The arithmetic paper is not to be computed on the machine. There will be a time limit on the tabulation and a time limit on the arithmetic. Each candidate will be required to furnish his own machine and four registers or totalizers, with a capacity of \$99,999.99 each. The Commission will not be responsible at any time or in any way for machines nor will any allowance be made where they are missing, late in arriving, defective or out of order on the day of the examination. A separate eligible list will be prepared of those who qualify on the Elliot-Fisher machine and a separate eligible list of those who qualify on the Remington-Wahl machine. 
