Governor Kathy Hochul announced that the New York State Public Service Commission adopted a \$200 million New York State energy bill credit to be administered by the large electric and gas utilities on behalf of their customers. The energy bill credit is a one-time credit using State-appropriated funds to provide energy bill relief to more than 8 million directly metered electric and gas customers. With today's action, more than \$1.4 billion has been or will be made available to New York consumers to help offset energy costs in 2024. 

The John D. Solomon Fellowship for Public Service is the first student fellowship with the City devoted specifically to emergency management.
