Carpentry.

Town Hall, Flushing—Repairing roof leaders and gutters, overhauling boilers, making and installing galvanized iron pipe connections with boilers, bolting on jackets, etc.

Town Hall, Jamaica—Repairing main and extension roofs, leaders, etc., making strainers and repairing utensils.

County Building, Jamaica—Repairing roofs of extension, relining closet tanks and miscellaneous repairs.

Corporation Yard, Long Island City—Put on new tin roof on closet shed and made minor repairs.

Interior Bath, Long Island City.

All necessary repairs have been made as required and the bath maintained for the convenience of the public for the quarter. The attendance during the quarter was: July, 5,669 males, 2,259 females; August, 7,480 males, 3,923 females; September, 4,215 males, 2,205 females; Totals, 17,364 males; 8,387 females.

The grounds adjoining public buildings have received regular attention, flower beds maintained, the grass cut, etc.

All the necessary cleaning materials have been supplied the Janitors of the various buildings, and the buildings have been kept in a cleanly condition.

Topographical Bureau.

The work of the Bureau falls naturally into two divisions: First, to quote from the Greater New York Charter, "To prepare a map of that part of the territory embraced within the Borough, of which a map or plan has not heretofore been finally established and adopted," and, second, make the surveys and maps required by Commissioners of Estimate and Assessment.

For the better prosecution of this work, the force of this office is similarly divided into two divisions, one division charged with the preparation of the final map of the Borough, the other division charged with all work incidental to street opening proceedings.

The division charged with the preparation of the final map of the Borough is divided into three corps:

1. Monumenting Corps—Charged with all the surveys and field work incidental to the preparation of the final map and the monumenting of the Borough.

2. Computing Corps—Charged with all the computations incidental to the preparation of the final map of the Borough.

3. Draughting Corps—Charged with all draughting work required to prepare the final maps.

The division charged with the preparation of the maps required by the Commissioners of Estimate and Assessment is subdivided into two corps:

1. Surveying Corps—Charged with all the field work necessary to the preparation of the maps required by the Commissioners.

2. Office Corps—Charged with all the computations and draughting necessary for the preparation of the maps required by the Commissioners.

In addition to the several corps mentioned above, we have a small corps engaged in gathering data and making reports concerning the legal status of the various streets in the Borough.

The following detailed description of the work done by this Bureau is arranged according to the work performed by these several corps, and in the order in which they are mentioned above.

Legal opening reports, 15; legal status reports, 158; legal status reports for the Corporation Counsel, 39; miscellaneous reports, 70; physical street inspections, 115.

The copying and indexing of the old records of Long Island City and College Point has been continued at spare moments during the quarter. No decided progress has, however, been made, due to lack of funds to prosecute the work along systematic lines.

While our requests to the Board of Estimate and Apportionment for an issue of Special Revenue Bonds, wherewith to copy the old records of the several civic subdivisions of Queens, which antedates consolidation, were denied, they were not in

vain. I understand that the representations that we made to the Comptroller's office of the importance of these old records so impressed them that they contemplate doing the work at the expense of their office, beginning the first of the year.

Bureau of Substructures and Franchises.

The purpose of this Bureau is to accurately locate and map all substructures in the streets and public places of the Borough and to keep on file a complete record of all franchise data and essential matters relating to the various corporations which have heretofore been granted, or to which may hereafter be granted, franchises to operate within the Borough of Queens.

When the Division of Substructures became a bureau under the title of "Bureau of Substructures and Franchises," the work of obtaining all franchise data relative to the Borough of Queens was begun, and all available franchise data is being obtained.

The work is divided into two sections—Office and Field.

OFFICE WORK.

Consists of accurate mapping on durable record maps all notes of the field force, together with plans and data submitted to this office by other City Departments and Public Service Corporations.

These maps are to a scale of 20 feet=1 inch and are kept constantly up to date as to changes and additional subsurface construction. The various pipes and duct lines are shown in colors which greatly facilitate tracing out the location of any structure in a congested district.

All notes are indexed and filed in loose-leaf form in such a manner that data turned in for any section of the Borough is constantly ready for use.

All applications for permits relative to subsurface installations are sent to this Bureau, together with two prints of proposed work, for approval as to the proper position in the street for installation. When approved, a print is retained and application is presented to Bureau of Permits. In this way the proposed work is installed in a definite and somewhat permanent position within the streets, thereby preventing wasteful utilization of valuable subsurface space.

In several instances in Long Island City the Water Department and the Gas Company have materially benefited by data from this Bureau in selecting routes for new work at a minimum cost of construction.

A color index map is kept up to date showing just what streets in Long Island City have substructures that have been located in the field.

As the record maps are never really completed, they are revised continually. Changes at the Queensborough Bridge Plaza and the Belmont Tunnel are good examples of the changes and additions affecting the record maps.

Work Done in Section 1 of Long Island City.

The following Record Maps have been completed as to plotting of topography: 44, 45, 46, 47, 73, 74, 83. Plotting completed on detail box measurements on Record Maps Nos. 47, 72, 73, 74, 75, 83. Topography has been checked on the following Record Maps: 44, 47, 73, 74, 75, 83, 84. Detail box measurements have been checked on the following Record Maps: 75, 83, 84. All available company data and City Department information has been investigated, plotted and compared on the following Record Maps: 47, 75, 83, 84.

Copies of field notes of the Water Department and the Gas Company have been made and are of great value in locating old mains.

Franchise data has been kept up to date and each franchise has been indexed graphically in colors on a large wall map showing limits and nature of grant.

The work of compiling boring data throughout the Borough is now under way and through the co-operation of the Building Department it will be possible to obtain boring data taken in the construction of new buildings throughout the Borough. A complete system of indexing and filing of this data has been established, and much valuable data is now contained in our records. With a systematic method of obtaining and filing boring information throughout the Borough, it will not be long before this information will save thousands of dollars in borings which otherwise would be necessary without this data at hand.

FIELD WORK.

Consists of the location of all substructures exposed in street openings, surveys and detail measurements of all sewer manholes, water gates, conduit boxes, poles, hydrants, vaults; in fact all surface indications of existing substructures.

Summary of Work Done by the Field Force.

Angles turned, 6; features located, 53; feet of traverse, 15,100; feet of curbs, 1,440; feet of tapping, 13,490; feet of building line, 3,290; sewer manholes located, 2; Telephone Co. boxes, 1; gas boxes, 3; water boxes, 8; Power Co. boxes, 6; street railway boxes, 2; poles, etc., on sidewalks, 31; street openings, 376; feet of subsurface work located, 41,275; feet of gas mains, 18,430; feet of water mains, 14,250; feet of sewer pipe, 195; feet of phone ducts, 2,400; boxes C. B., etc., measured in detail, 289.

The work done in Section 1 of Long Island City is as follows:

Survey lines were established for the following Record Maps: 33, 34, 35, 36, 37, 38, 43, 48.

Complete surface location or topography was taken on Record Map No. 75.

Complete detail box measurements were taken on the following Record Maps: 44, 45, 46, 47, 73, 74, 75.

Amendments to Sanitary Code.

AT A MEETING OF THE BOARD OF Health of the Department of Health, held November 24, 1914, the following resolution was adopted:

Resolved, That Section 182 of the Sanitary Code be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Section 182. No opium, morphine, chloral, or cannabis indica, or any other substance giving a physiological reaction similar to that of opium; or any salts, alkaloids, or derivatives, of any of the said drugs or substances; or any preparation, compound, or mixture, containing any of the said drugs or substances or their salts, alkaloids, or derivatives; shall be sold at retail or given away in the City of New York except upon the written prescription of a duly licensed physician, veterinarian, or dentist.

The foregoing provisions shall not, however, apply to preparations, compounds, or mixtures, containing any of the aforesaid drugs or substances or their salts, alkaloids, or derivatives, prepared for external use only, in the form of liniments, ointments, oleates, or plasters.

Proposals.

INVITATION TO CONTRACTORS.

Part of the Broadway-Fourth Avenue Rapid Transit Railroad.

The Public Service Commission for the First District (hereinafter called the "Commission"), acting for and on behalf of The City of New York (hereinafter called the "City"), invites proposals to construct Section No. 4 of Routes Nos. 4 & 36, a part of the Broadway-Fourth Avenue Rapid Transit Railroad.

The points within the City between which the said part is to run and the route or routes to be followed are briefly as follows:

SECTION No. 4. Beginning at a point under Seventh Avenue near the southerly building line of West 51st Street, thence extending northerly under Seventh Avenue to a point about eighty-five (85) feet south of the southerly building line of West 59th Street; thence curving northeasterly under Seventh Avenue, West 59th Street and Central Park to a point about seventy-nine (79) feet east of the easterly building line of Seventh Avenue extended and about one hundred and thirty-seven (137) feet north of the south building line of West 59th Street, and including a spur curving northwesterly under Seventh Avenue, West 59th Street and Central Park to a point about twenty-two (22) feet west of the westerly building line of Seventh Avenue extended and one hundred and eighty-seven (187) feet north of the south building line of West 59th Street.

The general plan of construction calls for a substructure railroad having two, four and six tracks.

Fifth.—In case, however, objections are filed to either of said supplemental and amended abstracts of estimate and assessment, the notice of motion to confirm our final report herein will stand adjourned to the date to be hereafter specified, and of which notice will be given to all those who have theretofore appeared in this proceeding, as well as by publication in the CITY RECORD, pursuant to Sections 981 and 984 of the Greater New York Charter, as amended by Chapter 658 of the Laws of 1906.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS UNDER WHICH BUILDINGS, ETC., WILL BE SOLD FOR REMOVAL FROM CITY PROPERTY.

THE BUILDINGS AND APPURTENANCES thereto will be sold to the highest bidder, who must pay cash or certified check, drawn to the order of the Comptroller of The City of New York, and must also give a certified check or cash in half the amount of the purchase price as security for the faithful performance of the terms and conditions of the sale. Where the amount of the purchase price does not equal or exceed the sum of \$50, the sum of \$50 shall be the amount of the security to be deposited. This security may at any time after the expiration of the contract period be applied by the City to the cost of completing any of the work required under the contract, but unfinished at the expiration of the contract period.

The purchaser shall not lease, occupy, cause or permit the building or buildings, etc., purchased by him to be used or occupied for any purpose other than that of their speedy removal, nor shall he collect any rental or other revenue for the use of either the land or the buildings, etc., situated thereon. The breach of either or any of these conditions shall forthwith void the sale and cause immediate forfeiture of the purchase money and the security deposited for the faithful performance of the conditions of the sale. The person or persons making a bid or estimate for any services, work, materials or supplies for The City of New York, or for any of its departments, bureaus or offices, shall furnish the same in a sealed envelope, indorsed with the title of the supplies, materials, work or services for which the bid or estimate is made, with his or their name or names and the date of presentation to the President or Board or to the head of the Department at his or its office, on or before the date and hour named in the advertisement for the same, at which time and place the estimates received will be publicly opened by the President or Board or head of said Department and read, and the award of the contract made according to law as soon thereafter as practicable.

Each bid or estimate shall contain the name and place of residence of the person making the same, and names of all persons interested with him therein, and, if no other person be so interested, it shall distinctly state that fact; also, that it is made without any connection with any other person making an estimate for the same purpose, and is in all respects fair and without collusion or fraud, and that no member of the Board of Aldermen, head of a department, chief of a bureau, deputy thereof, or clerk therein, or other officer of The City of New York is, shall be or become interested, directly or indirectly, as contracting party, partner, stockholder, surety or otherwise in or in the performance of the contract, or in the supplies, work or business to which it relates, or in any portion of the profits thereof. The bid or estimate must be verified by the oath, in writing, of the party or parties making the estimate that the several matters stated herein are in all respects true.

No bid or estimate will be considered unless, as a condition precedent to the reception or consideration of any proposal, it be accompanied by a certified check upon one of the State or National banks of The City of New York, drawn to the order of the Comptroller, or money or corporate stock or certificates of indebtedness of any nature issued by The City of New York, which the Comptroller shall approve as of equal value with the security required in the advertisement to the amount of not less than three nor more than five per centum of the amount of the bond required, as provided in section 420 of the Greater New York Charter.

The amount shall be as specified in the proposals or instructions to bidders and shall not be in excess of 5 per cent.

The certified check or money should not be inclosed in the envelope containing the bid or estimate, but should be either inclosed in a separate envelope addressed to the head of the Department, President or Board, or submitted personally upon the presentation of the bid or estimate.
