STATEMENT FROM MAYOR DE BLASIO, COMMISSIONER MOSTOFI, AND CORPORATION COUNSEL JAMES JOHNSON ON SCOTUS DACA DECISION

Statement from Mayor de Blasio:

"Tens of thousands of DACA recipients call this city home. They're our neighbors, our friends, our colleagues. They're New Yorkers. Today's Supreme Court decision is a huge step for the people of this city, and an even bigger step in the right direction. Dreamers who are part of our city and part of our country can now know that they will have a bright future here. Now we must have comprehensive immigration reform to create real change."

Statement from the Mayor's Office of Immigrant Affair's Commissioner Bitta Mostofi:

"We are thrilled to see the Supreme Court uphold the rule of law and critical protections for the tens of thousands of New Yorkers who have received DACA. We have long recognized their inextricable ties and significant contributions to our communities. We wholeheartedly join our Dreamers and their families in celebrating today's victory, a testament to not only their yearslong advocacy but also their important roles in their communities. But we also know that the fight must continue. We call on the Senate to pass the American Dream and Promise Act so that the hundreds of thousands of Dreamers around the country can be on a path to citizenship.
