

NYC's Jail Population: Who's There and Why?

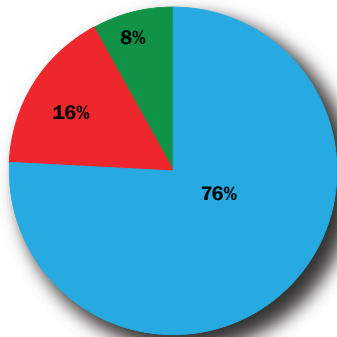
On an average day in fiscal year 2012,

- 12,287 inmates in city jails
- 57 percent are black, 33 percent Hispanic, 7 percent white, 1 percent Asian, and the rest other or unknown
- 93 percent are male

The average annual cost per inmate in 2012 was \$167,731

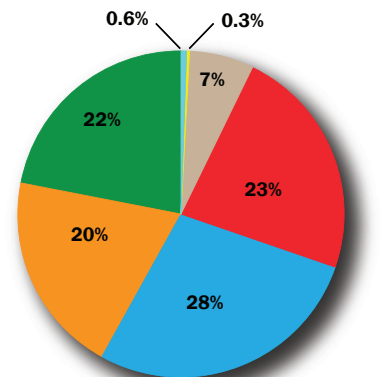
How Many Have Been Convicted And How Many Are Awaiting Trial?

- Sentenced to State Prison, Awaiting Transfer

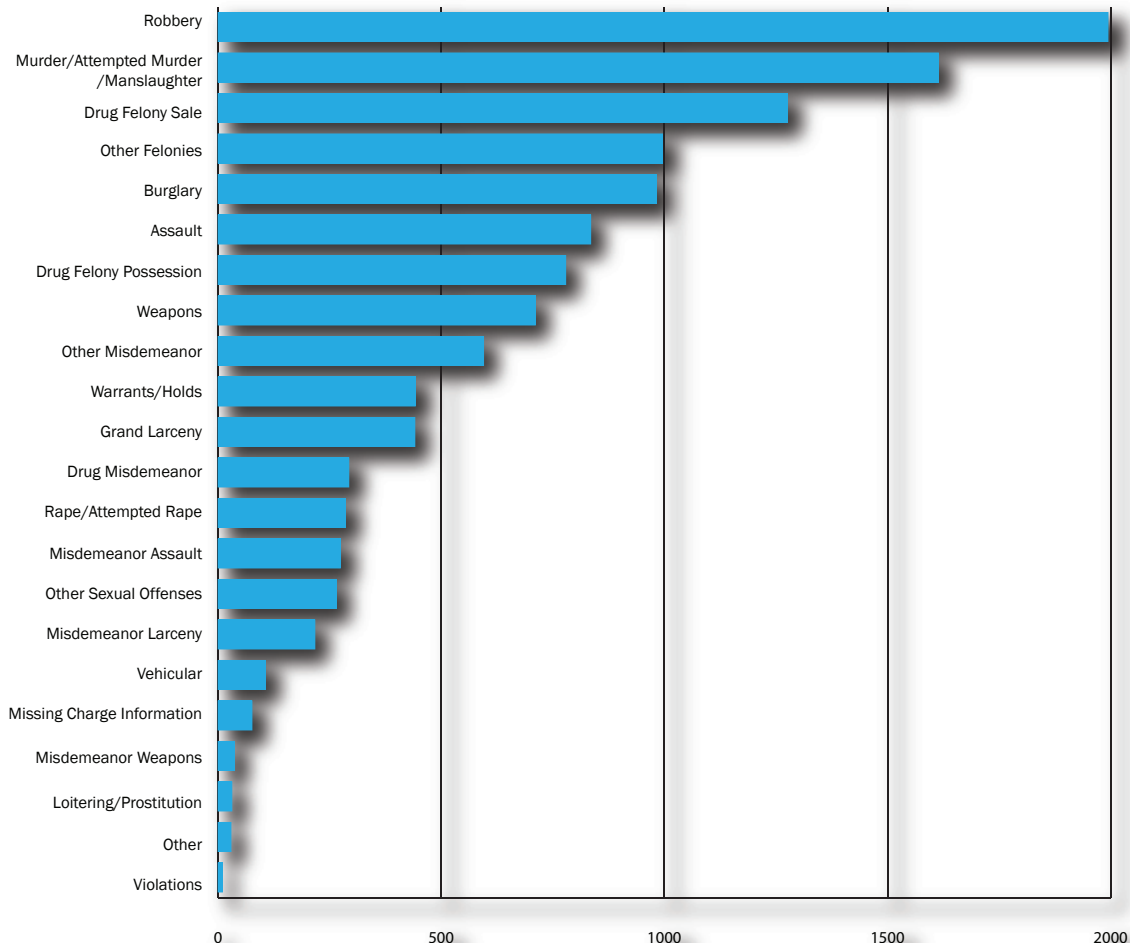


How Old Are They?
