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**THE CITY OF NEW YORK AND MAYOR'S FUND TO ADVANCE NEW YORK CITY COLLECT
NEARLY \$80,000 FOR RELIEF EFFORT TO SUPPORT VICTIMS OF EARTHQUAKE IN NEPAL**

NEW YORK— The Mayor's Fund to Advance New York City, in partnership with the Mayor's Office of Immigrant Affairs, the Mayor's Office for International Affairs, and the Community Affairs Unit, today announced that the New York City Nepal Relief Effort has collected approximately \$78,800 for victims of the tragic earthquake that struck the country and surrounding area on April 25.

The collected funds will be divided evenly between New York City-based Nepali community nonprofit organizations [Adhikaar](#) and [The Gurung Society](#). Funds will be directed to areas of greatest need, such as securing food, clean water, shelter, and sanitation services for the millions of people who were injured, displaced or otherwise affected by the earthquake. The Mayor's Fund received \$50,000 in initial support for the New York City Nepal Relief Effort from the Association for a Better New York and the Rudin Family Foundations. Contributions from City employees accounted for over \$13,000 of the total collected donations.

"New York City is home to the largest Nepalese community in the United States, so this tragedy hit very close to home for many New Yorkers. As millions in Nepal and Tibet struggle to put their lives back together after such a devastating and unexpected tragedy, I am proud that the people of this city were able to step up and lend a hand in the rebuilding effort," said **Mayor de Blasio**.

"New Yorkers never fail to astound me with their charitable spirit, and these donations are yet another reminder of their boundless sensitivity," said **First Lady Chirlane McCray, Chair of the Mayor's Fund to Advance New York City**. "I hope the funds raised by the Mayor's Fund will provide some relief to these families as they work through a trying recovery process."

"New Yorkers have once again stepped up to the plate to show compassion for others who are in need," said **Speaker Melissa Mark-Viverito**. "Thanks to the generosity of residents across the five boroughs, additional shelter, food and medical supplies will be available to those impacted by the earthquake in Nepal. I applaud all New Yorkers who contributed to this effort by supporting the New York City Nepal Relief Effort."

"This outpouring of generosity by New Yorkers to support Nepal in its time of need underscores yet again the tremendous value in our City's local-to-global connections," said **Commissioner Penny Abeywardena, Mayor's Office for International Affairs**.

"It is truly wonderful to see the outpouring of support and the leadership of Adhikaar, The Gurung Society and other community organizations in ensuring that all of those affected and in need of humanitarian aid will receive this much needed relief."
