DEPARTMENT OF DOCKS.

At a meeting of the Board of Docks of the City of New York, held at the office of the Board, Pier "A," Battery place, Thursday, October 12, 1893, at 11 o'clock A.M.

Present—President Cram.

" Commissioner Phelan.

" " White.

The minutes of the meeting held on the 4th instant were read and approved.

The communication from Benjamin Richards offering to sell to the City the property of the New York Floating Dry Dock Company, consisting of four hundred and forty-four feet of bulk-head, between Pike and Rutgers Slips, and eight-ninths of Pier, old 42, East river, for \$450,000, was referred to Commissioners White and Phelan.

The communication from the Engineer-in-Chief, reporting the completion of Contract No. 441, and requesting instructions as to the deduction to be made for overtime in completing the shed on the Pier foot of East Third street, was referred to the Treasurer.

The following permits were granted, the work to be done under the supervision of the Engineer-in-Chief, and to continue only during the pleasure of the Board:

Nathan Straus—To erect a coal-bin, eighty feet long six feet high and twelve feet wide, on the north side of the Pier foot of East Third street.

Metropolitan Telephone and Telegraph Company—To attach a submarine cable to Pier, new 15, North river.

Consumers' Brewing Company, lessee—To build a crib-bulkhead from the northerly line of East Fifty-fourth street to the centre line of the block between Fifty-fourth and Fifty-fifth streets, East river.

Lone Star Boat Club—To remove and replace boat-house at One Hundred and Fifty-third street, Harlem river.

Kipp's Bay Brewing Company—To repair the dock between Thirty-seventh and Thirty-eighth streets, East river.

The following communications were received, read and,

On motion, ordered to be placed on file:

From the Comptroller—Approving sureties on Contract No. 460.

From the Counsel to the Corporation:

1st. Requesting the lease of Pier foot of One Hundred and Thirty-eighth street, North river, to James Rodgers. The Secretary directed to transmit said lease.

2d. Requesting information respecting the claim against the Forty-second Street, Manhattan-ville and St. Nicholas Avenue Railroad. The Secretary directed to furnish the information.

From the Department of Public Works—Inclosing an order for 4,000 paving blocks to be used on the west side of Thirteenth avenue, between Twenty-fourth and Twenty-fifth streets.

New York, Lake Erie and Western Railroad Company—Requesting the driving of three additional rows of piles at Pier, new 19, North river, at their expense. The Engineer-in-Chief directed to do the work and report the cost for collection.

From Dock Master Stack—Reporting that Peter Woolley pays rent to the Department of Public Parks for the occupation of the premises foot of East Eighty-seventh street.

The following applications were denied:

Al Foster Steamboat Company—To occupy a berth on the south side of the Pier foot of West Forty-fourth street during the ensuing winter.

Consumers' Ice Company—To occupy the bulkhead between Piers, new 39 and 40, or between Piers, new 42 and 43, North river.

Emanuel Reutlinger—For a lease of the north side of the Pier foot of West Nineteenth street.

Matthew Stripp—For a lease of the portion of the bulkhead between Dey and Fulton streets, North river.

2d. Reporting the completion of the extensions to Piers, new 36 and 38, North river.
 3d. Reporting the non-removal of the shed on the Pier foot of West Thirteenth street. Notify the Fort Lee Park and Steamboat Company that if said shed is not removed within one week it will be removed by the force of the Department.

4th. Reporting repairs required to the Charity Hospital dock, Blackwell's Island, to the Pier at East One Hundred and Tenth street, to the pavement on the bulkhead between One Hundred and Thirty-second and One Hundred and Thirty-third streets, North river, and in rear of the bulkhead-wall at One Hundred and Twenty-fifth Street Section. No. 13221. Repairs to water-main at Desbrosses Street Ferry.

The Secretary reported the pay-rolls for the General Repairs and Construction Force for the week ending October 6, 1893, amounting to \$13,947.36, had been approved and audited and transmitted to the Finance Department for payment.

On motion, the Engineer-in-Chief was directed to erect a new office on the Pier foot of West Thirty-fourth street, for the use of the Dock Master.

The following resolution was unanimously adopted:

Resolved, That the Engineer-in-Chief be and hereby is directed to pave the newly-made land at or near the foot of Canal street, on the North river, from the southerly line of the pavement already laid by the Department on the new-made land at that place southerly and as far as the new-made land is completed, with granite or Staten Island syenite blocks, and to lay the necessary crosswalks, drains and appurtenances to such pavement; and that all the work hereby ordered be performed otherwise than by contract, as provided by section 714 of the New York City Consolidation Act of 1882, and that it be done by the force of the Department by day's work, except so much of the labor and material as is now or may hereafter be contracted for, and that all the materials, tools and implements necessary therefor and not heretofore contracted for, or which may not hereafter be contracted for, be purchased by the Treasurer otherwise than by contract.

On motion, the Board adjourned.

AQUEDUCT COMMISSION.

Minutes of Stated Meeting of the Aqueduct Commissioners, held at their Office, No. 209 Stewart Building, on Wednesday, October 18, 1893, at 3 o'clock P. M.

Present—Commissioners Duane, Tucker, Scott and Cannon.

The Construction or Executive Committee recommended the adoption of the following preamble and resolution :

Whereas, In the opinion of the Aqueduct Commissioners, the further sum of five hundred thousand dollars will be required to defray the necessary and lawful expenditures of said Commissioners; now, therefore, be it

Resolved, That the Comptroller of the City of New York be and he is hereby requested to raise the sum of five hundred thousand dollars upon bonds of the City of New York, in conformity with the requirements of section 32, chapter 490, Laws of 1883, of the State of New York, for the uses and purposes of the Aqueduct Commissioners as set forth in said chapter and section of said law.

The same was adopted by the following vote :

Affirmative—Commissioners Duane, Tucker, Scott and Cannon—4.

The Committee also presented the following communication, received from the Chief Engineer :

NEW YORK, October 11, 1893.

To the Honorable the Committee on Construction :

GENTLEMEN—As it is now time to provide the gate-machinery for Titicus Dam, I have asked the two firms which have furnished all this class of work for the Aqueduct and dams to send me a bid for the same.

You are aware that that machinery is of a rather special character, and you have already authorized me in similar cases to limit the bids to these two firms, whose previous experience in that line is a guarantee of good execution. You recollect also that their bids have almost invariably been the lowest tendered.

TO OWNERS OF LANDS ORIGINALLY ACQUIRED BY WATER GRANTS.

ATTENTION IS CALLED TO THE RECENT act of the Legislature (chapter 449, Laws of 1889), which provides that whenever any streets or avenues in the city, described in any grant of land under water, from the Mayor, Aldermen and Commonalty containing covenants requiring the grantees and their successors to pave, repave, keep in repair or maintain such streets, shall be in need of repairs, pavement or repavement, the Common Council may, by ordinance, require the same to be paved, repaved or repaired, and the expense thereof to be assessed on the property benefited; and whenever the owner of a lot so assessed shall have paid the assessment levied for such paving, repaving or repairing, such payment shall release and discharge such owner from any and every covenant and obligation as to paving, repaving and repairing, contained in the water grant under which the premises are held, and no other assessment shall be imposed on such lot for paving, repaving or repairing such street or avenue, unless it shall be petitioned for by a majority of the owners of the property (who shall also be the owners of a majority of the property in frontage, on the line of the proposed improvement).

The act further provides that the owner of any such lot may notify the Commissioner of Public Works, in writing, specifying the ward number and street number of the lot that he desires, for himself, his heirs and assigns, to be released from the obligation of such covenants, and elects and agrees that said lot shall be thereafter liable to be assessed as above provided, and thereupon the owner of such lot, his heirs and assigns shall thenceforth be relieved from any obligation to pave, repair, uphold or maintain said street, and the lot in respect of which such notice was given shall be liable to assessment accordingly.

The Commissioner of Public Works desires to give the following explanation of the operation of this act:

When notice, as above described, is given to the Commissioner of Public Works, the owner of the lot or lots therein described, and his heirs and assigns, are forever released from all obligation under the grant in respect to paving, repaving or repairing the street in front of or adjacent to said lot or lots, except one assessment for such paving, repaving or repairs, as the Common Council may, by ordinance, direct to be made thereafter.

No street or avenue within the limits of such grants can be paved, repaved or repaired until said work is authorized by ordinance of the Common Council, and when the owners of such lots desire their streets to be paved, repaved or repaired, they should state their desire and make their application to the Board of Aldermen and not to the Commissioner of Public Works, who has no authority in the matter until directed by ordinance of the Common Council to proceed with the pavement, repavement or repairs.
