OFFICE OF LIGHT HOUSE INSPECTOR, THIRD DISTRICT,
TOMPKINSVILLE, N. Y., March 31, 1879.

GENERAL—On Saturday, Mr. Hughson, of the Street Cleaning Bureau, called at this office to obtain information in regard to Buoy No. 16, off Coney Island. In reply to a remark of mine, he stated that you would be glad to get information in relation to the dumping of garbage in the lower bay.

I have to-day sent to you Lieutenant Field, U. S. N., one of my assistants, and such information as you may ask him to furnish will be sent to you.

Mr. Hughson was furnished with a description of the buoy, its bearings by compass, its position by angles, and the latitude and longitude in approximate figures.

The angles given referred to the buoy when it was a little out of place; the following are the correct figures:

Fort Lafayette and Fort Richmond, 15 degrees 30 minutes.
Fort Richmond and Elm Tree Light-house, 56 degrees 30 minutes.
Fort Lafayette and Elm Tree Light-house, 72 degrees.
