as to paving, repaving and repairing, contained in the water grant under which the premises are held, and no further assessment shall be imposed on such lot for paving, repaving or repairing such street or avenue, unless it shall be petitioned for by a majority of the owners of the property (who shall also be the owners of a majority of the property in frontage) on the line of the proposed improvement.

The act further provides that the owner of any such lot may notify the Commissioner of Public Works, in writing, specifying the ward number and street number, of the lot that he desires, for himself, his heirs and assigns, to be released from the obligation of such covenants and elects and agrees that said lot shall be thereafter liable to be assessed as above provided, and thereupon the owner of such lot, his heirs and assigns shall thenceforth be relieved from any obligation to pave, repair, uphold or maintain said street, and the lot in respect of which such notice was given shall be liable to assessment accordingly.

The Commissioner of Public Works desires to give the following explanation of the operation of this act: When notice, as above described, is given to the Commissioner of Public Works, the owner of the lot or lots therein described, and his heirs and assigns, are forever released from all obligation under the grant in respect to paving, repaving or repairing the street in front of or adjacent to said lot or lots, except one assessment for such paving, repaving or repairs, as the Common Council may, by ordinance direct to be made thereafter.

No street or avenue within the limits of such grants can be paved, repaved or repaired until said work is authorized by ordinance of the Common Council, and when the owners of such lots desire their streets to be

paved, repaved or repaired, they should state their desire and make their application to the Board of Aldermen and not to the Commissioner of Public Works, who has no authority in the matter until directed by ordinance of the Common Council to proceed with the pavement, repavement or repairs.

Those entitled to exemption are: Clergymen, lawyers, physicians, surgeons, surgeon-dentists, professors or teachers in a college, academy or public school, editors, editorial writers or reporters of daily newspapers, licensed pharmacists or druggists, actually engaged in their respective professions and not following any other calling; militiamen, policemen, and firemen; election officers, jury non-residents, and city employees, and United States employees; officers of vessels making regular trips; licensed pilots, actually following that calling; superintendents, conductors and engineers of a railroad company other than a street railroad company; telegraph operators actually doing duty as such; Grand, Sheriff's, and Civil Court jurors; stationary engineers; and persons physically incapable of performing jury duty by reason of severe sickness, deafness, or other physical disorder.

Those who have not answered as to their liability, or proved permanent exemption, will receive a "jury enrollment notice," requiring them to appear before me this year. Whether liable or not, such notices must be answered (in person, if possible), and at this office only, under severe penalties. If exempt, the party must bring proof of exemption; if liable, he must also answer in person, giving full and correct name, residence, etc. No attention paid to letters.

All good citizens will aid the course of justice, and secure reliable and respectable juries, and equalize their duty by serving promptly when summoned, allowing their clerks or subordinates to serve, reporting to me any attempt at bribery or evasion, and suggesting names for enrollment. Persons between sixty and seventy years of age, summer absentees, persons temporarily ill, and United States jurors, are not exempt.

Every man must attend to his own notice. It is a misdemeanor to give any jury paper to another to answer. It is also punishable by fine or imprisonment to give or receive any present or bribe, directly or indirectly, in relation to a jury service, or to withhold any paper or make any false statement and every case will be fully prosecuted.

Third—That the limits of our assessment for benefit include all those lots, pieces or parcels of land, situate, lying and being in the City of New York, which taken together are bounded and described as follows, viz.: Beginning at the point of intersection of the centre line of the blocks between Boston road and Franklin avenue with the prolongation westerly of the centre line of the blocks between Home street and East One Hundred and Sixty-eighth street; thence easterly along said centre line prolonged of the blocks between Home street and East One Hundred and Sixty-eighth street to its intersection with the centre line of the blocks between Forrest and Tinton avenues; thence southerly along said centre line of the blocks between Forrest and Tinton avenues to the northerly side of Westchester avenue; thence southwesterly along said northerly side of Westchester avenue to its intersection with the prolongation northerly of the centre line of the blocks between Robbins and Concord avenues; thence southerly along said centre line prolonged of the blocks between Robbins and Concord avenues to the northerly side of East One Hundred and Forty-ninth street; thence westerly along said northerly side of East One Hundred and Forty-ninth street to its intersection with a line drawn parallel to Eagle avenue and about ninety feet distant from the westerly side thereof; thence northerly along the last mentioned line to the point of intersection of the northerly side of Westchester avenue with the centre line of the blocks between Eagle and St. Ann's avenues; thence northerly along said centre line of the blocks between Eagle avenue and St. Ann's and Third avenues to its point of intersection with the centre line of the block between Teasdale Place and East One Hundred and Sixty-third street; thence easterly along the last mentioned centre line to its point of intersection with a line drawn parallel to Cauldwell avenue and distant about two hundred and forty feet from the westerly side thereof; thence northerly along the last mentioned line to its point of intersection with the centre line of the blocks between Boston road and Franklin avenue; thence northeasterly along the said centre line between Boston road and Franklin avenue to the point or place of beginning; excepting from said area all the streets, avenues and roads, or portions thereof, heretofore legally opened, and all the unimproved land included within the lines of streets, avenues, roads, public squares and places shown and laid out upon any map or maps filed by the Commissioners of the Department of Public Parks, pursuant to the provisions of chapter 604 of the Laws of 1874, and the laws amendatory thereof, or of chapter 410 of the Laws of 1882, as such area is shown upon our benefit map deposited as aforesaid.

Fourth—That our report herein will be presented to the Supreme Court of the State of New York, at a Special Term thereof, to be held at the Chambers thereof, in the County Court-house, in the City of New York, on the 26th day of August, 1891, at the opening of the Court on that day, and that then and there, or as soon thereafter as counsel can be heard thereon, a motion will be made that the said report be confirmed.
