Type of disclosure reported	Summary description
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law (12)	Employee improperly disclosed identifying information to a member of the public.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law	Employee inadvertently disclosed client identifying information by email to a third party.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law	Employee improperly disclosed identifying information to a third party.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law	Contractor inadvertently disclosed identifying information to third parties due to a technical error.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law	Employee inadvertently indexed client identifying information into another client's file, resulting in disclosures of the mis-indexed client's identifying information to another client.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law	Employee inadvertently disclosed client identifying information by mail to a third party.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law	Contractor experienced a security incident, resulting in disclosures of identifying information to a third party.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law	Employee inadvertently disclosed client identifying information by email to a third party.
