To the Honorable the Board of Estimate and Apportionment:

GENTLEMEN—In answer to Circular No. 24, bearing date July 28, 1876, addressed to me by Hon. Andrew H. Green, Comptroller, etc., I have the honor to transmit the following Statement or Estimate of the amount of Expenditures of the Surrogate's Office of this county, necessary for the payment of the expenses and salaries of the officers, clerks, employees, and subordinates, for the next ensuing financial year, as follows:

I beg leave to call attention of the Board to the fact, that the above estimate is less by ten thousand dollars than that presented by my predecessor last year, and also to the various salaries of the clerks and employees, the larger proportion of whom are required to be experienced and skilled attorneys, in order to secure the safe and efficient administration of this office, and it will be observed, that the salaries estimated are, in most instances, less by one half than the same attorneys would be able to realize from a moderately respectable practice.

This estimate is made for the current necessities of the office for the ensuing year, and takes no account of the deficient appropriation of last year, or the large accumulation of unfinished business under my predecessors, as to which I had the honor to present a memorial to your Honorable Body on the 23d instant, to which I beg leave again to call your attention.

The above estimate has not been exaggerated to provide against possible deduction, but with the firm conviction that the sum mentioned will be indispensable to a successful and economical administration of this office.

The President laid before the Board the following communication from the Public Administrator:

LAW DEPARTMENT OF THE CITY OF NEW YORK,  
BUREAU OF THE PUBLIC ADMINISTRATOR,  
November 20, 1876.

To the Board of Estimate and Apportionment in the City of New York:

I beg to call your attention to that portion of your "Provisional Estimate," for expenses for the year 1877, which relates to this bureau.

1. The salary of the Public Administrator is, at present, fixed by law, at \$5,000 per annum. In my opinion, the labor, the responsibilities of the office, and the constant liability of the incumbent to suits, render the present salary no more than is proper and reasonably economical.

No perquisites of any kind are allowed in the office.

2. The other reductions proposed as to clerk hire should not be made.

The present salaries are at the reduced rates adopted not long ago, and are not excessive.

The "first clerk," who also acts as proctor for the estates in the Surrogate's Court, must be a competent lawyer.

His present salary is only \$1,800 per annum (it was formerly \$3,000), and the further reduction proposed by you will leave the salary inadequate.

3. The "second clerk," he being bookkeeper and cashier, and having onerous duties, now receives \$1,200 per annum (formerly it was \$2,500).

You now propose to further reduce these salaries \$1,000.

In my opinion these salaries are only fair rates now, and it will be unwise economy to further reduce them.

You cut off all allowance for "Contingencies."

The \$1,200 asked for are necessary. Without such provision it is not possible for the Administrator to collect and care for the personal effects of deceased persons whose estates come under his control.

I therefore request that, in the revised and final estimate, you make provision for this bureau at the present rate of salaries, and allow for contingencies as follows:

For Public Administrator—Salary.....	\$5,000 00
For First Clerk.....	18,000 00
For Second Clerk.....	12,000 00
For Contingencies.....	12,000 00
