# Local Law 19, Section 614

## I. Permanent Housing Need for Fiscal Year 2009

### Families

In Fiscal Year 2009, DHS expects approximately 33,000 duplicated applications for family shelter services. Approximately 35% of duplicated families applying will remain in temporary housing as eligible shelter entrants.

In Fiscal Year 2009, DHS expects to relocate at least 7,000 families into permanent housing. Advantage New York, rental assistance programs introduced in April 2007 to move families into housing, will be the primary source of permanent housing placements. New York City Housing Authority (NYCHA) and the Department of Housing Preservation and Development (HPD) are included in the aggregated total.

### Single Adults

In Fiscal Year 2009, DHS expects to place at least 8,000 single adults into permanent housing. Approximately 70% of those individuals will be placed in private housing or will be re-housed with family. DHS plans to relocate 1,500 (20% approximately) single adults into permanent supportive housing in Fiscal Year 2009. Additional placements will include those using the Work Advantage and Fixed Income Advantage subsidy programs.

### II. Transitional Housing for Fiscal Year 2009

#### Families

DHS will have a maximum of 9,470 units for families in transitional housing in Fiscal Year 2009. DHS estimates that 8,500 units will be needed during the peak month of Fiscal Year 2009.

# Single Adults

DHS will have a total of 7,463 units available for single adults in the peak month of Fiscal Year 2009. DHS estimates that 6,682 beds will be needed during the same month.
