

Resolved, That permission be and the same is hereby given to the Journeymen Bakers and Confectioners' International Union of America to hold public meetings in the streets of the Fourth, Eighth, Tenth, Twelfth and Sixteenth Assembly Districts, New York County, the work to be done at their own expense, under the direction of the Chief of Police; such permission to continue only for sixty days from the date of approval by his Honor the Mayor.

An Ordinance to authorize the laying of water-mains in One Hundred and Fortieth street, between Seventh and Eighth avenues, Borough of Manhattan.

Be it Ordained by the Municipal Assembly of The City of New York, as follows:
That, in pursuance of section 413 of the Greater New York Charter, the following resolution of the Board of Public Improvements, adopted by that Board on the 24th day of January, 1900, be and the same bereby is approved, and the public work or improvement therein provided for is hereby authorized, viz.:

Resolved, by the Board of Public Improvements, That, in pursuance of section 413 of the Greater New York Charter, the laying of water-mains in One Hundred and Fortieth street, between Seventh and Eighth avenues, Borough of Manhattan, and the making of a contract for the same by the Commissioner of Water Supply be and the same is hereby authorized and

approved, the cost of said public work or improvement to be paid for from the appropriation for 'Laying Croton Pipes, boroughs of Manhattan and The Bronx," for 1900.

An Ordinance to lay water-mains in Eleventh avenue, in Fiftieth street and in Twelfth avenue, Borough of Manhattan.

Be it Ordained by the Municipal Assembly of The City of New York, as follows:

That, in pursuance of section 413 of the Greater New York Charter, the following resolution of the Board of Public Improvements, adopted by that Board on the 21st day of March, 1909, be and the same hereby is approved, and the public work or improvement therein provided for is hereby authorized, viz.:
