### **Beat the Heat**



Extreme heat is one of the most significant hazards facing New York City. On average, 350 New Yorkers die each year because of heat.

In New York City, most heat-related deaths occur after exposure to heat in homes without air conditioners. You can stay safe during hot weather by spending time in an air-conditioned space - a few hours of relief can reduce your risk of heat illness. If you don't have an air conditioner, you can apply for a free air conditioner through the Home Emergency Assistance Program (HEAP) by calling 311 (212-639-9675 for Video Relay Services, or TTY: 212-504-4115) or visiting:

### **Indoor Safety Tips**

When the Indoor Temperature in Your Home is in the 80°s Fahrenheit People with pre-existing health conditions such as mental illness, heart conditions, and diabetes can be more vulnerable to heat. Speak with your doctor about your risk to heat. On hot days:

- Close your shades or curtains to keep the sun from heating your home more during the day.
- Limit use of the stove and oven-it will make you and your home hotter.
- Taking a cool (but not freezing) shower or bath can help cool you down.

### Heat Preparedness Canvassing Updates!

Local CERT divisions have been canvassing door-to-door in specific areas, chosen to account for Naturally Occurring Retirement Communities (NORCs) that fall within the heat vulnerability index. CERT volunteers are distributing Beat the Heat flyers, cooling towels and digital thermometers to residential homeowners and businesses. 



### **Prepare for Hurricanes and Summer Storms**



For many, warm weather means enjoying the outdoors with picnics, swimming and gardening. But summer isn't always a day at the beach. As temperatures increase, so do the chances for thunderstorms and hurricanes.

Although hurricane season began in May, late summer and early fall are when we typically experience the most hurricanes as ocean waters warm. Remember, hurricanes are not just a coastal problem, so it's important to know the risks where you live since rain, wind and flooding could happen far from the coast. No matter where you live, thunderstorms can also be a threat. Lightning injures 243 people and kills about 20 people on average each year in the United States (see <u>Weather.gov</u> for more information). Heavy rain from thunderstorms can lead to flash floods and power outages. In addition, tornadoes can form during some thunderstorms.

Below are some helpful links to help you better prepare:

- Download the free <u>FEMA app</u> to receive real-time alerts.
- <u>National Weather Service</u> to stay informed about watches and warnings.
- You can also sign up to receive <u>Emergency Alerts</u> in your area.
- Get started on your emergency plan by <u>having enough</u> <u>supplies</u> for your household, including medication, disinfectants and <u>pet supplies</u>.
- Know your risk for <u>hurricanes</u> and take action to prepare by visiting FEMA's <u>Protective Actions Research website</u>.
- <u>Be prepared for thunderstorm, lightning and hail</u>

### **Notify NYC Mailing**



Next week, all New Yorkers are expected to begin receiving a physical, fold-out Notify NYC publication in the mail to promote the importance having access to New York City's official source for information about emergency alerts and important city services. Anyone can sign up to receive text, email, or push notification using the mobile app to stay informed of emergency alerts in their area. 


# **DIVISION MEETINGS**

## **THINGS TO KNOW**



### How To Request NYC CERT

If approached to support an event in your community, the following steps must be taken:

- Event organizer submits an official request using the <u>NYC CERT External Request Form</u>.
- NYC CERT Leadership *should not* submit form on behalf of the event organizer.
- For events lead by a NYC CERT Division, volunteer leadership (Ready New York Liaison, if a preparedness event) should submit this <u>Event</u> <u>Request form</u>.

NYC CERT program staff will review all requests. If approved, program staff will add the volunteer opportunity to the <u>NYC CERT Event</u>

<u>Calendar</u> with a registration link. If more details are required for approval, program staff will use the contact information provided in the request form to connect with the organizer.




