Our EEO Officer also has a goal to increase internal awareness regarding the City’s 55-A program and to increase the number of agency participants from five, to at least ten, in the next few years.**

During this quarter, EEO audited the agencies published vacant positions within the Manager, and Management Specialist, job groups to assess any barriers to diverse recruitment and/ or obtaining robust applicant pools. We are able to measure the effectiveness of these efforts, by tracking hires within the underutilized groups to see if we are trending up. This is an on-going effort. **Next Steps: Working with the Recruitment team within HR to ensure Strategic Recruitment**

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- Our workplace goals include equipping our field and outreach staff with resources and tools to de-escalate and manage street harassment and other conflicts, they often face, in the course of performing their jobs, while engaging with the public. This fiscal year, we will be distributing an explanation regarding the significance of preferred pronouns.**

DDC EEO hosted Bystander Intervention Training workshops, which will be facilitated by the New York City Commission on Human Rights and the Center for Anti-Violence and Education in October 2023. The training was built on the idea that we all can play a role in creating safe public spaces for each other when we see colleagues, citizens and community members facing harassment, bias, or discrimination in public or on the street. The purpose of the training is to create awareness of various types of harassment and to provide different steps people can take, in the moment, and following an incident of harassment, either as a target or as a bystander, as well as resources available to support someone who has been harassed. We measured effectiveness by the evaluation results from the training. Based on the positive feedback and the requests to expand the training, we will be doing additional sessions in April 2024 for our Community Construction Liaisons who engage with the public regularly.

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
C. Equity, Inclusion and Race Relations Initiatives:

DDC has taken the following measures to establish our agency as a leader in creating equitable and inclusive workplace environment and enhancing cultural competency: DDC's EEO division conducted an agencywide Diversity survey as part of our DEI and Race relations initiatives last quarter. DDC also installed a world map on a wall in our Queens Office-Multipurpose room and encouraged employees to pin their birthplace to create a visual representation of the agency's diversity. Employees pinned places across the country, from California to Vermont and all over the world, from Colombia to Indonesia. DDCers are from Afghanistan, Lebanon, Sierra Leone, Peru, Norway, and many, many other countries. In addition, we learned from our diversity survey that DDCers represent at least 65 different countries of origin, and they speak 40+ languages and dialects. Nearly half of the survey respondents speak two languages fluently, and over 114 of DDC employees speak three or more languages fluently. We confirmed that our agency is diverse in other ways as well. DDCers are from several different generations, including employees representing the Silent Generation, born between 1928-1945. Of those who responded to the survey, 7% identify as members of the LGBTQ+ community and 7% self-identified as persons with disabilities. Some responded that they had a high school diploma or just a few college credits, and more than 30% reported graduate degrees.

The diversity survey included some feedback about ideas to enhance our workforce and the experience here at the agency. Some of it was very positive, noting the ways that DDC encourages and supports a diverse workforce and all its needs. Employees also provided some concrete suggestions of how the agency could do better. We are reviewing all this feedback and carefully considering how we can make worthwhile changes. We intend to increase staff development and engagement, prioritize equity efforts, create more diversity and inclusion training opportunities, and enhance overall accessibility.
