
December 2024 After Action Review



2024 was a year of significant growth and achievement for the NYC CERT program. We witnessed exceptional volunteer engagement across all program activities, from regular training exercises and drills to real-world emergency deployments.

Notably, the program implemented a system for tracking volunteer hours by both mentors and mentees, providing valuable data for program evaluation and improvement. This year demonstrated high levels of volunteer engagement, with strong participation in exercises, drills, and emergency deployments. A significant highlight was the program's successful support of the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) during a flash flood event, contributing to the local catch basin clearing initiative as part of the activated flash flood plan. The successes of 2024 provide a strong foundation for continued growth and impact in the coming year. We are committed to building upon these achievements and further strengthening the NYC CERT's position as a vital resource for community preparedness and resilience.



What is the NYC CERT Uniform?

We are a Team! To ensure we all represent NYC Emergency Management with professionalism, this message serves as a friendly reminder about our uniform policy.

- Event organizer submits an official request using the <u>NYC CERT External</u> Request Form.
- NYC CERT Leadership should not submit form on behalf of the event organizer.
- For events lead by a NYC CERT
 Division, volunteer leadership (Ready
 New York Liaison, if a preparedness
 event) should submit this <u>Event</u>
 Request form.

NYC CERT program staff will review all requests. If approved, program staff will add the volunteer opportunity to the NYC CERT Event Calendar with a registration link. If more details are required for approval, program staff will use the contact information provided in the request form to connect with the organizer.

CERT Volunteer Support

Whether it's a preparedness event or an emergency response, being in proper uniform allows us to be easily identified by the public and first responders. It signifies our commitment to safety and fosters a sense of unity.

Here's a quick rundown of the NYC CERT uniform:

- Green NYC CERT polo shirt (mandatory)
- Khaki pants (mandatory)
- NYC CERT reflective vest (always most visible outer layer)
- NYC CERT credential on lanyard, visible at all times (mandatory)
- Optional items: NYC CERT baseball hat, windbreaker, green helmet (for emergency responses), green CERT response bag (for emergency responses), NYC CERT branded sweaters/jackets (produced with NYCEM approval)


