

Changes to tax credits mean more money for you when you file.

We'll help you get your money.

Claiming even one of these tax credits could return thousands of dollars to you in 2022.

- Child Tax Credit. Parents can get up to \$ \$3,000 or \$3,600 per child depending on the child's age. You do not need earned income to claim the credit and get payments. If you got advance payments in 2021, you must file in 2022 to get the rest of your money.
 - Earned Income Tax Credit. Now available to filers as young as 19 to 65+ without children, as well as families.
- Child and Dependent Care Credit. Get back Ś up to \$4,000 in child care expenses.

Use NYC FREE Tax Prep to file for free and keep your whole refund.



For families Income of \$72,000 or less in 2021.



For single filers Income of \$50,000 or less in 2021.
