²Data in this table represents contraband surrendered by individuals following placement in Separation Status, recovered from individuals following placement, or recovered from the Separation Status unit following or during an individual’s placement. Contraband is also recovered through the use of body scanners, without the use of Separation Status. In January 2020, 4 (100%) contraband items were surrendered immediately following a scan. Historically (July 2019 through January 2020) 17 (24%) contraband items have been surrendered prior to a scan and 54 (76%) items have been recovered immediately following a scan. These numbers have been adjusted for accuracy and are inclusive of any contraband recovered from an individual’s cell following their removal from Separation Status.
