## AQUEDUCT COMMISSION.



On motion of the Commissioner of Public Works, the recommendation of Chief Engineer Church in relation to the compensation of Executive Engineer Alphonse Fteley, was approved, and it was unanimously

Resolved, That the compensation of Alphonse Fteley, Executive Engineer of this Commission, be increased to the sum of seven thousand dollars per annum, to date from the 1st of January next.

In relation to the recommendation of the Chief Engineer, for an increase of the compensation of the Engineer of Construction, Commissioner Dowd offered the following resolution:

Resolved, That the compensation of Engineer of Construction, Henry S. Craven be fixed at the rate of six thousand dollars, instead of five thousand dollars, per annum, as recommended by the Chief Engineer.

The amendment was adopted by the following vote:

In the affirmative—The Mayor, Comptroller, Commissioner Spencer, and Commissioner Dowd. In the negative—Commissioner of Public Works and Commissioner Baldwin.

On motion of the Commissioner of Public Works, the recommendations of the Chief Engineer, as above amended, were then adopted; and it was unanimously

Resolved, That the compensation of Engineer of Construction Henry S. Craven be increased to the sum of six thousand dollars per annum; that the compensation of William W. Proctor, Property Clerk in the Engineer's office at Tarrytown, be increased to the sum of one hundred and twenty-five dollars (\$125) per month; and that Ira A. Shaler be and is hereby appointed to the position of Rodman in the Engineer Department of this Commission, at a compensation of seventy dollars per month; all of the above to take effect from the 1st day of January next.

The Secretary then asked the attention of the Commissioners to the selection and appointment of an Auditor, the increasing work of the Commission now demanding the services of a competent person in that capacity; and on motion of the Mayor, the matter was referred to the Committee of Finance and Audit for consideration and report.

The Committee of Finance and Audit, to which was referred the matter of the execution of the contracts and bonds and the sufficiency of the sureties offered by the contractors for Sections A, B, 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3 and 2 of the New Aqueduct, then presented the following report:

#### To the Aqueduct Commissioners:

GENTLEMEN—The Committee of Finance and Audit report that they have examined and satisfied themselves of the sufficiency of the sureties offered by Heman Clark for the faithful performance of the contracts awarded to him for constructing Sections A and B of the New Croton Aqueduct, and that the contracts and bonds have been prepared and duly executed for said sections, as follows:

it is requisite that the verification be made and subscribed by all the parties interested.

Each bid or estimate shall be accompanied by the consent, in writing, of two householders or freeholders of the City of New York, to the effect that if the contract be awarded to the person making the estimate, they will, on its being so awarded become bound as his sureties for its faithful performance, in the sum of three thousand dollars (\$3,000); and that if he shall omit or refuse to execute the same, they will pay to the Corporation any difference between the sum to which he would be entitled on its completion and that which the Corporation may be obliged to pay to the person or persons to whom the contract may be awarded at any subsequent letting; the amount in each case to be calculated upon the estimated amount of the work by which the bids are tested. The consent above mentioned shall be accompanied by the oath or affirmation, in writing, of each of the persons signing the same, that he is a householder or freeholder in the City of New York, and is worth the amount of the security required for the completion of this contract, over and above all his debts of every nature, and over and above his liabilities as bail, surety, or otherwise, and that he has offered himself as a surety in good faith and with the intention to execute the bond required by law. The adequacy and sufficiency of the security offered is to be approved by the Comptroller of the City of New York before the award is made and prior to the signing of the contract.

No estimate will be considered unless accompanied by either a certified check upon one of the National Banks of the City of New York, drawn to the order of the Comptroller, or money, to the amount of one hundred and fifty dollars (\$150). Such check or money must not be inclosed in the sealed envelope containing the estimate, but must be handed to the officer or clerk of the Department who has charge of the Estimate-box, and no estimate can be deposited in said box until such check or money has been examined by said officer or clerk, and found to be correct. All such deposits, except that of the successful bidder, will be returned to the persons making the same within three days after the contract is awarded.
