East One Hundred and Sixty-first street forms the main connection between the One Hundred and Fifty-fifth street or Control Radice and the upper Metrose District, and is the only cross-town street in that locality with moderately easy grades.

The present width of the readway of East One Hundred and Sixty-first arrest, between Jerome avenue, and Walton avenue, being entirely too marrow, it is necessary to increase the width to So feet, with sidewalks 15 ires wide on either side, leaving a width of 50 feet for the roadway.

To thus widen the street would not affect anything but public property except on the south, between Cromwell's creek and the angle east of Cromwell arenue and south of the block between Gerard and Walton arenues, amounting to a trontage of about 400 feet.
