The New York City Charter, Chapter 49, Section 1133, requires that agencies submit to the Department of Records and Information Services (DORIS) all reports, documents, studies and publications required by local law, executive order, or mayoral directive to be published, issued, or transmitted to the City Council or Mayor, within 10 business days of their publication. Commencing in 2018, the recommendations should include information regarding the pilot program established pursuant to LL 160/2016, including, to the extent such information is available, the cost of such pilot program, the rate of utilization of each charging station installed pursuant to such pilot program, recommendations with respect to expanding or making such pilot program or the installation of electric vehicle charging stations in the city, including the feasibility of onstreet electric vehicle charging.
