### DEPARTMENT OF DOCKS.

At a special meeting of the Board of Docks held April 6, 1883. Present—The full Board. The President announced to the Board that the meeting was called for the purpose of taking suitable action in respect to the death of Peter Cooper, which took place on the 4th instant. On motion of Commissioner Voorhis, the following preamble and resolutions were unani-mously adopted:

Whereas, The Board has heard with sincere regret of the decease, on the 4th instant, of Peter Cooper, one of New York's most beloved citizens, whose kindness and patriotism was rarely equaled and never excelled; and

Whereas, This Board desires to place on record its high appreciation of the many praiseworthy and imperishable acts of benevolence and charity so unostentatiously performed by the deceased, as also to unite in the universal expression of sorrow over the loss to all of the benefits derived from the living example of a great philanthropist residing and moving in the midst of an active business

community; therefore be it Resolved, That this Board hereby expresses in an unqualified manner its sincere sorrow at the decease of Peter Cooper, and tenders its heartfelt sympathy to the family and friends of the deceased at their irreparable loss

Resolved, As a mark of respect to the worthy deceased, that the office of this Board be closed during the time appointed and set apart for the obsequies, and the national ensign be displayed at half-staff on the various works and buildings of the Department until after the removal of the remains from the city, and that the members of the Board attend the funeral services at the time and place appointed.

Resolved, That the foregoing preamble and resolutions be entered in full on the minutes of the Board, and a copy thereof properly engrossed and duly signed be transmitted to the family of the deceased.

From Department of Public Charities and Correction—In reference to the dangerous condi-tion of the dock at the Charity Hospital, Blackwell's Island, and requesting that the same be repaired. Engineer-in-Chief to be directed to examine and report thereon.

A communication from John Dorschell, requesting permission to anchor a bath at the foot of west Eighty-first street, North river, was received, read, and, On motion, placed on file, and the following resolution, offered by Commissioner Voorhis,

On motion, placed on hie, and the following resolution, onered by Commissioner Forma, unanimously adopted : Resolved, That permission be and hereby is granted to John Dorschell to locate and maintain, during the months of June, July, August and September, 1883, unless sooner revoked, in the waters of the North river, at about the foot of West Eighty-first street, a floating bath of the dimensions of about twenty-five feet by seventy-five feet, the permission hereby granted being on the express condition that the said bath be located or placed under the supervision and direction of the Engineer-in-Chief, and that the said Dorschell pay \$30 monthly, in advance, during the said period, for the use of the land under water and occupied by him. Commissioner Voorbis reported orally on the applications made by Thomas L. Sturges for

Sturges for permission to build a platform on piles south of One Hundred and Fiftieth street, Harlem river, and for filling in thereat; and also on the report of the Engineer-in-Chief on Secretary's Order No. 2981 in respect thereto, which were referred to the President and Commissioner Voorhis for exam-ination and report, that there was no objection to granting the permission desired. Sturges to erect and con-struct platforms on piles on land under water south of One Hundred and Fiftieth street, on the north side of Harlem river, in accordance with the plan submitted therefor, and which is hereby approved; and also that permission be granted to the said Sturges to fill in, with clean earth filling and stone, the area as shown in the said diagram, and extending about 200 feet westerly from the west side of River avenue and about 206 feet south of the southerly line of One Hundred and Fif-tieth street; all of the said work to be done under the supervision and direction of the Engineer-intieth street; all of the said work to be done under the supervision and direction of the Engineer-in-Chief of this Department, and the said structure to be and remain only during the pleasure of the Board.

The northerly line of said pier to be on a line with the northerly side of West Thirtieth street, and the southerly line of said pier to be on a line with the southerly side of West Thirtieth street, the width of the pier to be 60 feet, and the northerly line of proposed Pier, new 59, North river, to be located 155 feet distant southerly from the northerly line of West Thirtieth street, and the southerly line of said proposed new Pier No. 59, to be located 60 feet south of the northerly line thereof; the northerly line of West Thirtieth street, and the southerly line of proposed Pier, new 59, North river, to be located for southerly side of West Thirtieth street, and the southerly line thereof; the northerly line of proposed Pier, new No. 58, North river, to be located 370 feet distant southerly from the southerly side of West Thirtieth street, and the southerly line of said proposed Pier, new No. 58, to be located 60 feet south of the northerly line thereof, the length of said piers to remain as 58, to be located 60 feet south of the northerly line thereof, the length of said piers to remain as heretofore established.

#### LAW DEPARTMENT.

NEW YORK, April 21, 1883.

At a Conference between the Mayor and the heads of several Departments of the City of New York, this day held at the Mayor's Office, the following gentlemen were present : Franklin Edson, Mayor ; Allan Campbell, Comptroller ; Charles F. Chandler, President of the Health Department ; Stephen B. French, President of the Police Department ; John J. Gorman, President of the Fire Department ; William Laimbeer, President of the Dock Department ; Henry H. Porter, President of the Department ; Edward C. Donnelly, Commissioner of the Department of Taxes and Assessments ; James S. Coleman, Commissioner of the Street Cleaning Department ; George P. Andrews, Counsel to the Corporation. After discussion, the following resolutions were unanimously adopted : Resolved, That the bill recently introduced, entitled "An Act to improve the condition and operations of the Sinking Fund of the City of New York," be referred to the Mayor and Comptrol-ler, to take such action thereon as they may deem proper, and transmit the same to the Legislature on behalf of the Conference.

so as to read as follows: § 251. The justices of the supreme court for the first judicial district, or a majority of them, must appoint, and may at pleasure remove, a stenographer for each term of the circuit court, for the general term of the supreme court, and for each special term of the supreme court which constitutes a separate part. Each stenographer so appointed is entitled to a salary fixed and to be paid as pre-scribed by law; he must attend all the sittings of the part for which he is appointed. If the judge requires a copy of any proceedings written out at length from stenographic notes, he may make an order directing one-half of the stenographer's fees therefor to be paid by each of the parties to the action or special proceeding, at the rate of ten cents per each folio so written out, and may enforce payment thereof. Any such copy shall be accessible to and may be examined by any of the counsel in the cause. If there are two or more parties on the same side, the order may direct either of them in the cause. If there are two or more parties on the same side, the order may direct either of them to pay the sum payable by their side for the stenographer's fees, or it may apportion the payment thereof among them as the judge deems just. Sec. 2. This act shall take effect immediately.


