**MAYOR DE BLASIO ALLOCATES \$17.5M FOR DEVELOPMENT OF BUSHWICK
INLET PARK**

Allocation allows crucial renovation of two parcels of parkland and further the development of Bushwick Inlet Park

NEW YORK—The de Blasio administration and NYC Parks today celebrated the recently-announced allocation of \$17.5 million from Mayor Bill de Blasio for the development and remediation of two parcels of parkland at Bushwick Inlet Park in North Brooklyn. As 50 Kent has already undergone remediation, the allocated \$7.7 million will go toward developing the site into a new park. The remaining \$9.8 million will go toward the remediation and development of the Motiva site. Parks will begin designing this park with the community in the spring.

“We kept a promise to North Brooklyn by purchasing the final parcel of Bushwick Inlet Park, and this additional funding will allow the City to move closer to realizing the vision of a fully-developed waterfront park with beautiful views and amenities to match,” said **Mayor Bill de Blasio**.

In December 2016, the City announced \$160-million purchase of the former CitiStorage site which completes acquisition of the final parcel of land in Bushwick Inlet Park. Already, 3.5-acres of the park are complete and open to the public, featuring a multi-purpose field and a building for community activities with a state-of-the-art green roof which doubles as a seating area. This park incorporates natural and urban structures, bringing Williamsburg’s waterfront and natural areas into the community around it. Visitors can admire the views or use the park’s facilities for active recreation. This additional funding will bring will allow for public use of an additional 3.6 acres of parkland.

"Great communities are built around great parks, which is why we are so excited by Mayor de Blasio’s continued efforts to complete Bushwick Inlet Park, one of Brooklyn’s newest, growing public spaces,” said **Parks Commissioner Mitchell J. Silver**. “We look forward to working with our community partners to realize a vision for Bushwick Inlet Park that truly serves North Brooklyn.”

“Bushwick Inlet Park will soon become a world-class treasure for Greenpoint, Williamsburg, and all of Brooklyn as a green space everyone can enjoy. I commend Mayor de Blasio, Parks Commissioner Silver, and Council Member Levin for their collaborative partnership on making

this park possible,” said **Brooklyn Borough President Eric L. Adams**. “I’m particularly proud to have allocated \$1 million in capital investment toward making this dream come alive. These kinds of open spaces are an important part of our borough’s physical fabric, weaving together communities and peoples from all walks of life under the tree of One Brooklyn.”

“This community is one of the fastest growing in the city, and is in desperate need of more open space,” said **U.S. Representative Carolyn Maloney**. “Thanks to the \$17.5 million allocation from Mayor de Blasio, Bushwick Inlet Park now has the funding it needs to complete two major portions of the project and bring our dream closer to a reality. When it is complete, I think it will be one of the most beautiful parks in the city, and it will serve our community for generations to come. I look forward to seeing the construction begin, and cannot wait to see the final product. Thank you to Mayor de Blasio for his continued commitment to Bushwick Inlet Park.”
