

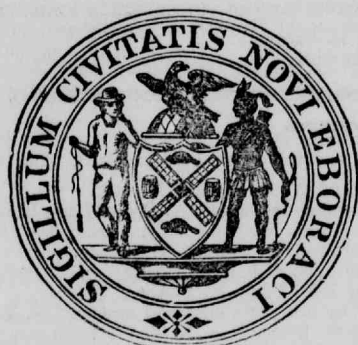

Report for the Quarter ending September 30, 1878.

REPORT.

ORGANIZATION.

Sections 2 and 5, of Article II, of the By-Laws of the Department were repealed, and the following was adopted in the place of said section 2, article II, namely,
Section 2. There shall be a Superintending Architect, who shall have general supervision, control, and direction of the plans and works of construction and maintenance.

There shall be an Engineer of Construction and a Topographical Engineer, under the Superintending Architect, who shall be designated by those titles.

The Engineer of Construction shall have charge of the construction works in the Twenty-third and Twenty-fourth Wards, and also of the construction and repair of all works connected with the improvement of the navigation of Harlem River and Spuyten Duyvil Creek, and the tunnels and bridges connected with the same.

The Topographical Engineer shall have charge of the works relating to the laying out of the streets and avenues and monumenting the same.

There shall be a Superintendent of Parks, who shall supervise all the foremen, mechanics, and laborers employed in the parks.

CENTRAL PARK.

The supply of water to the lakes and ponds in Central Park not being sufficient to prevent them from stagnating in the summer time, it was deemed necessary to take measures to remedy this fault in the pond most defective, which was the one at the southeast portion of the park, near Fifty-ninth street and Fifth avenue.

Some changes in the outlet from this pond have been made, which have already been of great advantage, and a more thorough and permanent plan, which contemplates the introduction of a cascade and a large spray fountain in the pond has been prepared and adopted, which, when carried out will, it is confidently expected, keep the whole body of water constantly in motion and create a strong current, thereby making it perfectly healthy.

All the urinals in the parks were directed to be kept open in future until 10 o'clock P. M.

The Health Department has thought it expedient to call the attention of this Department to the necessity of further and better drainage in that portion of the Central Park formerly known as Manhattan square, but the want of sufficient funds for the purpose has prevented the Department from taking any steps in the matter.

The experiment of giving evening concerts on the Mall in Central Park was tried on the 27th of September, when "Crook's Amateur Cornet Band" kindly gave their valuable services without compensation. The Mall was lighted most successfully by one electric light and several calcium lights. The concert was attended by a very large and orderly gathering, and was evidently so much appreciated that it is intended to give a number of evening concerts during next summer.

SMALLER PARKS.

On the 3d of July, 1878, the Department granted permission to the New York Elevated Railroad Company to further extend its road upon the Battery Park.

Annexed hereto is a copy of the agreement entered into with said company for that purpose.

By permission of the Department "Crook's Amateur Cornet Band" gave, free of expense to the city, evening concerts on the Battery Park, once a week, from the 26th of July until the 16th of September. The concerts were attended by immense numbers of the residents in the lower part of the city, and were highly appreciated. The gentlemen composing the band are entitled to the thanks of the community.

The permission previously given to Mr. D. Rosenberg to place six of Cottman's patent tree-guards around the trees on Madison Square, and the Plaza at Fifth avenue and Fifty-ninth street, was rescinded.

On the 24th of July, 1878, the Department received the following preamble and resolution of the Common Council, namely:

"Whereas, By chapter 411 of the Laws of 1878, power is conferred upon the Common Council of the City of New York to restore Tompkins Square as a public park;

"Resolved, That the Department of Public Parks be and the same hereby is directed to immediately take and adopt all necessary measures to restore said square as a public park, always provided that said work of restoration be done only by day's work, and not by contract."

On the same day the Department directed the plans for the reconstruction of Tompkins Square to be prepared, and also made requisition upon the Comptroller of the city to issue stock, as provided for by the 2d section of chapter 411 of the Laws of 1878, to the amount of \$50,000.

The sidewalks of the park at the junction of Christopher and West Fourth streets have been repaired and put in good order, as requested by a resolution of the Board of Aldermen, approved by your Honor on the 18th July, 1878.

The duty of seeing that the New York Elevated Railroad Company complied with the terms of the two agreements, granting it permission to erect its road across the Battery Park, was referred to Commissioner Lane.

On the 21st of August, 1878, the plans for the reconstruction of Tompkins square were considered by the Department, but before finally adopting them your Honor and the Members of the Common Council were invited to inspect them; and they were also publicly exhibited in the neighborhood of the square.

The plans having met with the approval of all parties interested, they were adopted on the 28th of August, 1878, and the work of reconstruction was directed to be proceeded with as soon as possible. The working drawings were then prepared as rapidly as practicable, the force of mechanics and laborers necessary employed, and the work commenced on the 16th of September, 1878, since which date it has progressed rapidly.

The force engaged on this work has been—

- 2 General foremen.
- 11 Foremen.
- 12 Masons.
- 37 Horses and carts.
- 224 Laborers.

Plans for the construction of the 29 parks on Fourth avenue, between Sixty-seventh and Ninety-sixth streets, were prepared and adopted, and the greater portion of the work of constructing 8 of them between Sixty-seventh street and Seventy-first street, and between Ninetieth street and Ninety-fourth street—namely, the mason, granite, and iron work—was directed to be let on contract at public letting.

TWENTY-THIRD AND TWENTY-FOURTH WARDS.

In order to prevent the nuisance continuing which the exposure of Mill Brook Sewer in the summer time occasions, the engineer in charge of Brook avenue Sewer was instructed to inspect each section of the sewer as completed, and when accepted by him, to allow the contractors to turn the water of Mill Brook into the sewer, provided that the sewer between such section and the outlet had also been completed and accepted.

Mr. Michael Noonan, the contractor for the construction of drains near Fordham, in the Twenty-fourth Ward, having made a claim to be allowed the sum of \$2,122.55 more than the final estimate of the work, as prepared by the Engineer in charge of the work showed him to be entitled to, his claim was examined, and after careful consideration, was rejected.

Permission was granted to Mr. Wm. O. Gorman to construct a sewer at his own expense in One Hundred and Thirty-ninth street, from Willis avenue to Brook avenue, on condition that the work was executed in accordance with the plans and specifications of the Department, and that he deposit the sum of \$680 to pay the expenses of the engineers and inspectors on the work.

On the 21st August, 1878, proposals were received and publicly opened for the construction of sewers in Third avenue, from the Southern Boulevard to One Hundred and Thirty-fifth street, and in One Hundred and Thirty-fourth and One Hundred and Thirty-fifth streets, from Third avenue to the summits east of Willis avenue, with branches in Lincoln, Alexander, and Willis avenues. There were eleven proposals for the work, the lowest of which was that of Mr. John B. Devlin, at \$11,495.85. The contract was accordingly awarded to Mr. Devlin.

Plans and specifications for grading Third avenue, from One Hundred and Forty-seventh street to Harlem river, as directed by ordinance of the Common Council, were prepared and approved, and the work directed to be let by contract at public letting.

Plans and specifications for a sewer in One Hundred and Fortieth street, from Alexander avenue to Brook avenue, with branches in Alexander and Willis avenues, were also prepared and approved, and the work directed to be let by contract at public letting.

A crosswalk was laid on Fordham avenue near Eleventh street, in Central Morrisania, Twenty-third Ward, as directed by ordinance of the Common Council.

The instructions given to the Counsel to the Corporation to take proceedings to acquire title to Concord avenue, from Boston road to the south side of Denman place, were modified, so that the portion of Concord avenue to which the title is to be acquired is only from the south side of One Hundred and Sixty-seventh street to the south side of Denman place.

The appropriation for surveying and laying out the Twenty-third and Twenty-fourth Wards not being sufficient to enable the monumenting of the streets to be executed to any extent, and the owners of the "Fox Estate," situate in the Hunt's Point District of the Twenty-third Ward, being desirous that the streets should be monumented on their property to enable a partition of the same to be made, Mrs. Mary L. Tiffany, one of the owners, deposited with the Department the sum of \$2,250, to be expended in monumenting said estate. The work on that estate has therefore been proceeded with.

SURVEYING AND LAYING OUT THE NORTH END OF THE ISLAND, AND THE TWENTY-THIRD AND TWENTY-FOURTH WARDS.

The following Maps were filed in pursuance of chapter 604, Laws of 1874, and chapter 436, Laws of 1876:

July 31.—Hunt's Point District, including portions of the Twenty-third and Twenty-fourth Wards, bounded on the west by the westerly line of St. Ann's, Third, and Fordham avenues, on the north by proposed streets, roads, and avenues defining a line distant about 400 to 1,300 feet north of the line of the Twenty-third Ward, on the east by the boundary line of New York City, and on the south by Long Island Sound and One Hundred and Forty-first street, containing about 2,100 acres and including about 79 miles of streets.

September 11.—Grade Map of the streets and avenues connecting Spuyten Duyvil Parkway with Broadway, from a point on said Parkway 23,600 feet, and a point on Broadway 24,450 feet, north of One Hundred and Fifty-fifth street, in the Twenty-fourth Ward, about 3,200 lineal feet.

MONUMENTS SET.

81 in the Spuyten Duyvil District.
16 in the Fordham Heights District.
17 in the Hunt's Point District.
6 in the West Farms District.
120 monuments in all, defining on the ground some 23,450 lineal feet (about 4½ miles) of streets, and some 1,500 lineal feet of park boundary, enclosing about two acres of area.

SURVEYS, CALCULATIONS, ETC.

66,033 lineal feet of traverse line have been measured, 77 monument points set on the ground, and calculations determining the ordinates of 55 monuments have been made.

RULE MAPS.

Spuyten Duyvil Parkway, from the Spuyten Duyvil & Port Morris Railroad to Broadway, some 12,200 lineal feet. Map and description forwarded 10th September.

MONUMENTS RESET.

The quality of the material used, and the character of the work on this important sewer, have been all that could be desired.

865 lineal feet of 15 in. sewer pipe laid.

This work has advanced very slowly, but the materials and workmanship have been good.

MISCELLANEOUS.

The Board of Aldermen were requested to direct that Eighty-first street, from Eighth to Ninth avenues, which is the northern boundary of Manhattan Square, be graded, curbed and paved, and the sidewalks on the north side of the street be flagged.

The works necessary for fitting up the basement under the main Hall in the Museum of Art building were ordered and proceeded with.

The pay of Mr. Emil Bleyer, chainman, employed on the work of constructing Riverside avenue, was increased from \$65 to \$78 per month on the 24th July, 1878.

Three old horses which had become unfit for work were sold at public auction, and six other horses were purchased for the use of the Department.

The following rules for the opening and closing the draw at Third avenue bridge over Harlem river were proscribed.

REGULATIONS FOR OPENING AND CLOSING THE DRAW OF THE THIRD AVENUE BRIDGE OVER HARLEM RIVER.

"On the approach of any steamer, ship, yacht or other vessel which can not pass under the draw, the gates at either end of the draw shall be closed, the bell rung to notify passengers, and the draw shall be opened without delay, so as to allow the vessel to pass through without detention.

"Immediately after the vessel has passed through, the draw shall be closed, and when it is closed, but not before, the gates shall be opened.

"The draw shall be opened whenever required, between the hours of 6 o'clock A. M. and 9 o'clock P. M.

"If it shall be necessary for any vessel to pass through the draw after the hour of 9 o'clock P. M. and before 6 o'clock A. M., the bridge-tender shall attend and open the draw at the hour required, provided he shall have been notified prior to the hour of 9 o'clock P. M."

On the 24th of August application was made to the Board of Estimate and Apportionment to transfer the sum of \$30,000 to the appropriation for the maintenance of the several parks and places of the city, and also the sum of \$3,000 to the appropriation for the repair, improvement, and maintenance of the bridges over Harlem river, the appropriations for both of these purposes for 1878 having been much below the amount necessary.

The Central bridge over Harlem river was repaired and a new flooring laid upon the roadway of the fixed spans.

BOARD OF DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC PARKS.

JULY 3, 1878.—Agreement, granting the New York Elevated Railroad Company an extension of the revocable right of way across the Battery Park. Ordered printed as a document of the Board.

THIS MEMORANDUM OF AN AGREEMENT by and between the Mayor, Aldermen, and Commonalty of the City of New York, party of the first part, herein represented and acting by the Department of Public Parks (which is hereinafter designated as the Department), and the New York Elevated Railroad Company (hereinafter designated as the Company), party of the second part.

Witnesseth, Whereas, by an agreement made on the 10th day of February, 1876, by and between the parties hereto, a revocable right of way and license was granted to the said Company by the said Department over the Battery, in the City of New York.

Therefore, in consideration of the premises, it is hereby further covenanted, stipulated and agreed, as follows:

1. That the right of way and license aforesaid is hereby extended over, through, and across the Battery and Whitehall street, along and upon a route indicated by the part colored red upon a map authenticated by the signature of the President of the said Department and the signature of the said Company, and this day filed in the office of said Department, a copy of which is hereto annexed; and such right of way and license is hereby granted by the said Department to the said Company, its successors and assigns, with all the rights, privileges and powers contained in the agreement aforesaid in respect to the grant therein made, and subject also to all the terms, provisions, and agreements therein contained, with the same effect as if this extension had been contained and granted in said agreement.

2. The said Company may, along the lines of the main route, between the points of intersection with the extended route hereby granted, construct and support on the level of the upper portion of its superstructure, and at least ten feet above the surface of the ground, platforms and shelters for the accommodation of passengers, and may alter and use the existing stairway for approach thereto, to be made in all respects to the satisfaction of the Department, as is provided in respect to the other constructions of the said railroad contained in the aforesaid agreement.

3. And it is further covenanted, stipulated, and agreed by the said Company, that they will not take down or cut any tree without the express permission of the Department, and that they will forthwith cause all their iron and woodwork and structures upon the Battery to be painted, the sidewalks disturbed by them to be relaid, the grounds disturbed by them to be graded and planted, and vines to be planted and trained around the piers and arches in such color, style, manner, and materials as the Department shall direct, under its superintendence and to its satisfaction.

And also, that the said Company, as soon as the platform is erected and stairway altered, as hereby authorized, and open to the public use, will, within thirty days thereafter, wholly remove the present platform and station now over the Battery sidewalk and Whitehall street.

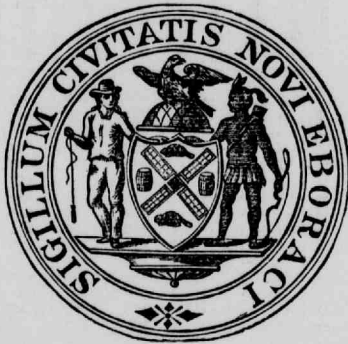
