NYC EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT'S LATEST 'PREP TALK' PODCAST DISCUSSES HOW THE DEPARTMENT OF SANITATION PREPARES FOR WINTER WEATHER

On this episode of "Prep Talk" Christian Hourihan, assistant chief at the Department of Sanitation, also known as the "Snow Chief" discusses how the agency prepares for snowstorms, the challenges of garbage removal during snowstorms, the process of clearing streets of snow and debris, and snow removal safety tips. Point-to-Point Radio Training







Monthly Meetings




Queens Division 1


