# AQUEDUCT COMMISSION.

Minutes of Stated Meeting of the Aqueduct Commissioners, held at their Office, No. 209 Stewart Building, on Wednesday, October 7, 1891, at 3 o'clock P. M.

Present—Commissioners Duane, Tucker, Scott and Cannon.
The Committee of Finance and Audit reported their examination and audit of Voucher No. 7314, being final estimate for Section 16 of the New Aqueduct, amounting to \$50,661.03; also of bills contained in Vouchers Nos. 7315 to 7329, inclusive, amounting to \$1,166.67.
On motion of Commissioner Tucker, the same were approved and ordered certified to the

Comptrol.er for payment.

The Construction or Executive Committee presented the following communication, received from the Chief Engineer, and recommended that the same be spread in full on the minutes and filed:

To the Honorable the Committee on Construction:

NEW YORK, October 6, 1891.

GENTLEMEN—From the 29th ultimo, the date of my last report, the flow of water from Sodom Dam was continued at the rate of fifty million gallons per twenty four hours until 8.30 A. M. on October 1, when, at the request of Chief Engineer Birdsall of the Croton Aqueduct, the flow was decreased to thirty million gallons per twenty-four hours, which is the present rate of flow. water is now 34.31 feet lower than it was when the gates were opened for the first time. NEW YORK, October 6, 1891

To the Honorable the Committee on Construction:

Gentlemen—The work of improving and grading the grounds around the various shaft sites will soon commence, and it will be necessary for the Engineer in charge of that work to have a proper vehicle for the proper supervision of the same, as our present carriages are too heavy for that service. I understand that a suitable buggy can be purchased for the sum of \$100, and I hereby recommend that an appropriation for that amount between the same.

GENTLEMEN-The accompanying communication received from Messrs. David R. Paige & Co., contractors, asking for an advance of \$5,000 on the percentage retained for work done under their contract for the Bog Brook Dams, has been referred to me by the President of the Aqueduct Com-

You are well aware of the efforts of your Engineer to press this work; the importance of the completion of the dams to water-line is second only to that of completing Sodom Dam last spring. This statement is in my opinion the strongest recommendation that I can make to you to grant the request of Messrs. David R. Paige & Co., if you can do so consistently.

The amount now retained on this work is \$26,158.57, and considering the work remaining to be done, I do not see that the interests of the city can suffer from the action herein recommended.

GENTLEMEN—In relation to the enclosed communication and report of the Board of Health forwarded to your Board and referred to me for report, I hereby respectfully report as follows:

The section referred to consists partially of marsh land and rises not more than ten (10) feet

above high-water datum. From time to time during the past several years the Board of Health have examined and reported that the locality is malarious, but on account of the street plan not being definitely settled upon, the Board of Public Parks took no action in the premises. This Board intiated proceedings for opening Albany road, from Bailey avenue to Van Courtlandt Park, March 21, 1891, and rule maps have been forwarded to the Corporation Counsel.

Macombs street runs from Broadway to Bailey avenue, a distance of six hundred and eighty-four and two-tenths feet, and is a street of the first class.

I recommend that proceedings be taken for opening Macombs street, from Broadway to Bailey avenue, and request the adoption of the accompanying resolution.

The act turther provides that the owner of any such tot may notify the Commissioner of Public Works, in writing, specifying the ward number and street number of the lot that he desires, for himself, his heirs and assigns, to be released from the obligation of such covenants and elects and agrees that said lot shall be thereafter liable to be assessed as above provided, and thereupon the owner of such lot, his heirs and assigns shall thenceforth be relieved from any obligation to pave, repair, uphold or maintain said street, and the lot in respect of which such notice was given shall be liable to assessment accordingly.

The Commissioner of Public Works desires to give he following explanation of the operation of this act:

When notice, as above described, is given to the Commissioner of Public Works, the owner of the lot or lots therein described, and his heirs and assigns, are forever released from all obligation under the grant in respect to paving, 100 and or repairing the street in tront of or adjacent to said lot or lots, except one assessment for such paving, repaving or repairs, as the Common Council may, by ordinance direct to be made thereafter.
