Bellevue and Allied Hospitals.

A regular meeting of the Board of Trustees of Bellevue and Allied Hospitals was held on Friday, June 16, 1916, at 2 p. m.

Present—Dr. Brannan, the President, in the chair; Messrs. Paulding, O'Keefe, Farley, Stern and Robbins, Trustees. Excused—Mr. Sachs and Mr. Kingsbury, Commissioner of Public Charities.

The minutes of the meeting of June 6 were held as read and approved.

Dr. George O'Hanlon, the General Medical Superintendent, reported as follows:

An order has been issued to the Moran Towing Transportation Company for the transfer of the boat "Westfield" to the dock at Bellevue, and the "Huddleston" to the berth at Corlears Hook. These transfers have to be made at high tide and will be effected within the next two or three days. The cost of transfer is \$40. The Towing Company will not assume any responsibility for possible damage to the "Westfield" in transit.

The estimate for the instruments, etc., for the new Ear, Nose and Throat Service which we expect to open on July 1st will amount to approximately \$2,600. This equipment will have to be paid for from the Medical and Surgical Supplies fund, which is handled this year for us by the Department of Charities. As the amount exceeds \$1,000 it will also be necessary for us to ask the Board of Aldermen for permission to buy without public letting. In order that this may be purchased immediately your authorization is requested.

On separate motion, duly seconded and carried in each instance, action was taken upon the report of the General Medical Superintendent as follows:

The transfer of the boat "Westfield" from Corlears Hook to the dock at Bellevue, pending sale or transfer to the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund, was approved.

It was Resolved to request the Board of Aldermen for permission to buy in the open market, without public letting, the instruments required for the new ear, nose and throat service, to be opened on July 1st at Bellevue Hospital.

COMMITTEE REPORTS.

The President presented a tabulation of bids received at the office of the Central Purchase Committee, on June 8, for canned goods, groceries and flour. On the recommendation of the Central Purchase Committee bids on canned goods and groceries were rejected and awards were made to the low bidder on flour.

The Conference Committee of Gouverneur Hospital recommended that the position of Director of the Medical Service be created and Dr. C. N. B. Camac be appointed to the place. On motion, duly seconded and carried, this report was approved. Mr. Stern, while voting for the creation of the place and this appointment, made the reservation that it should be for a specified time in order to observe the operation of this system.

The Gouverneur Conference Committee also recommended the placing of Dr. Ary Flaks and Dr. Solomon Lubin, of the out-patient department, on the salaried list for the remainder of the year, as well as the following appointments: Mary Halton, Assistant Surgeon to Out-Patients (obstetrics); Harry Press, transferred from the skin to the surgical clinic; Henry Weinberg, Assistant Surgeon to Out-Patients; Henry Scheer, Assistant Surgeon to Out-Patients (rectal clinic); Lewis Siegel, Assistant Surgeon to Out-Patients (gynaecology); H. Eisenstein, Assistant Physician to Out-Patients (children's clinic); Joseph Karger and Harry Klasfeld, Assistant Surgeons to Out-Patients.

On motion, duly seconded and carried, this report was approved and action taken accordingly.

The President referred to the fact that several deaths occurred recently under anaesthesia in the hospitals of the department and called attention to the necessity of adopting a rule requiring a report at once of all deaths under such circumstances. After discussion, it was moved, seconded and carried, to adopt such a rule and request the Medical Boards to report in writing all such cases.

The Building Committee reported that the construction of pavilions F and G will require the removal of certain sewers,

drains, water pipes and pumping stations serving the old buildings, and that it will be necessary to make a survey of the piping system. On motion, duly seconded and carried, it was Resolved to authorize the General Medical Superintendent to have such a survey made.

Reference was made to the necessity of deepening the channel to the north of the pier at 29th st. to permit the coal barges and the boats from the Department of Public Charities to reach their proper places at the side of the pier at low tide. After discussion, it was moved, seconded and carried, to ask the Department of Docks and Ferries to make arrangements to have this channel made deeper.

The Chairman of the Building Committee presented a letter from McKim, Mead & White, dated April 25, 1915, transmitting estimates from James McCullough, Inc., for putting in main lines for a vacuum cleaning system in the new building for the out-patient department of Gouverneur Hospital. On the recommendation of the Building Committee it was moved, seconded and carried, to accept the estimate of \$200 from the above contractor for this work.

Consideration was given to the preparation of the departmental estimate for 1917 and the Budget Committee presented the following estimates for supplies, etc.: Supplies: Food, \$430,000; Forage, \$1,400; Fuel, \$100,000; Office, \$4,000; Laundry and Cleaning, \$12,000; Refrigerating, \$5,000; General Plant, \$17,500; Botanical, \$2,500; Motor Vehicle, \$4,000. Equipment: Office, \$2,500; Household, \$30,000; Motorless Vehicle, \$1,000; Motor Ambulance, \$14,000; Wearing Apparel, \$40,000; General Plant, \$20,000; Educational, \$100; Medical and Surgical, \$101,700. Materials: General Plant, \$25,000. Contract and Open Order Service: General Repairs, \$75,000; Shoeing of Horses, \$400; Carfare, \$2,000; Expressage, \$50; Telephone, \$7,300; Telegraph, \$400; Motor Vehicle Repairs, \$8,000; Contingencies, \$5,500. Total, \$909,350.

The Committee further reported that the estimate for 1917 for salaries and wages would be as follows: General Administration and Bellevue Hospital, \$591,605; Gouverneur Hospital, \$114,266.50; Harlem Hospital, \$94,204.50; Fordham Hospital, \$80,172; Neponsit Beach Hospital for Children, \$29,135.50. Total, \$909,383.50.

The Budget Committee further reported that the total of the departmental estimate for 1917 would be \$1,818,733.50.

The Committee presented a detailed analysis showing the increases in salaries and new and additional positions. After consideration, on motion, duly seconded and carried, it was

Resolved, To approve the report of the Budget Committee and refer the estimate to the President and the Secretary, with power, for such amendment and revision as may be deemed necessary in the development of the detailed budget, and it was further

Resolved, To authorize the President to transmit the estimate, together with a letter explaining in detail the cause of the increase over the appropriations for the current year.

COMMUNICATIONS.

The minutes of the Medical Board of Harlem Hospital for May 31 were presented. On motion, duly seconded and carried, the resolution charging the assistant and adjunct assistant staff with the care of histories was approved. The nominations of Dr. I. O. Palefski and Dr. John J. Levberg to the out-patient department were referred to the Conference Committee. The recommendation that the place of Adjunct Assistant Visiting Obstetrician be created was noted and the attention of the Medical Board of Harlem Hospital called to the fact that the Trustees created such places on July 6, 1915.

The minutes of the Medical Board of Fordham Hospital for June 7 were presented. On motion, duly seconded and carried, the report of the Executive Committee in regard to the corrections in the operation book by Dr. Coerr in the cases of perforated gastric ulcer was approved. The recommendation that at the completion of each operation the anaesthetist must ascertain from the surgeon operating the correct diagnosis and be held responsible for the correct entry on the anaesthetic slip was approved. The nomination

of Dr. W. A. Roberts to a salaried place in the out-patient department was referred to the Conference Committee. The appointment of Dr. Venick to the house staff to date from Jan. 1, 1916, was approved.

A letter, dated June 8, was presented from Dr. Charles H. May, who is to have charge of the eye service on the Fourth Division, presenting a plan of organization to carry on the work. On motion, duly seconded and carried, this communication was referred to the Executive Committee for recommendation.

A copy of a letter, dated June 5, from the Association of Tuberculosis Clinics to the Superintendents of Harlem and Gouverneur Hospitals, recommending that there be set aside separate wards for the care of tuberculous patients, was presented. After consideration, it was moved, seconded and carried, to inform this Association that owing to the difficulty in providing separate rooms in these small hospitals for patients that require segregation the department could not comply with their suggestions.

A communication, dated June 3, was presented from Mrs. John H. Huddleston, in reply to a letter from the Trustees in regard to the new boat to be used as a tuberculosis day camp in the Gouverneur district and offering to present a portrait of Dr. Huddleston. On motion, duly seconded and carried, it was Resolved to name the new boat "John H. Huddleston," in memory of Dr. Huddleston, the founder of this tuberculosis day camp, who worked with such devotion for its benefit, and it was further

Resolved, To accept the kind offer of Mrs. Huddleston.

On motion, duly seconded and carried, the resolution adopted by the Board of Aldermen on May 23, 1916, authorizing the purchase of the "Helen C. Juilliard," without public letting, was ordered placed on file.

A motion to adjourn the meeting was seconded and carried.

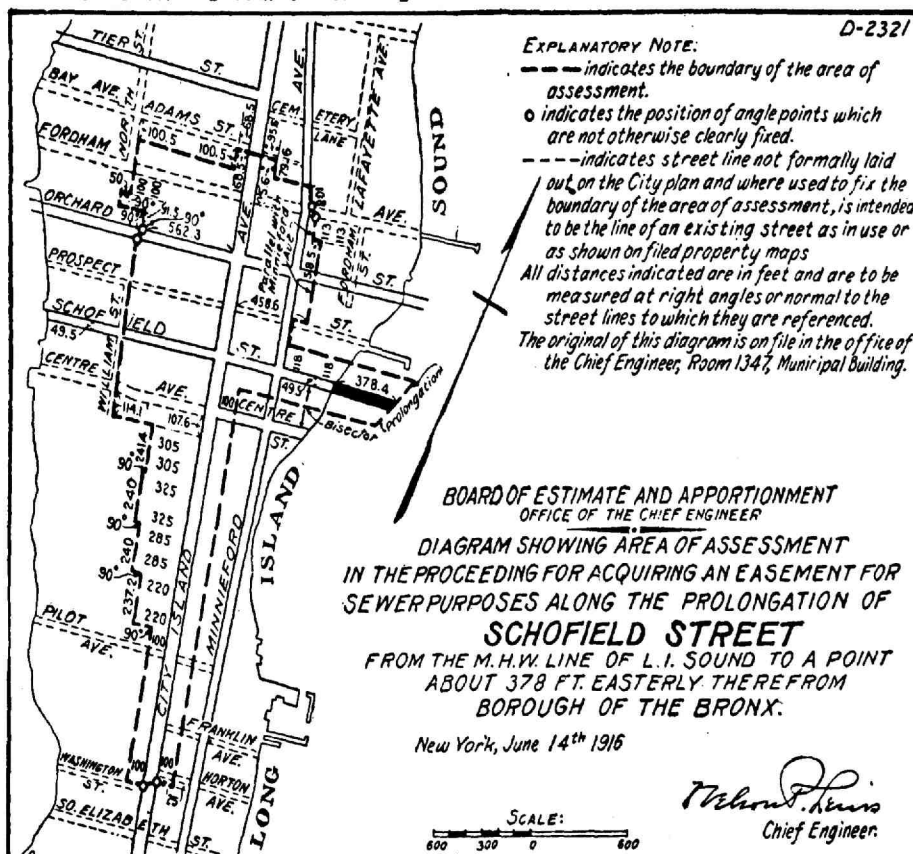

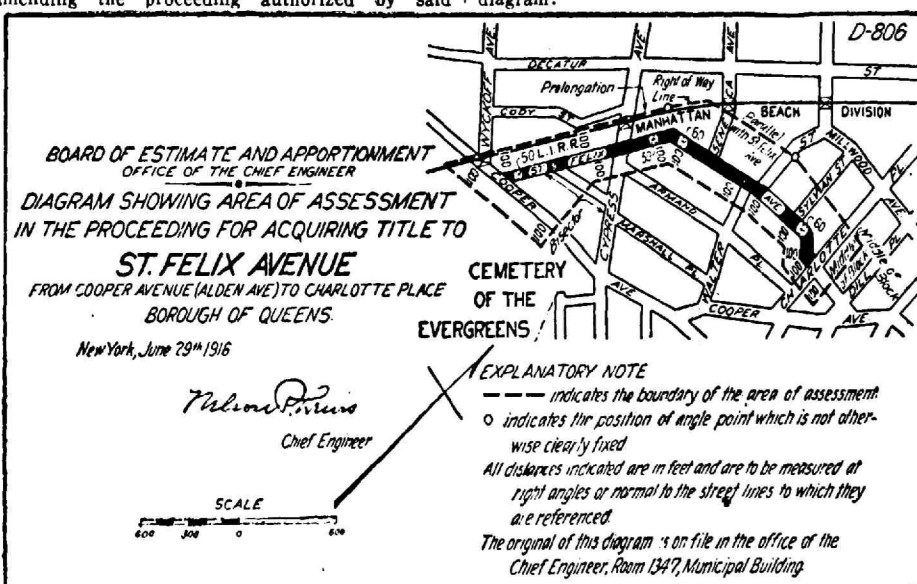

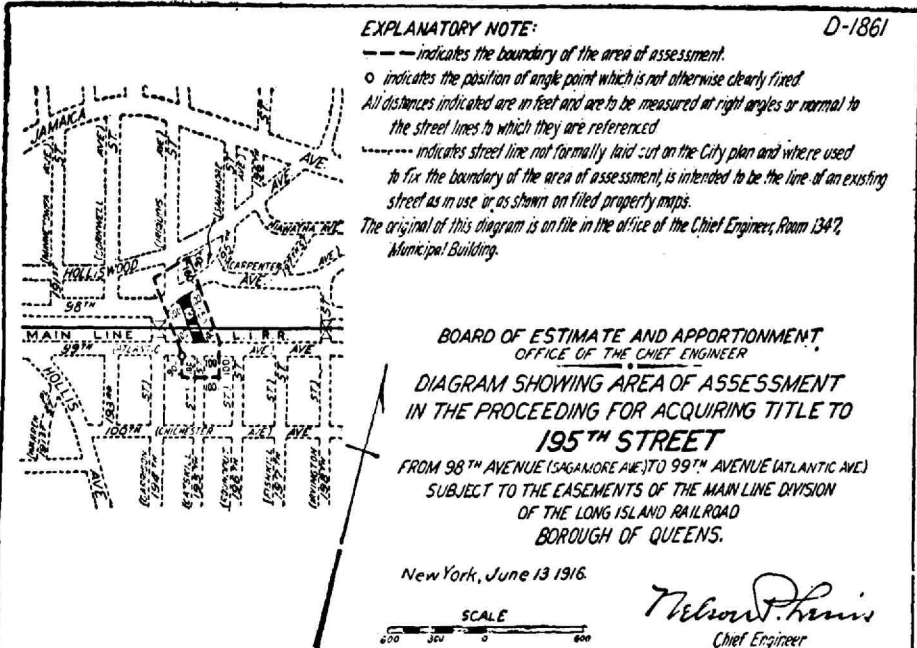

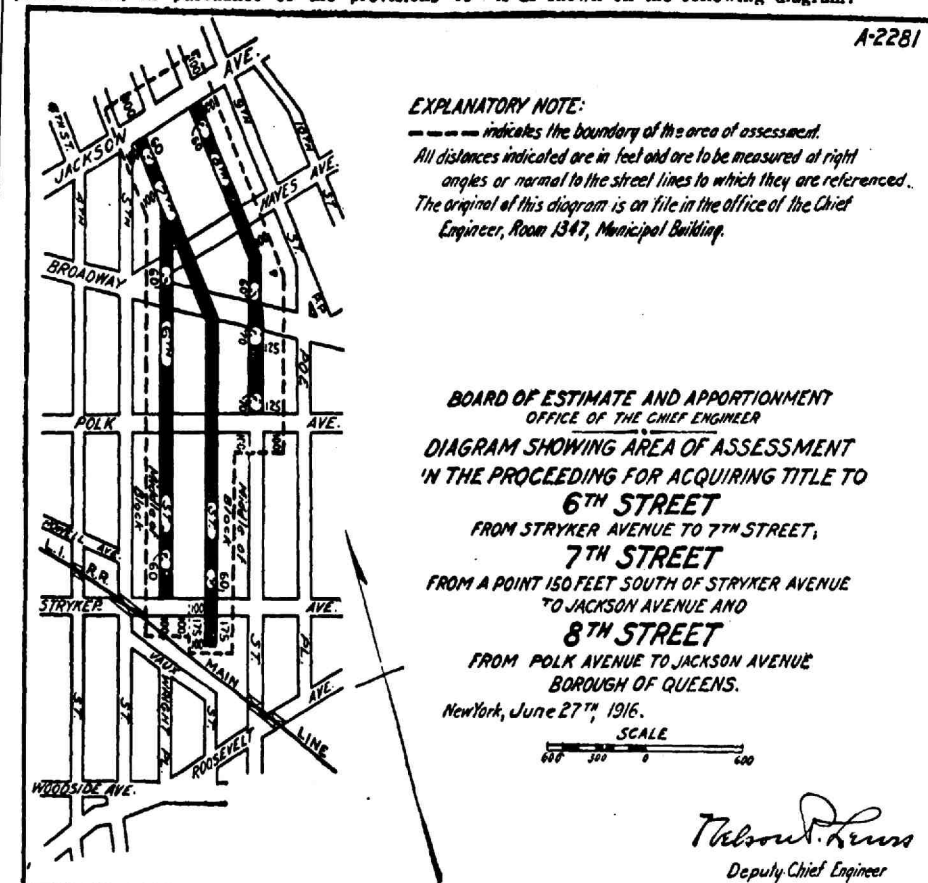
