THE GAS COMMISSION.

Abstract of proceedings of the Mayor, the Comptroller and the Commissioner of Public Works under Sec. 73 Chap. 335 of the Laws of 1873.

January 3d, 1874.
Pursuant to adjournment the Mayor, the Comptroller and the Commissioner of Public Works, met at 3:30 p. m., January 3, 1874, in the office of the Commissioner of Public Works in the City Hall.

The minutes of the meetings held on the 19th, 20th, 22nd, 23d, 24th and 31st of December, 1873, were read and adopted.

A letter was received and ordered on file, from Robert L. J. Hall, President and E. F. Yardley, Secretary of the Continental Gas Company, No. 8 Wall street, proposing to supply gas of 20 candle power, free from most of the sulphur compounds contained in the ordinary coal gas at the rate of two dollars and fifty cents (\$2.50,) per one thousand cubic feet.

A surities agreement was submitted on behalf of the Metropolitan Gas Light Company, justified by Robert H. Arkenburgh of No. 176 Water Street and Agra C. Peck of No. 130 Front street each in the sum of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000,) which agreement was on motion received for consideration.

An agreement justified by Thomas Rutter and John H. Browning as surities each in the sum of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000,) was presented by the Harlem Gas Light Company, and on motion, received and laid over for consideration.

In reply to interrogatories by the Comptroller the representations of the competing companies stated their views relative to the awarding of the contracts.

The Commissioner of Public Works then read memoranda analyzing the various bids for supplying gas and performing work.

On motion an adjournment was had until Wednesday, January 7th, 1874, at half past three o'clock.

JANUARY 7, 1874.

In accordance with the motion for adjournment adopted at the previous meeting, the Mayor, the Comptroller, and the Commissioner of Public Works, met at the hour of 3:30 P. M., on Wednesday, January 7, 1874, in the Office of the Commissioner of Public Works.

The minutes of the meeting held January 3, 1874, were read and adopted.

On motion unanimously adopted that the officers designated in section 73, chapter 335, of the Laws of 1873, proceed to consider the bids offered by the New York Gas Light Company, and the New York Mutual Gas Light Company, the subject of awarding the contract in the First, or lower district of the city was discussed.

The Commissioner of Public Works moved that the award of contract for supplying the gas for each lamp, and for the lighting, cleaning and re-glazing the same, and replacing the cocks, tubes and burners, crossheads, lamp-irons and lanterns thereto, for the year 1874, be made to the New York Gas Light Company, for the District of said Company, embracing that part of the City of New York south of a line running from the East River through Grand, Sullivan and Canal street, to the Hudson or North River, at the rate of thirty-three dollars (\$33.00) per annum.

Whereupon the chairman put the question upon the adoption of the motion which was adopted by the concurrent votes of the Mayor, the Comptroller and the Commissioner of Public Works.

The Commissioner of Public Works moved and the Comptroller seconded the motion that the award of contract for supplying the gas for each lamp, and for the lighting, cleaning and re-glazing the same and replacing the cocks, tubes and burners, cross-heads, lamp-irons and lanterns thereto during the year 1874 in the districts bounded on the north by the centre line of Thirty-fourth street; on the south by a line running from the East River through centre line of Grand street, to the centre line of Sullivan street, southerly to the centre line of Canal street, thence westerly through the centre line of Canal street to the Hudson River; on the east by the East River, and on the west by the Hudson River, be made to the Manhattan Gaslight Company at the rate per lamp of thirty-three dollars (\$33) per annum, which motion being duly put by the Chairman was adopted by the concurrent votes of the Mayor, the Comptroller and the Commissioner of Public Works.

The Commissioner of Public Works moved that the bids presented by the Metropolitan Gas Light Company and the Harlem Gas Light Company be rejected on account of irregularity, and that the bid made by the Mutual Gas Light Company be also rejected, because it is deemed for the interest of the city to reject said bid.

Subsequently the Commissioner of Public Works withdrew the motion, and moved to lay the bid of the Metropolitan Gas Light Company, the Harlem Gas Light Company, and the Mutual Gas Light Company over for future consideration, which motion was adopted.

Messrs. C. K. Garrison and A. V. Stout stated their views at length, urging that an award be made to the Mutual Gas Light Company, where they have mains laid through the principal avenues.

The meeting then adjourned to the call of the Chair.

The bids for the same work of George A. Barney and J. M. Heatherton & Co., at the request of the Comptroller, were then read.

The Commissioner of Public Works read a comparative statement relative to the bids of George A. Barney and the various gas light companies.

After some discussion the Comptroller moved to lay the matter of the motion offered by the Commissioner of Public Works, on the table, which motion was unanimously adopted.

A communication was presented by the Comptroller, from Charles Place, Secretary of the New York Mutual Gas Light Co., urging that an award of contract be made to said company for the portion of the city between 34th and 79th streets, in which they have mains laid.

On motion the communication was ordered on file.

The Chairman presented a communication of January 19th, 1874 from Oscar Zollickoff, Esq. President of the Metropolitan Gas Light Company, requesting a speedy action on this bid, which was also ordered to be filed.

The Commissioner of Public Works called for a vote upon the question of the regularity of the bid submitted by the Metropolitan Gas Light Company, but after discussion relative to the bids presented by the Metropolitan Gas Light Company and the Harlem Gas Light Company, the Mayor moved that both be rejected.

On motion of the Comptroller an adjournment was had until Saturday, January 24, 1874, at 3:30 P. M.

HABITUAL DRUNKARDS—REPORT OF COMMISSIONER STERN ON THE EXTRAORDINARY INCREASE OF INTOXICATION, AND THE CRUEL EFFECTS OF AN UNJUST AND UNWISE LAW ON THE SUBJECT.

To the Commissioners of Charities and Correction:

GENTLEMEN—The large number of persons committed for intoxication, and which is constantly on the increase, calls for serious investigation by this Board and recommendations for speedy legislation on the subject, especially as the overwhelming portion of those committed to our care for that offence are females. The intention of the law making intoxication a punishable offence was, beyond a doubt, to effect a reform in the habits of persons inclined to intemperance. That it signally failed, however, to accomplish that purpose is best proven by the official statement furnished from the records of the Workhouse, according to which, from January 1, 1870, to January 1, 1874, 560 males were committed for habitual drunkenness from six to one hundred times for the repetition of the same offence, and 9,006 females for the same cause. I have not embodied in this statement the number of males and females that were inmates of the Workhouse, committed for the same cause, for less than six times. The figures in themselves, 560 male habitual drunkards to 9,006 confirmed female drunkards, are appalling to contemplate. The degradation and contempt attendant upon a commitment to the Workhouse crushes every spark of self-respect that may still exist in a woman who had yielded to the temptation of intemperance, and, instead of a beneficial effect, her commitment to the Workhouse, where she is thrust into the society of fallen women of every grade, will effectually accomplish her moral ruin beyond the hope of resurrection. They are not all abandoned characters that are thus consigned to the tomb of vice; a number of them are mothers, some are destined to become mothers, others are the victims of heartless seductions, many of whom can be saved from hopeless perdition if the proper means are employed and the necessary measures taken to effect a permanent reform of their habit. In the annual report of the Commissioners for the year 1870, attention is already called to the unsatisfactory working of the law regarding the treatment of persons committed for intoxication. The Commissioners then already questioned whether it be just to punish by imprisonment occasional or accidental intoxication. It is certainly more than punishment, it is dire cruelty, to tear away a person, male or female, from their families, relations or friends, and crowd them with habitual drunkards and vagabonds for what may have been an indiscretion committed at an unguarded moment.

Instead of leading them on the right path, they are thrust with a rude hand on the downward road to crime; they lose their self-respect, and often are lost to society beyond retrieval. It was wisely and correctly suggested by the Commissioners in the report already alluded to, fortified by experience thus far, that the cause of suffering is wholly incommensurate with the offence, involving the loss of character, and often the means of support. The removal of any person found intoxicated to the station-house, and his detention there until sober, would be sufficient punishment for the offence. A commitment for ten days is either a punishment too great, bordering on cruelty, unjustifiable as in the cases just stated, or, as in the case of confirmed intemperance, that is a means of reform or correction. Commitments for any length of time for the reason of habitual drunkenness can have no other meaning than to restrain forcibly people inclined to excessive indulgence in alcoholic drinks. If they can be cured of a habit which in most cases is so strong as to obtain entire control of their will, energy and faculties, society confers a benefit upon them and upon itself; every member of society rescued from the slough of vice and uselessness is a gain to humanity, and society must at least attempt to make the rescue. Our present practice, however, is a complete failure in that respect, of which no better proof is required than the statistical account of commitments for intoxication made during the past three years.

That account speaks volumes for itself. The tale it tells of male drunkards being recommitted to prison from one hundred times down to six times, of whom one hundred and eighty-one offenders were recommitted ten times, is dreadful to contemplate. But this tale of horror is put entirely in the shade, it is lost sight of, if placed side
