Dr. S. T. Armstrong, the General Medical Superintendent, reported as follows:

During the four weeks from August 5 to September 1, inclusive, 159 operations were performed at Bellevue Hospital, 27 at Gouverneur Hospital, 23 at Harlem Hospital, and 21 at Fordham Hospital, at all of which the Attending Surgeons or their

Assistants were present:

Assistants were present:

Rule II, providing that the House Physicians and Surgeons visit every patient in their wards at least once each morning, is interpreted by the Medical Board to mean that they are to be in the wards at 9 o'clock. It is recommended that your Board prescribe that in all the hospitals of the Department the house staff on duty in the wards be there at 9 o'clock each morning and see each patient in the wards. There has been some difficulty in having the general work of the hospital connected with the house staff started early enough. For example, it has been found that at Bellevue the house staff may be at breakfast from 8 until 9 o'clock, at Gouverneur from 7.15 until 9 o'clock, at Harlem until 9 o'clock, and at Fordham from 7.30 until 9 o'clock, An old rule of the Department, under former administration, was that breakfast was to be served at 8 o'clock, and it is recommended that the time for breakfast be fixed from 8 until 8.45. This will enable the house staff to get breakfast, make the necessary record in the house staff book, sign the necessary Coroner's blanks (which that office complains are delayed by the late attendance of the house staff), and attend to other necessary administrative business. Several hospitals prescribe the breakfast hours: Presbyterian, from 8 to 8.30; Mount Sinai, ward visits must be commenced between 8 and 9 a. m., so that breakfast must be even earliar in that institution.

It has been the custom of this Department to send in envelopes notices of transfer of patients and of death of patients. This considerably increases the cost of stationery and of postage. It is recommended that postal cards, which could be printed and would reduce the amount of clerical work and effect a material saving in stationery,

If an Attending Physician or Surgeon be temporarly prevented from performing his duties during his term of service, he shall procure as a substitute to attend in his stead one of the Assistant Attending Physicians or Surgeons respectively attached to his own division. If such temporary absence exceed three days, the approval of the President of the Board of Trustees must be obtained in writing and reported to the Board of Trustees at its next meeting.

All bills shall be accompanied by a copy of the order and shall be certified by the person receiving the goods and by his superiors in order, including the General Medical Superintendent. They then shall be referred to the Auditing Committee, and, when audited, reported to the Board and then forwarded by the President of the Board to the Comptroller for payment. Payments on contracts or expenditures of money in any form shall be certified by the General Medical Superintendent and then referred to the Auditing Committee, and, when audited, reported to the Board and then forwarded by the President of the Board to the Comptroller for payment.

Each bid or estimate shall contain the name and place of residence of the person making the same, and names of all persons interested with him therein, and, if no other person be so interested, it shall distinctly state that fact; also, that it is made without any connection with any other person making an estimate for the same purpose, and is in all respects fair and without collusion or fraud, and that no member of the Board of Aldermen, head of a department, chief of a bureau, deputy thereof, or clerk therein, or other officer of The City of New York is, shall be contracting party, partner, stockholder, surety or otherwise in or in the performance of the contract, or in the supplies, work or business to which it relates, or in any portion of the profits thereof. The bid or estimate must be verified by the oath, in writing, of the party or parties making the estimate that the several matters stated herein are in all respects true.

Each bid or estimate shall be accompanied by the consent, in writing, of two householders or freeholders in The City of New York, or of a guaranty or surety company duly authorized by law to act as surety, and shall contain the matters set forth in the blank forms mentioned below.
