Autism Spectrum Disorder Services

This report contains services provided by the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene's Bureau of Developmental Disabilities, within the Division of Mental Hygiene, and the Bureau of Early Intervention, within the Division of Family and Child Health. This report contains the number of individuals receiving services for autism spectrum disorders for each relevant program, disaggregated by geographic boundary. For each category reported below that contains between 1 and 9 individuals, has been reported with a symbol (*), to maintain privacy of the individual.

Bureau of Developmental Disabilities

The Bureau of Developmental Disabilities holds 40 NYC Health Department funded contractors who provided services through a total of 83 programs for individuals with ASD who are either ineligible or are waiting to be deemed eligible to receive services under the auspices of the state Office for People with Developmental Disabilities (OPWDD) or other publicly funded programs. In addition to components that support the needs of families and caregivers, ASD programs serve children, youth, and/or young adults (age 3 to 25) with direct wraparound services that complement school programming for children such as after-school and/or weekend/holiday recreational programs; recreational and socialization opportunities for adults or children designed to increase their repertoire of social experiences, foster community integration and enhance interpersonal communication; and/or vocational readiness training for individuals with autism spectrum disorder.

The tables to follow reflect data gathered from 82 programs for services delivered during the 2020 calendar year. One program located in the Bronx did not respond to survey after multiple outreach attempts. On a yearly average, the missing program serves 64 individuals. Table 1 denotes that a total of **7,302** individuals received services for ASD from NYC Health Department funded contractors throughout NYC; of these, 65 individuals lived in a zip code outside of NYC and 842 had an undisclosed NYC zip code. It is important to note that while contractors reported the number of individuals on their rosters, these data do not account for the possibility of duplication within NYC Health Department funded programs, nor across OPWDD-sponsored services, as service enrollment is not mutually exclusive.

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Early Intervention Services

The Bureau of Early Intervention provides early intervention services for infants and toddlers from birth to age 3 who have been diagnosed with a physical or mental condition that puts them at risk of a developmental delay. Children may also be eligible if their families suspect they have a developmental delay or disability but have not yet received a diagnosis. The Early Intervention Program is free and available to all eligible New York families, regardless of race, ethnicity, income, or immigration status.

As shown in the table below, in calendar year 2020, a total of 7,007 infants and toddlers with an ASD diagnosis received Early Intervention services in New York City. This number represents a 3% decrease from the number in 2019. This change is associated with the decline in referrals, which occurred because of the COVID-19 pandemic. Prior to 2020, there had been a steady annual increase in ASD diagnoses.

For the Early Intervention Program, data is reported by United Hospital Fund (UHF) neighborhood. Representative Zip Codes for each UHF neighborhood are included in the table (Because UHFs represent small populations and even smaller 0-3 populations, large percentage changes may reflect a small number of children).

The NYC Health Department does not have NYC or New York State-specific data on ASD prevalence, as ASD is not a reportable condition; and there is no national data specific to prevalence among children 0-3. Therefore, it cannot be certain whether these data indicate that there have been similar changes in prevalence in NYC, or only changes in identification and service use. Research in this field indicates that there is an increased awareness of autism in the community as well as among healthcare professionals, thereby increasing the identification of a condition that was always present.
