





General provisions

All #buildings and other structures# within the Queens Plaza Subdistrict shall comply with the #bulk# regulations of this Section. The regulations of the designated #Residence# and M1 Districts shall apply as set forth below.

In Areas A-1, A-2, B, and C and D of the Queens Plaza Subdistrict, the #bulk# regulations set forth in Article II, Chapter 3, shall apply to all #residential uses# in a #building or other structure# in accordance with the regulations of the designated #Residence District#, and the #bulk# regulations set forth in Article IV, Chapter 3, shall apply to all #manufacturing#, #community facility# and #commercial uses# in a #building or other structure# in accordance with the regulations of the designated M1 District, except as modified in the special #bulk# regulations of Sections 117-522 through 117-533, inclusive.

When two or more #buildings# on a single #zoning lot# are used in any combination for #uses# which, if located in a single #building#, would make it a #mixed use building#, the regulations set forth in this Section shall apply as if such #buildings# were a single #mixed use building#.



Map 1: Designated Districts within the Queens Plaza Subdistrict



INFANT FORMULA SHORTAGE

WHEREAS, in February 2022, concerns about contamination at the Sturgis, Michigan facility of Abbott Nutrition, the largest manufacturer of infant formula in the United States, led to a voluntary recall of several lines of powdered formula and the temporary closure of the Sturgis facility; and

WHEREAS, the closure of the Sturgis facility, along with supply chain problems caused by the COVID-19 pandemic and other issues affecting the national economy, have led to shortages in infant formula, including in New York City, where, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the majority of parents and caregivers rely on some amount of formula to feed their babies, and the inability of parents and caregiver to obtain infant formula remains an imminent threat to the health and safety of infants in New York City; and

WHEREAS, the state of emergency to address the infant formula shortage in the City of New York first declared in Emergency Executive Order No. 98, dated May 21, 2022, and extended most recently by Emergency Executive Order No. 174, dated August 19, 2022, remains in effect;

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the powers vested in me by the laws of the State of New York and the City of New York, including but not limited to the New York Executive Law, the New York City Charter and the Administrative Code of the City of New York, and the common law authority to protect the public in the event of an emergency, it is hereby ordered:

Section 1. I hereby order that section 1 of Emergency Executive Order No. 194, dated September 8, 2022, is extended for five (5) days.

§ 2. This Emergency Executive Order shall take effect immediately and shall remain in effect for five (5) days unless it is terminated or modified at an earlier date.

I hereby direct the Fire and Police Departments, the Department of Buildings, the Sheriff, and other agencies as needed, to enforce the directives set forth in this Order in accordance with their lawful authorities, including Administrative Code sections 15-227(a), 28-105.10.1, and 28-201.1, and section 107.6 of the Fire Code. Violations of the directives set forth in this Order may be issued as if they were violations under Health Code sections 3.07 and 3.11, and enforced by the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene or any other agency.

WHEREAS, this Order is given to prioritize compliance with the *Nunez* Action Plan and to address the effects of DOC’s staffing levels, the conditions at DOC facilities, and health operations; and
