MUNICIPAL CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION.

Minutes of Meeting of the Municipal Civil Service Commission of New York
Held Wednesday, July 5, 1916, at 10.30 o'clock A. M.

Present—Dr. Henry Moskowitz, President, and Darwin R. James, Jr., and Alexander Keogh, Commissioners. The President presided.

A public hearing was had on the proposed amendment of the Classification by including in the Non-Competitive Class for Bellevue and Allied Hospitals and for the Department of Public Charities the position of Chief Nurse, at \$900 per annum, with maintenance. Dr. George O'Hanlon, General Medical Superintendent of Bellevue and Allied Hospitals; Miss Clara D. Noyes, General Superintendent of Training School, Bellevue and Allied Hospitals, and Hon. Henry C. Wright, Deputy Commissioner of the Department of Public Charities, appeared in favor of the proposed amendment. Mrs. R. C. Talbot Perkins, representing the Alliance of Women's Clubs of Brooklyn, and Frank J. Mills, representing the Tax Payers' Association, appeared in opposition to the proposed amendment. Mrs. Perkins also read a communication signed by Emmie L. Jenkins and three others, opposing the proposed amendment. The opposition of the foregoing persons was subsequently withdrawn. A representative of Alfred J. Talley, Esq., Counsel for the Civil Employees' Association, appeared and requested that action in the matter of the proposed amendment be deferred pending the filing of a brief by Mr. Talley.

The Commission then went into regular session and the minutes of the meetings held June 14, 15, 16, 19 and 21 were approved.

On motion, the Commission granted the request of Mr. Talley that action in the matter of the proposed amendment of the Classification in connection with the position of Chief Nurse be deferred.

Frank D. Van Horn, of 100 Morningside ave., Manhattan, a candidate on the eligible list of Superintendent of Asphalt Plant, appeared, as directed, accompanied by Edmund C. Rubino, Attorney-at-Law. The matter was laid over.

The following resolutions were adopted after a hearing of each of the candidates named therein:

Resolved, that the disqualification appearing against the name of Joseph Frank, of 792 Eastern Parkway, Brooklyn, on the eligible list of Accountant, Fifth Grade, be and the same hereby is removed.

Resolved, that the following names be and the same hereby are removed from the eligible list of Patrolman under the provisions of clause 14 of Rule VII, and placed upon the list of persons disqualified for employment in the City service: Timothy F. Sullivan, 931 Second ave., Manhattan; John Kaletchitz, Eastford, Connecticut; Arthur H. Irving, 566 Central ave., Brooklyn; James M. Kelly, 69 E. 122nd st., Manhattan; William I. Resolved, that the name of Louis J. Ranchut, of 54 Concord Street, Brooklyn, be and the same hereby is removed from the eligible list of Fireman, under the provisions of clause 14 of Rule VII, on account of physical disability.

Resolved, that the name of George A. Rush, of 3074 Webster ave., Bronx, be and the same hereby is removed from the eligible list of Attendant, Grade 1, Male, and placed upon the list of persons disqualified for employment in the City Service.

Resolved, that the disqualification appearing against the following named candidates on the eligible list of Fireman be and the same hereby is removed: Thomas Greene, 2067 Seventh ave., Manhattan; Leonard F. Vogel, 224 E. 41st st., Manhattan.

James E. King, of 3 St. John's pl., Brooklyn, appeared, as directed, to show cause why his name should not be removed from the eligible list of Superintendent of Industries, Department of Correction. Warden Hayes and Commissioner Lewis also appeared, as requested, in connection with the candidate's record in the Department of Correction. It appeared that after a trial on charges in 1914, in the Department of Correction, the candidate had only been fined fifteen days' pay, and had been continued in his position in the department. Under the circumstances, the Commission did not believe that his name should be stricken from a list for the same department, and, on motion, it was

Resolved, that the disqualification appearing against the name of James E. King, of 3 St. John's pl., Brooklyn, on the eligible list of Superintendent of Industries, Department of Correction, be and the same hereby is removed.

Percy L. Grandy, of 222 W. 27th st., Manhattan, appeared, as directed, to show cause why his name should not be removed from the Preferred list of Temporary Clerk. The Secretary was instructed to mark the candidate "Qualified" on the list for certification to all departments except the Department of Finance.

John A. Carney, of 602 E. 139th st., The Bronx, appeared, as directed, in connection with the date of birth appearing in his examination papers and declaration sheet for the position of Auto Truck Driver. After careful consideration of all the facts in the case, the candidate's declaration sheet was accepted and he was authorized to correct his statements as to date of birth where in error in his papers.

In this connection the Commission considered a report dated June 28, from the Examiner in Charge of the Bureau of Investigation, relative to the two candidates mentioned and to four other candidates on the list. The Secretary was instructed to mark the three candidates referred to "Qualified," in accordance with the recommendation of the Examiner in Charge of the Bureau of Investigation, and, on motion, it was

Resolved, that the following named candidates be and they hereby are marked "Qualified" on the eligible list of Fireman: Bernard E. Schumann, 159 Sumner ave., Brooklyn; Lawrence V. Fagan, 102 Kent st., Brooklyn.

The Secretary was instructed to continue the disqualification appearing against the candidate on the eligible list.

Amendments to Sanitary Code.

AT A MEETING OF THE BOARD OF Health of the Department of Health, held July 28, 1916, the following resolution was adopted: Resolved, That Section 13 of the Sanitary Code be and the same is hereby amended and made to read as follows:

Section 13. Tuberculin test of cows; certificate: No milk cow or cow intended for any purpose other than slaughter shall be admitted to the City of New York unless accompanied by a certificate stating that the said cow is free from tuberculosis so far as may be ascertained by physical examination and the application of the tuberculin test. Said certificate shall contain a physical description of the cow sufficiently accurate for the purpose of identification, and must be signed by a legally licensed veterinarian who shall state the date and place of his registration. The certificate shall also bear a number which must correspond with a tag that shall have been securely attached to and be on the ear of the cow. The certificate shall also contain the date of the examination, which examination shall have been made not more than sixty days prior to the time the cow indicated therein is brought into the city; it must also contain the place of examination, the temperature of the cow for ten hours prior to the injection of tuberculin, the name, quality and character of the preparation of tuberculin used, the location of the injection, the quantity injected, and the temperatures from the eighth to the twentieth hours after the injection, or until the reaction is completed.

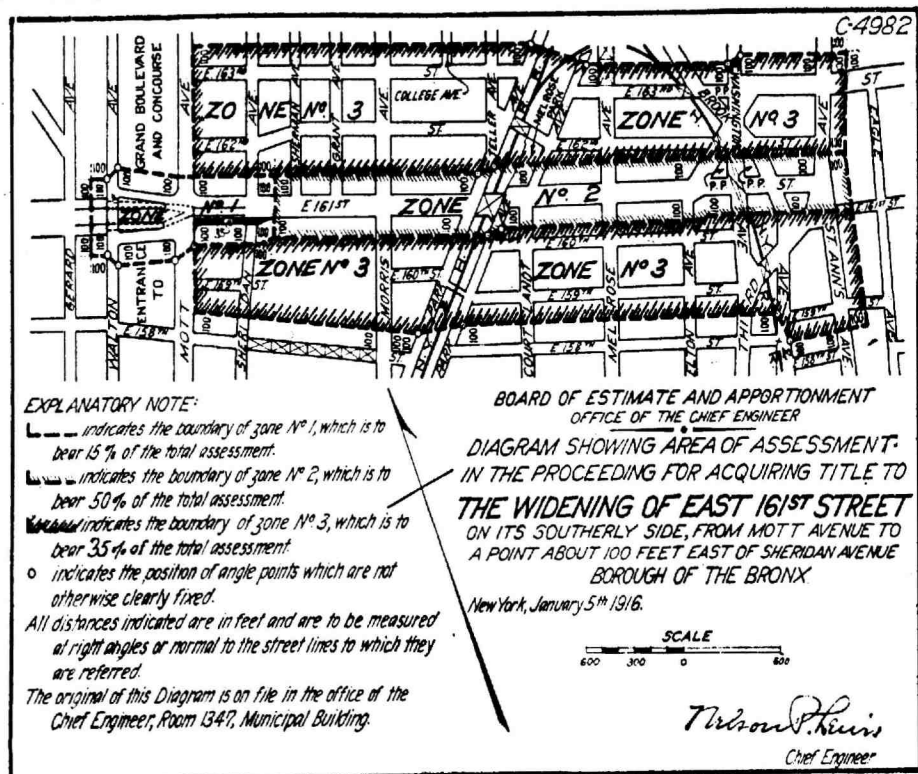

NOTICE TO BIDDERS AT SALES OF OLD BUILDINGS, ETC.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS UNDER WHICH BUILDINGS, ETC., WILL BE SOLD FOR REMOVAL FROM CITY PROPERTY.

THE BUILDINGS AND APPURTENANCES thereto will be sold to the highest bidder, who must pay cash or certified check, drawn to the order of the Comptroller of The City of New York, and must also give a certified check or cash in half the amount of the purchase price as security for the faithful performance of the terms and conditions of the sale. Where the amount of the purchase price does not equal or exceed the sum of \$50, the sum of \$50 shall be the amount of the security to be deposited. This security may at any time after the expiration of the contract period be applied by the City to the cost of completing any of the work required under the contract, but unfinished at the expiration of the contract period.

The purchaser shall not lease, occupy, cause or permit the building or buildings, etc., purchased by him to be used or occupied for any purpose other than that of their speedy removal nor shall he collect any rental or other revenue for the use of either the land or the buildings, etc., situated thereon. The breach of either or any of these conditions shall forthwith void the sale and cause immediate forfeiture of the purchase money and the security deposited for the faithful performance of the conditions of the sale. The placing therein or permitting the occupancy of any such building by any tenant free, for rent or otherwise, excepting the necessary watchmen or the workmen engaged in the actual demolition thereof, shall of itself be a breach of the above conditions of sale.

The sale will be as of the condition of the property on date of delivery thereof to the purchaser. The City of New York will not be responsible for any change or loss which may occur in the condition of the buildings, or their appurtenances between the time of the sale thereof and the time of delivering possession to the purchaser, after being properly vacated of all tenants, and the sale and delivery to purchaser will be made as nearly together as the circumstances of vacating the structures of their tenants will permit.

All the material of the buildings, sheds, walks, structures and cellars of whatsoever nature, with their exterior and interior fixtures, appurtenances and foundations of all kinds, except the exterior walls of the buildings and their foundations and the sidewalks and curb in front of said buildings, extending within the described area, shall be torn down and removed from the premises. None of the dirt, debris or waste resulting from demolition shall be allowed to remain on the premises, except old mortar or plaster only, which may be left, but not higher at any point than two feet below the curb opposite that point. The exterior walls and their foundations shall be taken down only to a plane whose elevation shall be the level of the curb in front of the building. Where there is no curb the elevation of the surrounding ground shall be considered curb level. All wells, cesspools, sinks, etc., existing on the property must be filled to the level of the surrounding ground with clean earth.

The purchaser at the sale shall also withdraw and remove all abandoned water taps and old service mains, and in place thereof cause to be inserted a brass plug in the main water pipe in the street, in compliance with the rules and regulations of the Department of Water Supply, Gas and Electricity, and furnish the Department of Finance with a certificate from the Department of Water Supply, Gas and Electricity that this has been performed.

The purchaser at the sale shall also remove all house sewer connections to the main sewer in the street and the openings of the main sewer in street shall be properly closed in compliance with the directions of the Bureau of Sewers in the Borough in which the buildings are situated, and furnish the Department of Finance with a certificate from the Bureau of Sewers that the work has been properly performed.

The permit for all openings in the street to be obtained by and at the expense of the purchaser of the building.

Failure to remove said buildings, appurte-

nances, or any part thereof, within thirty days from the day of possession will work forfeiture of ownership of such buildings, appurtenances or portions, as shall then be left standing, together with all moneys paid by said purchaser on account thereof at the time of the sale, and the bidder's assent to the above conditions being understood to be implied by the act of bidding, and The City of New York will, without notice to the purchaser, cause the same to be removed, and the cost and expense thereof charged against the security above mentioned.

The work of removal must be carried on in every respect in a thorough and workmanlike manner, and must be completed within thirty days from the day of possession, and the successful bidder will provide and furnish all materials of labor and machinery necessary thereto, and will place proper and sufficient guards and fences and warning signs by day and night for the prevention of accidents, and will indemnify and save harmless The City of New York, its officers, agents and servants, and each of them, against any and all suits and actions, claims and demands of every name and description brought against it, them or any of them, and against and from all damage and costs to which it, they or any of them be put by reason of injury to the person or property of another, resulting from negligence or carelessness in the performance of the work, or in guarding the same, or from any improper or defective materials or machinery, implements or appliances used in the removal of said buildings.

Where party walls are found to exist between buildings purchased by different bidders, the materials of said party walls shall be understood to be equally divided between the separate purchasers.

Party walls and fences, when existing against adjacent property not sold, shall not be taken down. All furrings, plaster, chimneys, projecting bricks, etc., on the faces of such party walls are to be taken down and removed. The walls shall be made permanently self-supporting, beam holes, etc., bricked up, and the wall pointed and made to exclude wind and rain and present a clean exterior. The roofs and adjacent buildings shall be properly flashed and painted and made watertight where they have been disturbed by the operations of the Contractor.

"No buildings, parts of buildings, fixtures or machinery sold for removal under these terms and conditions shall in any case be re-located or re-erected within the lines of any proposed street or other public improvement, and if any such buildings, parts of buildings, fixtures or machinery, etc., shall be re-located or re-erected within the lines of any proposed street or other public improvement, title thereto shall thereupon become vested in The City of New York and a resale at public or private sale may be made in the same manner as if no prior sale thereof had been made."

The Comptroller of The City of New York reserves the right on the day of sale to withdraw from sale any of the buildings, parts of buildings and machinery included therein, or to reject any and all bids; and be it further

Resolved, That while the said sale is held under the supervision of the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund, the Comptroller is authorized to cause the sale to be advertised and to direct the sale thereof as financial officer of the City.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS.

The person or persons making a bid or estimate for any services, work, materials or supplies for The City of New York, or for any of its departments, bureaus or officers, shall furnish the same in a sealed envelope, indorsed with the title of the supplies, materials, work or services for which the bid or estimate is made, with his or their name or names and the date of presentation to the President or Board or to the head of the Department at his or its office, on or before the date and hour named in the advertisement for the same, at which time and place the estimates received will be publicly opened by the President or Board or head of said Department and read, and the award of the contract made according to law as soon thereafter as practicable.

Each bid or estimate shall contain the name and place of residence of the person making the same, and names of all persons interested with him therein, and, if no other person be so interested, it shall distinctly state that fact; also, that it is made without any connection with any other person making an estimate for the same purpose, and is in all respects fair and without collusion or fraud and that no member of the Board of Aldermen, head of a department, chief of a bureau, deputy thereof, or clerk therein, or other officer of The City of New York is, shall be or become interested, directly or indirectly, as contracting party, partner, stockholder, surety or otherwise in or in the performance of the contract, or in the supplies, work or business to which it relates, or in any portion of the profits thereof. The bid or estimate must be verified by the oath, in writing, of the party or parties making the estimate that the several matters stated herein are in all respects true.

No bid or estimate will be considered unless as a condition precedent to the reception or consideration of any proposal, it be accompanied by a certified check upon one of the State or National banks of The City of New York, drawn to the order of the Comptroller, or money or corporate stock or certificates of indebtedness of any nature issued by The City of New York, which the Comptroller shall approve as of equal value with the security required in the advertisement to the amount of not less than three nor more than five per centum of the amount of the bond required, as provided in section 420 of the Greater New York Charter.

The amount shall be as specified in the proposals or instructions to bidders and shall not be in excess of 5 per cent.

The certified check or money should not be inclosed in the envelope containing the bid or estimate, but should be either inclosed in a separate envelope addressed to the head of the Department, President or Board, or submitted personally upon the presentation of the bid or estimate.

For particulars as to the quantity and quality of the supplies, or the nature and extent of the work, reference must be made to the specifications, schedules, plans, etc., on file in the said office of the President, Board or Department.

No bid shall be accepted from or contract awarded to any person who is in arrears to The City of New York upon debt or contract, or who is a defaulter, as surety or otherwise, upon any obligation of the City.

The contract must be bid for separately. The right is reserved in each case to reject all bids or estimates if it is deemed to be for the interest of the City so to do.

Bidders will write out the amount of their bids or estimates in addition to inserting the same in figures.

Bidders are requested to make their bids or estimates upon the blank forms prepared and furnished by the City, a copy of which, with the proper envelope in which to inclose the bid, together with a copy of the contract, including the specifications, in the form approved by the Corporation Counsel, can be obtained upon application therefor at the office of the Department for which the work is to be done.
