

September is National Preparedness Month

National Preparedness Month serves as a reminder to take action to prepare, now and throughout the year, for the types of emergencies that could affect us where we live, work, learn, and worship. With all of the challenges New Yorkers have faced, the 2022 theme of National Preparedness Month is: "A Lasting Legacy." NYC Emergency Management and its partner hosts inperson and virtual preparedness events throughout the month for New Yorkers, their communities, and their businesses. Here are some steps for you, your family, and your community to prepare for emergencies:

Week 1: Make A Plan - Talk to your friends and family about how to communicate before, during and after emergencies. Utilize the Ready NY My Emergency Plan Guide: NYC.gov/mycenergencyplan

Week 2: Pack A Go Bag- Gather Supplies that will last you for a few days after a disaster, everyone in your household, including your pets should have a Go Bag.

Week 3: Prepare for Coastal Storms and Floods- Make sure you know your ZONE. Use the <u>Hurricane Evacuation Zone Finder</u> or call 311. Have the right Flood Insurance to protect your home. Visit <u>Floodhelpny.org</u> and <u>www.floodsmart.gov</u> for more information about the National Flood Insurance Program.

Week 4: Teach and Talk to Children About Preparedness- Teach them about natural hazards like hurricanes, coastal storms and floods, and what to do when they occur. Prepare an emergency kit/Go Bag together. Make sure they know what to do at school if an emergency happens. Click here for more information.

HURRICANE IDA SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING PROGRAM

NYC Mayor's Office of Housing Recovery Operations

Were you impacted by Post Tropical Storm Ida? We may be able to help!

- If you own a 1-4 family home that was uninhabitable because of damage from Ida; and
- You applied for FEMA or were not eligible for FEMA assistance because you are a landlord; and
- Have either been denied or received less than the amount needed to complete repairs that would make the home habitable, then
- You may be eligible for assistance up to \$72,000* to cover the cost of the repairs to make the home habitable** and for mitigation measures to protect against future damage.

APPLICATION DEADLINE SEPTEMBER 12, 2022

*Subject to program policy guidelines.

**Program habitability is defined as having functioning heat, hot water, electricity, and gas (where applicable) with at least one running tap with potable water and one functioning toilet.

My Emergency Backpack Is Ready... I'm Stress Free!

Tuesday August 30, 2022 from 4:30 pm - 5:45 pm ET

Please join the Region 2 National Preparedness Division in partnership with Americares for a webinar discussing strategies for children and young people to prepare for disasters.

Disasters can produce different types of emotional reactions in children and adolescents such as stress, anxiety, fear, insecurity, feelings of loss, frustration, anger, intolerance and trauma which could affect their self-esteem and normal development. This workshop offers strategies (such as the emergency backpack) so that children and young people can know how to prepare for a disaster and thus avoid anxiety at the time of the event. It also teaches them to recognize how they react to stress in disaster events and how to properly cope with these events.
